Subject: **Monthly Report to Commission – January 2012**

PERSONNEL CHANGES:

On January 9, 2012, Deputy Christina Lacertosa was transferred from the Lauderdale-by-the-Sea District to BSO's Reserve Division.

On January 24, 2012, Deputy Jason Friedrich was transferred from a Motor Deputy assignment to a Patrol Deputy assignment within the Lauderdale-by-the-Sea district. We are currently evaluating several candidates to fill the vacant Motor Deputy position.

EMPLOYEE OF THE MONTH: Deputy Michael Hencken

Deputy Hencken recently received a report of a suspicious person had been seen looking into several residential windows. Information was also received that the subject may be driving a white pickup truck. Knowing that several attempted break-ins had recently occurred, Deputy Hencken began to canvas the suspect's likely escape routes for the suspect vehicle.

His efforts were rewarded when he observed a white pickup truck driving by. The person driving the vehicle matched the description of the suspect. Investigation revealed that the suspect had attempted to pry open several jalousie windows to gain entry into the residence, while the female homeowner slept inside. The suspect was subsequently positively identified as the perpetrator of the crime. It was later learned that the suspect has an extensive arrest record for multiple violent offenses, including prior residential burglaries.

Due to Deputy Hencken's quick thinking and intuition in determining the suspect's likely escape route, he was able to successfully apprehend this habitual offender. Deputy Hencken's continued exceptional performance highlights his dedication to the safety of the residents of Lauderdale-by-the-Sea.

COMMUNITY PROGRAMS AND SERVICES: These ancillary programs and services are available to residents on an ongoing basis.

- **Elder Links:** This program offers referral services to elderly residents and other senior citizens in need of medical and mental health care, meal delivery or other social services. Sergeant Peter LaGana oversees this program.
- **Business and Residential Security Surveys:** The Business and Residential Security Survey Program teaches participants to secure their business, home or condominium to reduce the likelihood of burglary and theft. Sergeant Peter LaGana handles all business and residential security surveys.
- **Vacation House Watch Program:** Residents who are traveling out-of-town may register for this program. Deputies will conduct periodic checks of their residence until their return. Sergeant Peter LaGana oversees the Vacation House Watch Program.
- **Neighborhood Crime Prevention Program:** The LBTS district Neighborhood Crime Prevention Program liaison organizes and conducts crime prevention and security seminars at the request of neighborhood civic and condominium associations. Sergeant Peter LaGana oversees this program.
- **Identity Theft and Scam Prevention Program:** The Identity Theft and Scam Prevention Program is designed to inform residents about identity theft and how to lessen their chances of becoming a victim of a scam. Residents are informed on the importance of shredding documents, awareness of suspicious individuals, protection of passwords and use of caution in revealing information. Our annual Shred-A-Thon to reduce identity theft event is incorporated into this program. Sergeant Peter LaGana oversees this program.
- **Child Car Seat Installations / Inspections:** The Child Car Seat Installation program provides for education in the proper utilization of child safety seats. Deputy Jason Friedrich will install or inspect a child safety seat at the public's request.
- **Citizen Observer Patrol (COP) Program:** COP volunteers are local residents who receive public safety training. They are a tremendous asset to the Town of Lauderdale-by-the-Sea. COP members alternate assisting in administrative duties or patrolling local neighborhoods as an extra pair of eyes and ears to supplement deputy sheriff patrols. COP members also attend monthly patrol information and criminal intelligence briefings. Sergeant Peter LaGana manages this program. A summary of COP statistical activity is found at the end of this report.
- **Sheriff's Explorer Program:** The Sheriff's Explorer Program allows juveniles who are interested in pursuing careers in criminal justice a chance to enhance their knowledge and skill of law enforcement related topics through weekly training workshops. Sergeant Edward Rafailovitch is the Lauderdale-by-the-Sea district liaison for this program.
- **Fugitive Apprehension Program:** District personnel attempted service of five (5) active arrest warrants within the Town of Lauderdale-by-the-Sea. Five (5) fugitives were apprehended and arrested. Corporal Charles Pickell oversees this program.

