Subject: **Monthly Report to Commission – May 2015**

PERSONNEL CHANGES:

None

EMPLOYEE OF THE MONTH: Deputies Rene Suarez, 17050; Michael Hencken, 15589 and Claudia Duarte, 14351

Dep. Suarez observed a suspicious vehicle that was later determined to have been stolen from a business in Pompano Beach. The crime was unreported at the time and the vehicle was taken during a burglary to an auto parts store. Deputies Hencken and Duarte responded to assist and subsequently the suspect was located and arrested due to their diligence and teamwork.

COMMUNITY PROGRAMS AND SERVICES: These ancillary programs and services are available to residents on an ongoing basis.

- **Elder Links:** This program offers referral services to elderly residents and other senior citizens in need of medical and mental health care, meal delivery or other social services.
- **Business and Residential Security Surveys:** The Business and Residential Security Survey program teaches participants to secure their business, home or condominium to reduce the likelihood of burglary and theft. Security surveys, conducted by a certified law

enforcement security specialist, are providing upon request, at no charge to the business owner or resident.

- **Vacation House Watch Program:** Residents who are traveling out-of-town may register for this program. Deputies will conduct periodic checks of their residence until their return.
- **Neighborhood Crime Prevention Program:** The Neighborhood Crime Prevention program liaison organizes and conducts crime prevention and security seminars at the request of neighborhood civic and condominium associations. He will also help facilitate any Neighborhood Crime Watch programs in which the residents wish to participate.
- **Identity Theft and Scam Prevention Program:** The Identity Theft and Scam Prevention program is designed to inform residents about identity theft and how to lessen their chances of becoming a victim of a scam. Residents are informed on the importance of shredding documents, awareness of suspicious individuals, protection of passwords and use of caution in revealing information. Our Shred-A-Thon to reduce identity theft event is incorporated into this program.
- **Child Car Seat Installations / Inspections:** The Child Car Seat Installation / Inspection program provides for education in the proper utilization of child car safety seats.
- **Enhanced Marine Law Enforcement Patrol Program:** The BSO Marine Patrol Unit participates in the Enhanced Marine Law Enforcement Grant on behalf of Lauderdale-by-the-Sea. This grant allows for additional maritime patrols throughout the Town's waterways and adjacent ocean area.
- **Citizen Observer Patrol (COP) Program:** COP volunteers are local residents who receive public safety training. They are a tremendous asset to the Town of Lauderdale-by-the-Sea. COP members alternate assisting in administrative duties or patrolling local neighborhoods as an extra pair of eyes and ears to supplement deputy sheriff patrols. COP members also attend monthly patrol information and criminal intelligence briefings. A summary of COP statistical activity is included at the end of this report.
- **Sexual Offender Tracking Program:** There is currently one (1) person legally classified as a sexual offender residing within Town limits. This offender is routinely contacted by BSO to ensure his continued compliance with State of Florida legal mandates. Existing municipal ordinances prohibit additional persons classified as sexual offenders or sexual predators from residing within Town limits.
- **Bicycle Patrol:** Deputies utilize specialized patrol bicycles to enhance public safety and community outreach. This mode of patrol allows the deputies to interact one-on-one with our residents and visitors. The patrol bicycles were utilized for a total of forty (40) hours this month.
- **All-Terrain Vehicle Patrol:** The ATV / Polaris are primarily utilized on the beach areas in order to conduct patrols to deter criminal activity and maintain the security of the beach-area properties. The ATV patrol is instrumental in marine fisheries regulation enforcement and protection. Deputies used the ATV / Polaris for sixty (60) hours this month.

- **Crisis Intervention Team / Homeless Outreach Team Programs:** The C.I.T. / H.O.T. program is comprised of specially trained patrol deputies and supervisors who are able to intervene in situations involving persons with mental illness or are otherwise experiencing mental health crises or are homeless and in need of services. Thirteen (13) individuals were contacted during the month. Five (5) were transported to a facility for assistance. One (1) was arrested for an outstanding warrant and taken to jail.
- **Automated License Plate Reader Camera System:** The ALPR system installation was completed in October. The system is proving to be an effective tool to Public Safety. **See Notable Incidents/Arrests below.**
- **e - Alerts:** This information initiative allows Town residents to stay informed, via email or text messages, of important topics such as criminal activity, traffic information, upcoming events, security issues and other important public safety information throughout Broward County and Lauderdale-by-the-Sea. Residents can register for this program through either the Lauderdale-by-the-Sea or the Broward Sheriff's Office internet website.
- **Electronic Message Board:** The BSO Lauderdale-by-the-Sea district continues to utilize the electronic traffic safety message board at various locations within the Town. This allows the district to alert residents about any traffic problems and other important public safety issues impacting them.

SPECIAL EVENTS: These events required the participation of the BSO LBTS district.

Relay for Life: LBTS Deputies conducted a Directed Patrol to ensure the safety of attendees at the annual American Cancer Society event. Capt. Wood participated.

NOTABLE INCIDENTS / ARRESTS:

May ALPR Arrests:

- 1) 05-04-2015 / 1541 hours; 230 Commercial Blvd.; Boelke, John, male, 8/24/75; Charges: Driving While License Suspended 10X (Habitual Offender-Felony)

Dep. Merry stopped Boelke following an ALPR alert. Boelke was taken into custody after confirming he had 10 suspensions on his license and was deemed a habitual offender in 2012. Vehicle impounded per DHSMV order since the driver was the vehicle owner.

