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**PERSONNEL CHANGES:**

There were no personnel changes for the month of February.

**EMPLOYEE OF THE MONTH: CSIA Faisal Moreno**

CSIA Moreno responded to a request for a Crime Scene Investigative Aide (CSIA) at the scene of a burglary to a residence in the Silver Shores community. On arrival, CSIA Moreno noted that there was extensive damage to the front door, and that the suspect apparently rummaged through a bedroom.

CSIA Moreno then began to meticulously process the crime scene. Although it appeared that the suspect made efforts to prevent the collection of any latent evidence, CSIA Moreno noted a partial palm print related to the mechanism of entry. He then began to work on developing and processing this potentially valuable piece of evidence through a variety of techniques.

CSIA Moreno's efforts were rewarded when the Crime Lab notified us that the latent print he collected was of evidentiary value. Additional investigation revealed that the latent print was that of a known, violent habitual felon, who was wanted for questioning by several other law enforcement agencies for his suspected involvement in similar crimes.

As a result of this critical piece of evidence positively linking the suspect to this crime, detectives were able to obtain a warrant for this suspect's arrest. This key piece of evidence also allowed investigators from other agencies to further their cases as well. The suspect was soon apprehended, and his bond was set in excess of \$1 million due the number and severity of the crimes he committed. Now that this investigation has been closed, CSIA Moreno's efforts can finally be recognized.

Due to CSIA Moreno's technical expertise in processing crime scenes, along with his dedication to duty, he was able to develop a critical piece of evidence, which facilitated the capture of this suspect. CSIA Moreno's continued exceptional performance highlights his dedication to the safety of the residents of Lauderdale-by-the-Sea.

**COMMUNITY PROGRAMS AND SERVICES:** These ancillary programs and services are available to residents on an ongoing basis.

- **Elder Links:** This program offers referral services to elderly residents and other senior citizens in need of medical and mental health care, meal delivery or other social services. Sergeant Peter LaGana oversees this program.
- **Business and Residential Security Surveys:** The Business and Residential Security Survey Program teaches participants to secure their business, home or condominium to reduce the likelihood of burglary and theft. Sergeant Peter LaGana handles all business and residential security surveys.
- **Vacation House Watch Program:** Residents who are traveling out-of-town may register for this program. Deputies will conduct periodic checks of their residence until their return. Sergeant Peter LaGana oversees the Vacation House Watch Program.
- **Neighborhood Crime Prevention Program:** The LBTS district Neighborhood Crime Prevention Program liaison organizes and conducts crime prevention and security seminars at the request of neighborhood civic and condominium associations. Sergeant Peter LaGana oversees this program.
- **Identity Theft and Scam Prevention Program:** The Identity Theft and Scam Prevention Program is designed to inform residents about identity theft and how to lessen their chances of becoming a victim of a scam. Residents are informed on the importance of shredding documents, awareness of suspicious individuals, protection of passwords and use of caution in revealing information. Our annual Shred-A-Thon to reduce identity theft event is incorporated into this program. Sergeant Peter LaGana oversees this program.
- **Child Car Seat Installations / Inspections:** The Child Car Seat Installation program provides for education in the proper utilization of child safety seats. Deputy Jason Friedrich will install or inspect a child safety seat at the public's request.
- **Citizen Observer Patrol (COP) Program:** COP volunteers are local residents who receive public safety training. They are a tremendous asset to the Town of Lauderdale-by-the-Sea. COP members alternate assisting in administrative duties or patrolling local neighborhoods as an extra pair of eyes and ears to supplement deputy sheriff patrols. COP members also attend monthly patrol information and criminal intelligence briefings. Sergeant Peter LaGana manages this program. A summary of COP statistical activity is found at the end of this report.
- **Sheriff's Explorer Program:** The Sheriff's Explorer Program allows juveniles who are interested in pursuing careers in criminal justice a chance to enhance their knowledge and skill of law enforcement related topics through weekly training workshops. Sergeant Edward Rafailovitch is the Lauderdale-by-the-Sea district liaison for this program.

- **Fugitive Apprehension Program:** District personnel attempted service of one (1) active arrest warrants within the Town of Lauderdale-by-the-Sea. One (1) fugitive was apprehended and arrested. Corporal Charles Pickell oversees this program.
- **Sexual Offender Tracking Program:** There is one (1) person legally classified as a sexual offender currently residing within Town limits. This offender is routinely contacted by BSO to ensure his continued compliance with State of Florida legal mandates. Existing municipal ordinances prohibit additional persons classified as a sexual offender or sexual predator from residing within Town limits. Deputy Craig Bachan administers this program.
- **Segway Transporter Patrol:** The Segway X2 provides for personalized service to specific areas of the community including parks, parking lots, community functions and special events. Deputies utilized the Segway a total of three (3) hours this month during both daylight and night time hours. This Segway was purchased utilizing drug money forfeitures at no cost to the Town residents.
- **Bicycle Patrol:** Deputies on all shifts utilize patrol bicycles on a daily basis. This mode of patrol allows the deputies to interact one-on-one with our residents and tourists. The bicycles were utilized a total of twenty four (24) hours this month. These bicycles were purchased utilizing drug money forfeitures at no cost to Town residents.
- **All Terrain Vehicle Patrol:** The ATV / Polaris is utilized primarily on the beach areas to provide residents with a beach patrol to deter criminal activity and to maintain the security of the beach-area properties. Deputies used the ATV / Polaris for a total of thirty two (32) hours this month. These All Terrain Vehicles were purchased utilizing drug money forfeitures at no cost to Town residents.
- **Crisis Intervention Team Program:** The Crisis Intervention Team Program encompasses specially trained patrol deputies and sergeants who are able to intervene in situations involving persons with mental illness or are otherwise experiencing mental health crises. Sergeant Edward Rafailovtc is the Crisis Intervention Team Program coordinator.
- **Enhanced Marine Law Enforcement Patrol Program:** The BSO Marine Patrol Unit participates in the Enhanced Marine Law Enforcement Grant on behalf of Lauderdale-by-the-Sea. The Town of Lauderdale-by-the-Sea currently receives in excess of 640 additional hours of Enhanced Marine Law Enforcement Grant patrol hours each year. Sergeant Edward Rafailovtc is the district liaison to the BSO Marine Patrol Unit.
- **Surveillance Camera System:** The surveillance camera system is strategically placed throughout the Town in efforts to identify and deter criminal activity. The surveillance camera system is currently operational and has recently undergone infrastructure and software upgrades to expand and enhance coverage.
- **Cyber Visor:** This information initiative allows Town residents to stay informed, via email or text messages, of important Town topics such as criminal activity, traffic information, upcoming events, security issues and important public safety information. Residents can register for this program through either the Lauderdale-by-the-Sea or the Broward Sheriff's Office internet website.

