

180 **Section 3. Election Called.** A special election is hereby called for Tuesday, March 11,
181 2014, in conjunction with the general election being held on said date, to present to the qualified
182 electors of the Town of Lauderdale-By-The-Sea (the “Town”), each of the ballot questions
183 provided in Section 4 of this Ordinance.

184 **Section 4. Form of Ballot.** The form of ballot for the Charter Amendments provided for
185 in Section 2 of this Ordinance shall be substantially as follows:

186 (1) CREATE ALTERNATIVE STANDARD FOR TOWN
187 COMMISSION TO DETERMINE TOWN MANAGER
188 QUALIFICATIONS
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190 The Charter currently identifies qualifications for the Town
191 Manager, including specifically identified levels of education and
192 experience establishing acceptable competencies and practices of
193 local public management experience.
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195 Shall the Charter be amended to give the Town Commission the
196 option to determine that other levels of education and experience
197 are acceptable because they are comparable to the identified
198 levels?

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205 (2) CHANGE TIME FOR TOWN COMMISSION TO
206 DESIGNATE THE VICE-MAYOR
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208 The Charter currently provides that the Town Commission must
209 designate a Vice Mayor on the second Tuesday following each
210 regular election.

213 Commission designate a Vice-Mayor no later than the second
214 regularly scheduled Town Commission meeting following each

(3) ALLOW MAYOR-COMMISSIONER TO RUN FOR TOWN COMMISSIONER AFTER REACHING TERM LIMIT AS MAYOR-COMMISSIONER

The Charter currently prohibits a Mayor-Commissioner from running for Town Commissioner immediately following three consecutive terms of service as Mayor-Commissioner.

Shall the Charter be amended to allow future Mayor-Commissioners to run for Town Commissioner without a two-year break in service?

(4) ESTABLISH MAXIMUM CONSECUTIVE TERM LIMIT FOR SERVICE AS MAYOR-COMMISSIONER AND TOWN COMMISSIONER

The Charter currently limits service as a Mayor-Commissioner to three terms and service as a Town Commissioner to two terms, but does not limit continuous service alternating between the two offices.

Shall the Charter be amended to provide that no person may be elected or appointed as Mayor-Commissioner or Town Commissioner if that person has served a total of fourteen years in any combination of offices, without a two year break in service?

(5) AMEND PROCEDURES AND PENALTIES APPLICABLE TO ALLEGED COMMISSIONER VIOLATIONS

262 The Charter currently provides that, if the Town Commission finds
263 that one of its members has committed certain acts, that
264 Commissioner shall forfeit office.

267 requirements for such hearings, and to allow the Commission to
268 consider lesser penalties (censure and a letter of instruction) for
269 violation of any standard of conduct or code of ethics established
270 by law and for incapacity for three or more months?

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277 (6) CREATE PROCEDURES FOR VACANCIES IN
278 CANDIDACY FOR TOWN ELECTED OFFICE

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280 Section 166.031(6), Florida Statutes, requires that local
281 governments create a procedure to address vacancies in candidacy
282 before an election.

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284 Shall the Charter be amended to add procedures related to
285 candidate vacancies including procedures for withdrawal,
286 supplemental qualifying periods, treatment of remaining
287 candidates, and effects of death, withdrawal or removal of
288 candidates?

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294 **Section 5. Vote at Polls.** Balloting shall be conducted between the hours of 7 A.M. and
295 7 P.M. on the date of the election, and early and absentee balloting shall also be permitted as
296 provided in conjunction with the general election. Polling places shall be those polling places
297 provided for the general election for the electors of the Town, pursuant to applicable laws. All
298 qualified Town electors who are timely registered in accordance with law shall be entitled to
299 vote. The Town Clerk is authorized to obtain any necessary election administration services
