BULK PICK-UP REMINDER

The monthly bulk pick-up dates for December do not fall on the first Thursday and Friday of the month. For homeowners south of Commercial Boulevard, the bulk pick-up date is Dec. 7th. For homeowners north of Commercial, the bulk pick-up date is Dec. 8th.

STRAW POLL RESULTS

The Town residents who took part in a straw poll on the issue of burying overhead utility lines supported the idea by a 2-to-1 margin. One hundred and two residents voted to support the idea. Forty-seven residents voted against it. The straw poll is not binding on the Town Commission.

CHRISTMAS EVE SERVICE

The Community Church of Lauderdale-By-The-Sea will hold its a Candlelight Service on Christmas Eve at 7 PM. It will also hold "Advent for Apples" at 6 PM at the church. All the refreshments will be made out of apples. Everyone is welcome.

PARADE BRIDGE SCHEDULE

The Commercial Boulevard Bridge will be closed to vehicle traffic during the Winterfest Boat Parade on Dec. 16 for about two hours. The bridge is expected to be closed from 8:30 to 10:30 PM.

Town voters reject two Charter amendments on building heights

■ Town residents who run businesses out of their homes can now apply to the Town for a home-based occupational license.

Lauderdale-By-The-Sea voters in November rejected two **Town Charter** amendment proposals and approved two others. Voters turned down referendum Questions 1 and 2, which dealt with building heights and non-conforming buildings. Voters, however, approved the referendum questions on election term limits and home occupational licenses.

HOW TO APPLY FOR A HOME-BASED OCCUPATIONAL LICENSE

To apply for a **home-based occupational license**, you must pick-up an application in the Town's **Development Services Department**, which is located in the Town Hall Annex trailer just north of **Jarvis Hall**. The fee is \$50.



This license is for Town homeowners or residents who operate a business out of their home or residence. After you apply, an inspection will be conducted to ensure your business does not occupy more than 10 percent of the square-footage living space in your home or condo. Sign-up dates set for senior and Homestead property exemptions

Broward County Property Appraiser Lori Parrish recently announced special homeowner sign-up dates for **Homestead** and **Senior Property Tax Exemptions** for residents in the **Town of Lauderdale-By-The-Sea**.

Deputy Property Appraisers will visit **Jarvis Hall, 4505 Ocean Drive**, on the following Thursdays:

Dec. 14th

Jan. 18th

Feb. 15th.

All sign-ups begin at **11:30 AM**, except for the one on **Dec. 14th**, which will start instead at **9 AM**. Documents required to file for Homestead Exemption include a copy of your recorded deed or tax bill in the applicant's name, a

current Florida driver's license or Florida ID card, and a current voter registration card or declaration of domicile.

Non-US citizens must also provide proof of legal residency.

Broward property owners who moved in 2006 must re-file in person or online, because the Homestead Exemption is not transferable. Qualified residents 65 or older may also apply for the additional Senior Exemption.

Eligible seniors must have a total household income not exceeding \$23,463. By law, first time Senior Exemption applications can only be taken after **Jan. 1, 2007**.

PROPERLY USING YOUR REFUSE COLLECTION CART

Town residents can upgrade to a 96-gallon refuse collection cart at no extra cost. Please note: Items that were previously discarded in bags or pails must now be placed in your roll-out cart. No refuse outside the cart will be collected.

The 96-gallon carts are made of durable, high-strength, injection-molded plastic. The carts are not only quiet and easy to handle for moving and storing refuse, but offer a safe, convenient and effective way to handle household waste.

Here are some safe use and care guidelines that will help you get the most out of your new rollout cart:

LOADING YOUR ROLL-OUT CART

Always lift the lid from the front. Be careful not to overload your cart in excess of your ability to safely maneuver it.

MOVING YOUR ROLL-OUT CART TO THE CURB FOR COLLECTION

Make sure the lid is closed. Grab the handle with both hands, tilt the cart back slightly, and carefully

push or pull the cart. On inclines pull the cart uphill. On declines push the cart downhill. Always close the lid before moving your cart.

SETTING YOUR CART OUT FOR COLLECTION

Your cart should be set out at the curb or collection point the night before your scheduled pick-up day. Your cart should be set out one to two feet from the edge of the street. Make sure that the handles are facing away from the street. Under no circumstances should you ever place your cart on the street.

Do not place your cart close to mailboxes, utility poles, fire hydrants or parked cars.

CLOSE THE LID

Always keep the lid closed. This keeps animals out and odors in.

REMOVE YOUR CART

After collection, do not leave your cart at the curb or street. To help maintain the appearance of the neighborhood, remove your cart as soon as possible after collection.

CARING FOR YOUR CART

Your new cart is designed for ease and maintenance. To clean, simply rinse your cart with water and let dry in the sunlight with the lid open. To keep the interior of your cart clean and odor free, bag your trash before placing it in the cart.

BANNED REFUSE ITEMS

DO NOT PLACE PAINTS, SOLVENTS, ACIDS, GASOLINE, OIL, HOT ASHES, MEDICAL WASTE, EXPOSED NEEDLES, SAND SOIL, ROCKS OR CONCRETE IN YOUR CART. □

IMPORTANT SAFETY TIPS FOR USING & STORING GASOLINE

Gasoline plays a key role in our daily lives. It fuels our cars, allowing us to take the kids to school and haul our groceries home. But gasoline is dangerous if not handled or stored properly. Gas should only be used for its intended purpose — as a motor fuel — and stored only when absolutely necessary. Never use gas as a solvent, cleaner, to start a barbecue or for any other non-engine use.

The **Broward Sheriff's Office Department of Fire Rescue and Emergency Services** recommends the following for the safe storage and disposal of gasoline:

- Fire codes & regulations restrict the amount of gasoline a homeowner can store (no more than 25 gallons) in approved safety containers of 5 gallons or less capacity each.

- Gasoline must be stored in an



approved container or tank. Keep gasoline containers tightly closed and handle them gently to avoid spills.

- Gasoline is a flammable liquid and should be stored at room temperature, away from potential heat sources such as the sun, a water heater, space heater or a furnace, and a least 50 feet away from ignition sources, such as pilot lights. Gasoline vapors are heavier than air and can travel along the floor to ignition sources. Do not smoke where gasoline is handled or stored.

- Put gasoline in a small engine (such as a lawnmower) only when the engine and attachments are cool.

- Store gasoline in a building

separate from the house or place of occupancy, such as a shed or garage. Always keep gasoline out of reach from children.

- For better ventilation, it is best to handle gasoline outdoors.

- Do not mix even a small amount of gasoline with kerosene or diesel.

- Do not use gasoline in kerosene heaters or lamps.

- Minor spills should be absorbed with sawdust, paper or rags. Larger spills may be contained and collected. Place recovered gasoline and cleanup materials in approved, labeled-containers for proper disposal.

- Never dispose of spilled gasoline or cleaning materials on the ground or into your garbage, drains, toilets or sewers. If you do, it might cause a fire or seep into streams, bays, lakes or your groundwater. □

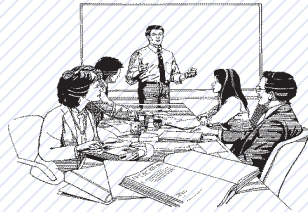