- **Electronic Message Board:** The BSO Lauderdale-by-the-Sea district continues to utilize the electronic traffic safety message board at various locations within the Town. This allows us to alert residents about any traffic problems and other important public safety issues. This electronic message board was purchased through grant funding at no direct cost to Town residents.

**SPECIAL EVENTS:** These events required the participation of the BSO LBTS district.

**Jazz on the Square:** The Chamber of Commerce and The Village Grille sponsor "Jazz on the Square". This weekly event takes place every Friday night on Commercial Boulevard at El Mar Drive. Guests are entertained by live jazz music, food and beverages. Two (2) off-duty BSO detail deputies are assigned to work this event at no cost to Town residents.

**Music by the Sea:** Athena's-by-the-Sea hosts their outdoor musical event every Saturday night on Commercial Boulevard at Ocean Drive. This event includes live music, food and other festivities. Two (2) off-duty BSO detail deputies are assigned to work this event at no cost to Town residents.

**Super Bowl XLV Block Party:** On February 5, 2012, the Village Grille and 101 Ocean hosted their annual Super Bowl Block Party event on Commercial Boulevard at El Mar Drive. The event consisted of music, food, beverage and the broadcasting of Super Bowl XLV. Four (4) off-duty BSO detail deputies were assigned to work this event at no cost to Town residents.

**A1A Marathon:** On February 19, 2012, Lauderdale-by-the-Sea hosted a portion of the A1A Marathon charity event. Numerous off-duty BSO detail deputies were assigned to work this event at no cost to Town residents.

**Taste of the Beach:** On February 22, 2012, the Lauderdale-by-the-Sea Chamber of Commerce hosted its annual Taste of the Beach Event. The event festivities consisted of live entertainment, food from various local restaurants, beverages and numerous auctions and other fundraisers. Two (2) off-duty BSO detail deputies were assigned to work this event at no cost to Town residents.

#### **NOTABLE INCIDENTS / ARRESTS:**

During the month of February 2012, LBTS deputies participated in an operational plan designed to enhance the safety of motorists and bicyclists sharing the roadways, especially along N. Ocean Drive. Bicycle certified deputies made contact with bicyclists and disseminated information to ensure that they were aware of their rights and responsibilities. Informational messages were also disseminated to motorists to ensure that they were also aware of the importance of maintaining vigilance for bicyclists.

On February 4, 2012, LBTS deputies responded to a call of a chain snatching. While the victim was walking along El Mar Drive, the suspect ran alongside him and snatched his gold chain. The suspect is believed to have fled the area in a vehicle driven by an accomplice. Deputies canvassed the area looking for the vehicle, but did not locate it, partially due to a delay in the victim's report of the incident. This case is still under investigation, and is believed to be related to several similar incidents throughout the county.

On February 11, 2012, LBTS deputies responded to a report of a burglary to an occupied hotel room on El Mar Drive. On arrival, the victim advised that he awoke to find a subject attempting to climb through his window. Deputies set up a perimeter, and with the assistance of BSO Aviation and Canine units, were able to apprehend the suspect as he was hiding in a shed that he had broken into. The suspect was taken into custody. Investigation revealed that the suspect has an extensive criminal record.

On February 22, 2012, LBTS deputies responded to a report of a shoplifting at Walgreen's. Deputies observed the suspect vehicle, and were able to detain them. During the course of the preliminary investigation, it was discovered that the suspects are part of a large, organized multi-jurisdictional shoplifting ring. BSO Strategic Investigations Division detectives assisted, and this investigation is still ongoing.

On February 23, 2012, LBTS deputies responded to a report of a female yelling for help on Bougainvillea Drive. On arrival, deputies observed the suspect attempting to strangle the victim over a domestic dispute. Deputies were able to take the suspect into custody without incident, and the victim is expected to make a full recovery. The suspect and victim are known to each other.

On February 23, 2012, LBTS deputies responded to a report of a disturbance on the beach. The investigation revealed that two subjects were involved in an argument, when the suspect pulled out a knife and threatened to stab the other subject. Deputies were able to identify the suspect, who was subsequently arrested at his home without further incident. No injuries were sustained by either party.






