SEAGRAPE IMPROVEMENTS

The Town's \$1.1 million Capital Improvement Project to upgrade Seagrape Drive with sidewalks and landscaping is underway. Of the \$1.1 million total cost, \$211,000 is earmarked for landscaping, which includes new trees, shrubs, sod and irrigation.


The project calls for streetscaping similar to what was done on Seagrape Drive south of Commercial Boulevard. The improvements include sidewalks on the west side of the road, improved drainage and decorative street lighting.

The section of Seagrape being upgraded will be closed to all vehicles but local traffic. The Town asks homeowners and residents to be patient while the project is underway.

The project started in mid-August and should be completed in January.

FLAG AT HALF STAFF

The Town's flags were lowered to half-staff in August to honor

Town Commissioner Michael Spicola, as well as Broward Sheriff's Office Sgt. Chris Reyka, who was tragically killed in the line of duty.

Public hearings on Town's proposed FY 07-08 budget set for September

- There are no increases in the Town's property tax rate or fire, sewer and stormwater utility fees under the proposed budget.

The **Town Commission** will hold two hearings on the proposed **FY 2007-08 Budget** in September. The meetings are **Sept. 14** and **27** at **7 PM** in **Jarvis Hall, 4505 Ocean Drive**.

The budget is a detailed blueprint of how the Town plans to spend the taxes and fees it collects in the coming fiscal year, which starts on Oct. 1.

Under the Town Manager's proposed budget, there are **NO** increases in the Town's **tax rate, fire assessment fee, sewer rates** or **stormwater utility fee**.

Homeowner sign-up dates for Homestead, Senior exemptions

- The Town Commission approved the additional Homestead exemption of \$50,000 for seniors in May.

Broward County Property Appraiser **Lori Parrish** announced special homeowner sign-up dates for **Homestead, Senior** and other property tax exemptions for **Town** taxpayers.

Deputy Property Appraisers will visit **Jarvis Hall, 4505 Ocean Drive**, on the following Thursdays from 11 AM to **12:30 PM**: **Sept. 20th, Oct. 18th, Nov. 15th** and **Jan. 17th**.

The documents required to file for Homestead Exemption include:

- A current Florida driver's license or Florida identification card.
- A current voter registration card or declaration of domicile.
- Non-US citizens must also provide proof of legal residency.

Qualified residents 65 or older may also apply for the additional Senior Exemption of \$50,000 from ad valorem taxes, which the **Town Commission approved in May**. Eligible seniors must have a total household income not exceeding \$24,214. For more info, visit the Property Appraiser's Web site at **www.bcpanet**. You can also call **954-445-5732**.

The proposed total budget for the upcoming fiscal year is **\$28, 272, 215**, which represents an increase of approximately 10 percent from FY 2006-07. The total All-Funds proposed budget breaks down this way:

- General Fund**
\$16,125,883
- Capital Improvement Fund**
\$9,787,519
- Proprietary Funds**
\$2,346,658
- Special Revenue Funds**
\$12,155

The largest increase for next year is reflected in the proposed Capital Improvement Fund, which is \$1,518,110 more than this year's amended budget — or 60 percent of the total increase in the All-Funds proposed FY 2007-08 budget.

In order to continue to aggressively complete vital Town projects approved by the Commission, the Capital Improvement Fund budget is receiving an additional \$777,327 in transfers from the General Fund to fund approved capital projects for the upcoming fiscal year (2007-08) and complete work in progress this year.


The second largest increase in the 2007-08 budget under the General Fund is \$1,099,956, which represents a 5 to 5.5 percent hike for contractual services.

The proposed budget does **NOT** increase:

- The current **ad valorem property tax rate** of **\$4.35** per \$1,000 of assessed property value.
- The annual residential **fire assessment fee** of **\$260**. The non-residential rate, which also does **NOT** increase, varies from \$499 to \$19,942 (depending on square footage). This rate has remained the same for two years.
- The **\$7 per month stormwater utility fee**. This fee — used to improve Town drainage — is assessed to all property owners

USE OF GENERAL FUND

The largest use of the General Fund is Public Safety (Police, Fire, EMS and Development Services). The second largest use is General Government. This includes elected officials and administrative staff that support the operational activities of Town Government: Commission, Non-Profit Organizations, Municipal Buildings, Administration, Town Attorney and General Government.



based on impervious area.

— **Sewer fees.** The currently monthly fee is **\$7.60** for single and multi-family homes. All customers also pay a **\$3 consumption rate** per 1,000 gallons used.

Any increase passed onto the Town by the City of Pompano Beach is passed along to residential and commercial consumers to eliminate

the need to transfer money from the General Fund. Sewer fees have stayed the same since FY 2003-04.

When the Commission meets in September to approve the proposed budget, it can decide to lower the proposed tax rate of \$4.35. The proposed FY 2007-08 budget is available on the Town's Web site: www.lauderdalebythesea-fl.gov
