**Sun Trolley rolls into Lauderdale-By-The-Sea**

The **Sun Trolley** has expanded its **Galt Ocean Mile** route into the **Town!**

The air-conditioned trolley gives Fort Lauderdale residents and tourists a fun and convenient way to visit **Lauderdale-By-The-Sea** and patronize our businesses without needing to drive or park here. It also gives Town residents who don’t want to drive a great way to visit nearby Fort Lauderdale.



The Sun Trolley operates in Town on **Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Fridays** and **Saturdays** from **8:30AM to 4:30PM**. The trolley makes specific stops at our **Visitors Center, Anglin’s Square** and **Town Hall**. You can also wave it down anywhere along its route as it travels north along **El Mar Drive** from **Palm Avenue** or south from **Pine Avenue** along **State Road A1A**. Most of the trolley’s routes are free, including stops at the **Galleria Mall, Coral Ridge Mall** and **Broward County Library**. The **Las Olas/Beach** route fare is \$1 per ride or \$3 for an all-day pass.

**Town seeks your ideas about its future**

Starting with a **public input session on Tuesday, Jan. 19th at 7PM in Jarvis Hall**, the Town will be seeking your ideas about what the Town should be concentrating on in the next 5 to 10 years.

More than 15 years ago the Town embarked on a visioning process that resulted in a beautiful plan which, unfortunately, sat dormant for years. But five years ago, the Town Commission developed a five-year Strategic Plan which updated that vision and set out specific steps to make it a reality. Now, in 2016, the majority of the projects and tasks outlined in that Plan have been successfully implemented. The award-winning Commercial Boulevard streetscape is fully completed. Serious flooding problems in our streets have been corrected. Parks have been upgraded and Town facilities have been updated and improved.

## Town Commission election set for March 15th

There will be a **municipal election** on **March 15th** to fill three seats on the **Town Commission**.

The qualifying period to file for office opens at **noon** on **Monday, Jan. 4** and ends at noon on **Monday, Jan. 11**.

Candidate information packets are available at Town Hall and Town Clerk Tedra Smith can answer many of the questions potential candidates might have.

**Mayor Scot Sasser** is seeking re-election. Mayoral candidates can reside anywhere in Town. The Mayor's term is for two years' duration.

**Commissioner Mark Brown** holds one of the two

Commission seats in **District 1**, the north area of Town, and will be running for that seat again in this election. District 1 begins directly north of Gatehouse Road.

**Stuart Dodd** will have served eight years as a Town Commissioner from **District 2**, the southern area of Town. Dodd is term-limited and cannot run for that seat again, so it is an open field for candidates that live in District 2.

Although Commission candidates must live in a certain district, voters Town-wide can cast ballots in all Commission races. Town Commissioners serve 4-year terms.

There are two polling places in Town: Jarvis Hall, 4505 N. Ocean Drive, and Assumption Catholic Church, 2001 S Ocean Blvd.



## Neighborhood Grant Program applications sought

The Town has extended the submission date for **Neighborhood Grant** applications until **Feb. 15**.

The following neighborhoods are eligible for the grant program: **Bel-Air**, **Lauderdale Surf & Yacht Estates** (Imperial Lane, Codrington Drive, Thomas Way), **North Silver Shores**, **South Silver Shores**, **South Seagrape** area, the *Bougainvillea Drive* and **Poinciana Street** neighborhoods, **Terra Mar**, and the **HAT** neighborhood (Hibiscus Avenue, Allenwood Drive and Tropic Drive).

Eligible neighborhoods are encouraged to take advantage of the opportunity to enhance their appearance and identity. The purpose of the grant program is to improve the quality of life in our neighborhoods by improving their appearance through projects such as signs and other entryway features, lighting, enhanced landscaping, swale restoration, street furniture, and public art.

Other types of improvements may be considered by the Commission on a case-by-case basis.

**The grant program will enhance the quality of life in our neighborhoods by improving their overall appearance.**

The Town funds one grant a year. Total funding from the Town for a Neighborhood Grant is \$30,000 annually, although more expensive projects can be undertaken if the neighborhood raises funds to supplement the Town's grant.

Also, larger programs can be broken down into segments, although there is no guarantee future segments will be funded.

Grant applications will be ranked according to the criteria listed in the application. Those neighborhoods which have not previously received a grant, and meet the other criteria, will be given preference.



The Town has embraced its past by highlighting its distinctive mid-century architecture. We have a distinct image now and it is reflected in street furniture, banners, signage and public art. New parking lots have been added and it's much easier for customers to pay for parking than in the past. Much-needed public restrooms are designed and will be constructed after this year's tourist season. We have obtained state and local grants to make El Mar Drive safer for pedestrians and bikers and more beautiful for all.

### El Mar Drive Update

The **Broward County Metropolitan Planning Organization** has allocated key funds for the **Town's El Mar Drive Greenway Project** to proceed.

The Town is now waiting for the **Florida Department of Transportation** to place the project on its schedule. If all proceeds as expected, the design process could possibly start this summer. The State and County want to create a greenway that provides a safe and comfortable pathway for pedestrians and bicyclists along the entire length of the County's coastline.

The Town believes the greenway concept is consistent with what residents and business owners want on El Mar Drive: improved safety for pedestrians and bike riders, wider sidewalks, better lighting and improved drainage.

**Public hearings** will be scheduled when preliminary designs are drafted for Town residents to review.






