The Town wants your opinion about the pilot traffic signal changes at Commercial Boulevard and State Road A1A. The 8-week trial period began June 21 and ends

Aug. 11; it is in effect only on weekends. The program was designed to increase pedestrian safety at this busy Town intersection. The overhead

traffic lights will cycle as normal. At the end of each cycle, however, there will be a 4-way red light for motorists, and a 4-way crossing for pedestrians, who can even cross the intersection diagonally. During this final traffic cycle phase, drivers will not be allowed to turn right on red.

East Commercial project starts July 8

The **Town's East Commercial Streetscape Project** will start on **Monday, July 8th**.

The first phase will be to complete drainage work on **El Mar Drive** just north and south of **Commercial Boulevard**. After the El Mar drainage and sidewalk work is done, the contractor will start work on the Commercial Boulevard block between **State Road A1A** and El Mar. The final phase will be the block from El Mar to the beach.

The streetscape project will breathe new life into our popular commercial district.

State Contracting and Engineering Corp., a Hollywood firm, is managing the project. State is working closely with Town staff to ensure all work is completed






in December, before the start of the winter tourist season. All businesses will remain open. Please make an effort to patronize our local shops, stores and restaurants while this work is underway (*please see the flyer on Page 12*). The East Commercial project will create beautiful public gathering spaces while making the area much more pedestrian-friendly. Plans include wider, tree-shaded sidewalks, more sidewalk dining, unencumbered ocean views and two dynamic public plazas where the Town and businesses can hold a variety of outdoor events. The project also includes undergrounding power and other utility lines in **Anglin's Square**. The Town has leased the vacant **Minto** property just north of the **El Prado Parking Lot**, which will be used for temporary parking while the project is underway. The area will also be used as a staging area for equipment that State Contracting will need during the project. Electronic and household hazardous materials

Want to get rid of an old computer or television? Do you have insecticides, paint, pool chemicals or other potentially toxic substances at home gathering dust in your storage area?

Lauderdale-By-The-Sea residents can dispose of such items in a safe, eco-friendly way through a free household hazardous waste drop-off program offered by **Broward County Solid Waste and Recycling Services**.



Because electronics contain materials that can be harmful to humans and the environment, proper disposal is essential. For example, an old-style computer or television with a cathode ray tube (CRT) can contain

as much as eight pounds of lead. They also contain toxic materials such as mercury and cadmium.

Broward County's convenient household hazardous waste program removes and disposes of toxic substances while enabling materials such as copper and nickel to be recycled and reused many times over.

As a resident, you can drop off electronics such as televisions, computers, printers, fax machines, copiers, DVD and VCR players, cell phones, keyboards, mice and rechargeable batteries. Regular household alkaline batteries such as AA and D no longer contain mercury and are safe to dispose of in your regular garbage.



You can also drop off items such as paint, lawn and garden chemicals, pool chemicals, motor oil, gasoline, auto fluids, auto batteries, fire extinguishers and

propane tanks.

Drop-off stations for household hazardous waste and electronics are located in **Pompano Beach** at **2780 N. Powerline Road**. The station is open **Friday** and **Saturday** from **8AM** to **4PM**. Proof of Broward County residency, such as a driver's license or utility bill, is required when dropping off any materials.
