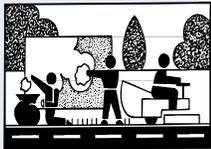

HEIGHT LIMITS WORKSHOP

The Town Commission will hold a workshop to discuss Town building height limits on June 7th at 6 PM in Jarvis Hall. The Town currently has a 3-over-1 story height limit south of Pine Avenue, which basically limits building heights to four stories, although the first story cannot be occupied.

Town residents will see 10 percent reduction in flood insurance premiums

The Town of Lauderdale-By-The-Sea has some excellent news for Town residents and business owners who are *required* by their mortgage holder to have flood insurance: As of May 1, 2005, you should notice a 10 percent discount on **National Flood Insurance Program** insurance whenever it's renewed. If you carry homeowners' flood insurance even though you are not required to, you are not eligible for the 10 percent premium reduction.

Municipal Services Director Bill Mason said the savings are a result of the Town's efforts to upgrade and improve stormwater drainage over the past two years. As a result, the Town's rating was upgraded to Class 8 under the NFIP's Community Rating System.

"It's pretty big," Mason said, referring to the Class 8 rating. "Instead of a 5 percent premium insurance reduction, residents will now get a 10 percent reduction. It took us two years of stormwater system maintenance to get it down to 8 from Class 9."

The Town was informed of the Class 8 rating in May by the **Federal Emergency Management Agency**. FEMA said the rating will automatically be renewed every year as long as the Town continues to efficiently maintain its stormwater system. □

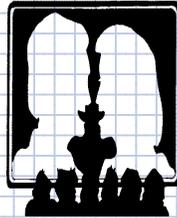

BSO rescue rockets can save drowning swimmers

Some Broward Sheriff's Office deputies in Lauderdale-By-The-Sea are now carrying a potentially life-saving rocket.

The ResQmax Rescue Rocket is a portable, easy-to-use device that uses compressed air to shoot a lifeline up to several hundred feet to swimmers in distress offshore. A highly visible, self-inflating flotation device connected to the end of the lifeline can help keep a struggling swimmer afloat as first responders tow the victim to shore or summon more help to the scene.

"Every year, we and our partners in BSO Fire-Rescue respond to emergencies on the beach here in Lauderdale-By-The-Sea," said BSO District-13 Chief Scott Gooding. "It makes a lot of sense that we give our deputies more tools to help save lives and keep residents and visitors safe."

Deputies will keep four of the Rescue Rockets in patrol cars while a fifth will be kept with BSO's beachfront all-terrain vehicle. The five new rockets are an addition to one already in service with BSO Fire-Rescue in Lauderdale-By-The-Sea.

The five Rescue Rockets purchased by BSO for use in Lauderdale-By-The-Sea cost \$12,600; the money came from the Law Enforcement Trust Fund, which is funded by monies confiscated from criminals and criminal activities.

Rescue Solutions International, Inc., a California-based firm, manufactures the Rescue Rocket for use in fire-rescue, law enforcement, military, offshore oil operations and other applications. ■