- **Sexual Offender Tracking Program:** There is one (1) person legally classified as a sexual offender currently residing within Town limits. This offender is routinely contacted by BSO to ensure his continued compliance with State of Florida legal mandates. Existing municipal ordinances prohibit additional persons classified as a sexual offender or sexual predator from residing within Town limits. Deputy Craig Bachan administers this program.
- **Segway Transporter Patrol:** The Segway X2 provides for personalized service to specific areas of the community including parks, parking lots, community functions and special events. Deputies utilized the Segway a total of three (3) hours this month during both daylight and night time hours. This Segway was purchased utilizing drug money forfeitures at no cost to the Town residents.
- **Bicycle Patrol:** Deputies on all shifts utilize patrol bicycles on a daily basis. This mode of patrol allows the deputies to interact one-on-one with our residents and tourists. The bicycles were utilized a total of fifteen (15) hours this month. These bicycles were purchased utilizing drug money forfeitures at no cost to Town residents.
- **All Terrain Vehicle Patrol:** The ATV / Polaris is utilized primarily on the beach areas to provide residents with a beach patrol to deter criminal activity and to maintain the security of the beach-area properties. Deputies used the ATV / Polaris for a total of thirty-four (34) hours this month. These All Terrain Vehicles were purchased utilizing drug money forfeitures at no cost to Town residents.
- **Crisis Intervention Team Program:** The Crisis Intervention Team Program encompasses specially trained patrol deputies and sergeants who are able to intervene in situations involving persons with mental illness or are otherwise experiencing mental health crises. Sergeant Edward Rafailovtc is the Crisis Intervention Team Program coordinator.
- **Enhanced Marine Law Enforcement Patrol Program:** The BSO Marine Patrol Unit participates in the Enhanced Marine Law Enforcement Grant on behalf of Lauderdale-by-the-Sea. The Town of Lauderdale-by-the-Sea currently receives in excess of 640 additional hours of Enhanced Marine Law Enforcement Grant patrol hours each year. Sergeant Edward Rafailovtc is the district liaison to the BSO Marine Patrol Unit.
- **Surveillance Camera System:** The surveillance camera system is strategically placed throughout the Town in efforts to identify and deter criminal activity. The surveillance camera system is currently operational and has recently undergone infrastructure and software upgrades to expand and enhance coverage.
- **Cyber Visor:** This information initiative allows Town residents to stay informed, via email or text messages, of important Town topics such as criminal activity, traffic information, upcoming events, security issues and important public safety information. Residents can register for this program through either the Lauderdale-by-the-Sea or the Broward Sheriff's Office internet website.
- **Electronic Message Board:** The BSO Lauderdale-by-the-Sea district continues to utilize the electronic traffic safety message board at various locations within the Town. This allows us to alert residents about any traffic problems and other important public

safety issues. This electronic message board was purchased through grant funding at no direct cost to Town residents.

SPECIAL EVENTS: These events required the participation of the BSO LBTS district.

Jazz on the Square: The Chamber of Commerce and The Village Grille sponsor "Jazz on the Square". This weekly event takes place every Friday night on Commercial Boulevard at El Mar Drive. Guests are entertained by live jazz music, food and beverages. Two (2) off-duty BSO detail deputies are assigned to work this event at no cost to Town residents.

Music by the Sea: Athena's-by-the-Sea hosts their outdoor musical event every Saturday night on Commercial Boulevard at Ocean Drive. This event includes live music, food and other festivities. Two (2) off-duty BSO detail deputies are assigned to work this event at no cost to Town residents.

Primary/Municipal Election: On January 31, 2012, a municipal election, in concert with the national Republican Party primary election, was held in Lauderdale-by-the-Sea. For several days prior, LBTS district deputies were assigned to a directed patrol of the areas utilized for street campaigning to ensure the safety of participants and observers. Deputies were also assigned a directed patrol of specified residential areas and polling locations on polling day. No significant incidents related to campaign concerns were reported to the BSO LBTS district.

NOTABLE INCIDENTS / ARRESTS:

During the week of January 2, 2012, LBTS deputies responded to the Silver Shores area in reference to reports of a subject opening several unlocked cars and rifling through them. Several small items and pocket change were reported stolen. Deputies conducted directed patrols of the area and identified several potential suspects. This investigation is still ongoing.

On January 8, 2012, LBTS deputies responded to a call of a subject who had broken into a vacant apartment on El Mar Drive. Deputies were able to apprehend the suspect. It was discovered that the suspect was in possession of property recently stolen from surrounding municipalities. LBTS deputies worked with the surrounding police departments to return the property to the rightful owners and properly charge the suspect with the crimes. The suspect has an extensive criminal history for violent and other offenses.

On January 26, 2012, LBTS deputies responded to the 4655 Bougainvillea Drive in reference to assisting VFD with a structure fire. The building was evacuated, and deputies assisted with traffic control. Deputies also assisted VFD with making forced entry into the apartment where the fire started. The female occupant was transported to the hospital by AMR.

On January 31, 2012, LBTS deputies responded to a report of a burglary to a residence, whereby a subject forcibly entered the victim's residence, and proceeded to beat him with a skateboard over a dispute. Based on the description of the suspect, deputies were able to apprehend him later that day without incident. The victim is expected to recover.
