SWALE RESTORTION AND LANDSCAPING IMPROVEMENTS WILL BE MADE ON HIBISCUS, ALLENWOOD AND TROPIC DRIVE

The landscaping portion of this neighborhood project is complete, except for the north-south segments of Allenwood and Tropic Drives where drainage work is underway. Crews this week are installing an outfall pipe. If all work proceeds as planned, the north-south segments of Allenwood and Tropic drives will be repaved next week!

Landscaping will not be done on those streets until all the drainage work is complete. So far, 120 trees have been planted in the neighborhood. Thirty more will be added along Allenwood and Tropic Drives once the drainage work in the area is finished.

Background

Residents on three streets - **Hibiscus Avenue, Allenwood Drive** and **Tropic Drive** - will see swale restoration and landscaping improvements.

The swale restoration will improve drainage in the area. The landscaping aspect of the project will help to significantly increase neighborhood beautification. The swale restoration is only the first phase of the overall drainage improvements.

Foxtail, Pindo and Sylvester palm trees will be added to all three streets. This part of the project was funded with a \$30,000 **Neighborhood Improvement Program** grant the **Town Commission** awarded to the neighborhood in 2012.