- 2) 05-11-2015 / 1425 hours; 270 Commercial Blvd.; Gardner, John, male, 2/23/77; Charges: Petit Theft/Poss. Stolen Tag, Driving While License Suspended 12X (Habitual Offender-Felony)

Dep. Merry stopped a Nissan SUV operated by Gardner after an ALPR alert. The New York tag attached to the vehicle was confirmed stolen. Gardner confessed to stealing and attaching the tag and knowledge that he was driving on a suspended DL.

- 3) 05-12-2015 / 1530 hours; 4500 N Ocean Dr.; Geovanni, Geo, male, 2/22/69; Charges: Warrant (Failure to Pay Child Support)

Geovanni was stopped by Dep. Merry following an ALPR alert. His DL was suspended and he had an active warrant from Orange County.

- 4) 05-19-2015 / 1045 hours; 4660 N Ocean Dr.; Cadet, Carlene, female, 09/30/1980;
Charge: Petit Theft

Dep. Wilson stopped Cadet after an ALPR alert for a stolen Florida license plate. The tag was confirmed as stolen and Cadet was issued a Notice to Appear and the vehicle was towed.

- 5) 05-25-15 / 2200 hours; 4660 N Ocean Dr.; Wilson, Elijah, male, 07/26/78; Charge:
Habitual Offender (Felony)

An ALPR alert resulted in a traffic stop by Dep. Alvarez-Jacinto of a 2006 blue Nissan operated by the suspect. A records check confirmed that the suspect was a habitual traffic offender.

Burglary Conveyances: 05-12-15 / 1020-1100 hours and 05-13-15 / 1202 hours

Locations: 1850 S. Ocean Dr. (Crane Crest) and 1700 S. Ocean Dr. (Cristelle)

Suspects: Unknown driver, male passenger in 2013-2015 white Dodge Durango

Both vehicles were unlocked plumbing vans that were entered while the repairmen were working at the listed condominiums. An iPad was removed from one vehicle (GPS tracking was unsuccessful) and no surveillance cameras in lot. A back-flow test kit and drill were taken in the second incident. The incident was captured on video. The ALPR system was checked for a possible vehicle tag. Pompano Beach had 2 plumbing vans burglarized within 2 hours with the same suspect vehicle description. Subsequently, a joint operational plan with Pompano Beach and LBTS detectives was conducted for 2 weeks to include several undercover techniques. No suspects have been identified to date.

Grand Theft: 5-15-15 / 1 month delay

Location: 5400 N Ocean Blvd. (Sea Ranch Condos)

Suspect: Greene, Kevin, male, 11/25/70

Pending Charges: Grand Theft, Dealing in Stolen Property, Providing False Info to a Pawnbroker, Exploitation of Elderly

The elderly victim had recently 'taken in' her adult nephew; suspect Greene, after he was evicted from his residence. In April, the victim vacationed in Europe and left Greene in possession of her apartment. During the period of 3/30/15 to 4/10/15 Greene removed large amounts of cash, jewelry, and gold coins from the apartment and later sold or pawned them for cash, which was verified through pawn records. Greene has fled the area Det. Mursell is currently seeking a warrant for his arrest.

Burglary Residence Arrest: 05-22-15 / 1432 hours

Location: 4228 N Ocean Dr. (French Leave Condos)

Suspect: Brewer, Ronald, male, 12/20/70

Pending Charges: Burglary Residence, Petit Theft, Unlawful Use of Credit Card
Victim: Ann Marie Hickey

The victim is the manager of the French Leave Condo and reported that she left her apartment for approx. 1 hour and accidentally left the rear door unsecured. When she returned, her purse had been disturbed and an ATM card and \$60.00 cash missing. She then saw her neighbor, suspect Brewer, returning from the nearby 7-11 store with merchandise and became suspicious.

She spoke with the 7-11 manager, who confirmed Brewer had used an ATM card for the purchases. Dep. Castor responded and conducted an investigation, confirmed the missing card had been used at the 7-11, and Brewer was identified on the in-store video surveillance. Contact was then made at Brewer's apartment, where he readily admitted his involvement in the crime. Brewer was transported to the district office, where Det. Mursell responded and obtained his confession.

Stolen Vehicle Arrest (Assist to Other Jurisdiction): 05-24-15 / 0122 hours

Location: 4660 N. Ocean Dr.

Suspect: Male Juvenile, 13 years old

Charges: Burglary Business, Grand Theft Auto

Dep. Suarez observed a white pick-up truck northbound without headlights on N. Ocean Dr. As he passed the vehicle, he observed a short, young male behind the wheel who appeared to be too young to drive. Upon observing Dep. Suarez, the suspect/driver bailed out of the vehicle and it came to a stop by crashing into a parked vehicle at 4660 N. Ocean Dr (Florida Beach Hotel). The suspect fled eastbound on foot and an area search was conducted with negative results. The vehicle was registered to Pep Boys at 240 W. Copans Rd, Pompano Beach.

At approximately 0315 hours, Dep. Hencken observed a young male speaking with a taxi cab driver at approximately 4900 N. Ocean Dr. He was cooperative and provided the names of two other juvenile males that were in the vehicle. A Pompano Beach detective was contacted and the juvenile suspect, a habitual runaway from a Margate foster home, was transported to Pompano to be interviewed. The keys to the truck had been taken in a burglary to the auto parts store.
