New fire truck!

The Town's first new fire truck in 18 years went into service in November!

The Town purchased the new vehicle, which comes equipped with the latest in high-tech firefighting equipment, including a new Jaws-of-Life device and a portable thermal imager that allows firefighters to detect the body of a person trapped in a smoke-filled building.

"The truck brings the **Volunteer Fire Department** into the 21st Century," **Fire Chief Judson Hopping** said. "It's brought morale up and increased pride in the fire department."

Dolphins-Pats event "a win" for Town businesses

Hundreds of New Englanders jammed **Lauderdale-By-The-Sea** hotels in December for the annual **Miami Dolphins** home game against the **Pats**.

Nineteen buses carried 900 people from **Lauderdale-By-The-Sea** to **Sun Life Stadium** in Miami Springs. The Patriots won, but so did the Town's hotels and restaurants.

"It was a win for everybody," said **Dave Gadsby**, owner the **Village Grille**, the **Village Pump** and the

Beachside Village Hotel, which sold out all 31 of its rooms. The hotel requires a minimum 5-night stay for the fans who stay there.

A number of Town hotels were fully booked the week of the Dec. 2nd game. Gadsby, who already has more deposits than rooms for next year's game, has received many thank you notes and e-mails from business owners happy with the annual influx of Pats fans, which began 14 years ago.

Windjammer Resort General Manager John Boutin sold every available room he had left (12) to Patriot fans. "It was great," he said. "This year was bigger than last year."

Bougainvilla Project Progress

Sidewalks on **Bougainvilla Drive** south of **Washingtonia Avenue** should be completed in early January as work to install new drainage proceeds.

Work on Bougainvilla began September 24 and should be completed in March. This project will resolve the long-standing drainage problems in the area. The Town is installing an exfiltration drainage system designed to handle a 10-year storm. "The project appears to be slightly ahead of schedule," **Project Manager Bill Cole** said.

The drainage pipe installation between the Fire Station and Washingtonia Avenue is now complete. The work to build new concrete sidewalks is also almost complete.

A new drainage system is being installed between Washingtonia and Pine Avenues and should be finished in January.

The Town appreciates the patience of residents in dealing with the construction and parking issues. Bougainvilla residents have had to temporarily park elsewhere during the project while access to the vehicle spaces located in front of their buildings was blocked.

Residents who do not live on Bougainvilla are asked to **please not drive** on the street, since the dust kicked up by traffic is another aggravation street residents must deal with.

Cole said here is how the rest of the project will

- Street and swale paving (first layer).
- Concrete curb construction (for landscaping).
- Landscaping.
- Street and swale paving (final asphalt layer).
- Stamped asphalt and intersection treatments.




NEW CARTS: New recycling (blue) and trash (black) carts were distributed in mid-December

The vehicle holds eight firefighters and is capable of turning in tight spaces and driveways. The \$325,000 truck was bought with the annual fire fees the Town collects from residents and businesses.

Hopping said the new vehicle, which replaces an aging fire engine, will improve the department's efficiency in fighting fires and responding to other Town emergencies.

A traditional ceremony was held at the fire station in November, when **Town Commissioners** joined firefighters in symbolically "pushing" the vehicle into the station.

The tradition dates back 200 years, when community members would help firefighters push a horse-drawn fire wagon back into the station after the horses were unhitched.
