Evaluation of Town's firefighting capabilities expected by late June

A professional evaluation of the Town's firefighting capabilities by the **Insurance Service Organization** is expected by late June. **Bradley Bain**, the southeast regional manager for ISO, which evaluates the readiness of fire protection in 45,000 fire districts nationwide, made a PowerPoint presentation to the Town in **Jarvis Hall** in March.

The Town currently has an ISO rating of 4. One is the best possible rating, which very few communities achieve. A rating of 10 represents the highest risk.

A community's rating, which reflects ISO's fire risk evaluation, affects the fire insurance premiums companies charge to local homeowners and businesses.

Bain said it is difficult to know precisely how a change in a community's rating will affect a homeowner's insurance premiums, since some compa-

Residents and business owners must decrease stormwater runoff

The **Town** is urging owners of businesses and residential properties to take whatever steps are necessary to reduce stormwater runoff onto sidewalks and streets.

Under **Broward County's** administrative code (Section 101.4.4.1 (a), "Rainwater or other liquid wastes shall be disposed of where same originates and/or falls."

Stormwater runoff is a problem in Town and elsewhere in Florida.

Urban sprawl causes a disturbance of the natural water flow. After storms, water runoff becomes accelerated as much of the land has been made impervious by man-made structures. The amount of rain that normally would infiltrate into the ground is reduced. The increased volume of water can overload drainage systems, and the accelerated speed of the runoff created by the rain causes soil and sediment erosion. Please take whatever steps you can to maintain rainwater on your property. □

BEACH PAVILION



FINAL TOUCHES: The Town's new beach pavilion at Commercial Boulevard was completed in April. The pavilion has benches, showers and electrical outlets for residents and beachgoers to use. The \$380,000 pavilion project was built with a \$176,000 grant from the Broward County 2000 Safe Parks and Land Preservation Bond Program. The pavilion will be dedicated on Monday, April 6th at 7 PM. The public is invited to attend.

Homeowners to soon see lower trash rates

Homeowners will soon see a decrease in the solid waste rates they pay per month to have their trash picked up and hauled away.

Contract negotiations were still underway at press time, but Town staff estimated that single-family homeowners will see a rate reduction of about \$10 per month. That amounts to about \$120 per year.

The lower rate is the result of the **Town Commission** seeking competitive bids for trash removal. Five firms, including **Waste Management**, which now picks up trash in Town, submitted competing bids to the Town to provide trash service.

After reviewing and rating the bids, the Commission selected **Choice Environmental Services**, which received the lowest average ranking score from the Commission. Choice Environmental's clients include the **City of Fort Lauderdale** and the **Miami-Dade School Board**. The Commission directed the Town Manager to negotiate a contract with Choice Environmental.

If an agreement can't be reached, the manager would then negotiate a contract with the waste firms that were ranked second and third. □

Town seeking \$450,000 in federal funds for projects

The **Town of Lauderdale-By-The-Sea** is seeking \$450,000 in federal funds this year for two projects:

- Stormwater outfall rehabilitation.
- State Road A1A landscaping and beautification.

The Town was hoping the funds could come from the billions of federal dollars being allocated under the economic stimulus program adopted earlier this year by **Congress**.

Because the projects are not "shovel ready," **Town Manager Esther Colon** said the \$450,000 will be sought through the congressional appropriations process.

Colon said **Congressman Ron Klein's** office has agreed to help the Town seek funding for these two capital improvement projects, which would greatly help the Town.

The Town is seeking \$200,000 to make safety and landscaping improvements for existing pedestrian walkways along the north

section of State Road A1A in Town.

The Town is also seeking \$250,000 to restore or replace some stormwater drains and outfalls in the old part of Town, which are failing because of age.

The Town applied for \$3.1 million in stimulus funds for sewers in the Palm Club, but public stimulus funds were rejected for this "shovel ready" project because the Palm Club is on private property. □

nies base their insurance premiums on banded ISO ranges, such as 1 to 3 or 4 to 7. He said it's quite possible for next door neighbors with different insurance companies to have different insurance premiums based on the same ISO rating.

"There's no way to know," Bain said. "Every company develops their premiums on their own."

Generally speaking, he said, if a community's rating improves from a 4 to a 3, a homeowner should see a reduction in their fire protection insurance premiums.

ISO is reviewing the VFD, which took over providing fire protection in Town from **Broward Sheriff Fire Rescue** in October 2008.

The Town's ISO rating of 4 dates back to when the VFD provided service to the Town prior to annexation of the North Beach area in 2001. BSO Fire Rescue was never evaluated by ISO when it provided service to the Town.

Bain said ISO is still reviewing the VFD.

"We're still working on it," he said. "We're getting there."


He said ISO has specific requirements for all fire departments nationwide.

"As you meet those requirements, you get points," Bain said. "We don't give out anything (to communities). You earn it."

Mike Morash, an ISO field representative who is evaluating the VFD with Bain, said a number of communities around the country have switched from paid to volunteer fire departments. Morash also said ISO only distinguishes a volunteer from a paid firefighter if there are no personnel assigned 24 hours a day to the station, which the VFD does. Bain said volunteers must receive the same training as professional firefighters.

"When we get into training, the needs are the same," he said. □

ISO RATINGS NATIONWIDE



ISO CHART: Presented during a PowerPoint presentation made by the Insurance Service Organization in Jarvis Hall in March, the chart above shows that the largest percentage (35) of fire departments nationwide receive an ISO rating of 9 (on 1 to 10 scale with 1 being the best rating). Many communities with 9 ratings are in rural parts of the country, where water supplies to fight fires are very often poor.

ISO EVALUATION CRITERIA

The **Insurance Service Organization** uses well-defined criteria to review a community's firefighting capabilities. It evaluates three major fire-protection elements:

Fire-alarm & communications

Ten percent of a community's assessment is based on how well the fire department receives fire alarms and dispatches its firefighting resources.

Fire department

Fifty percent of the assessment is based on the fire-protection capabilities of the fire department. ISO reviews the distribution of fire companies throughout the area and checks that the fire departments test their hoses, pumpers and aerial apparatus regularly. ISO inventories nozzles, hoses, breathing apparatus and

other equipment. ISO also reviews fire company records to determine the:

- Type and extent of training provided to fire personnel.
- Number of firefighters who participate in training.
- On-duty & volunteer firefighter response to emergencies.
- Maintenance and testing of the fire department's equipment.

Water supply

Forty percent of the assessment is based on water supply. ISO reviews whether the community has a sufficient water supply for fire suppression beyond maximum daily consumption.

ISO surveys all components of the water-supply system, including pumps, storage and filtration. ISO also evaluates the total distribution and maintenance of fire hydrants.

Town is once again recognized by the GFOA for excellent financial reporting

The **Town of Lauderdale-By-The-Sea** has again received a **Certificate of Achievement** for “**Excellence in Financial Reporting**” from the **Government Finance Officers Association**, a professional association representing more than 17,000 state and municipal finance officers in the **U.S.** and **Canada**.

The Town and its **Finance Department** has now received this prestigious international award for **12 consecutive years**.

A plaque was presented to the Town during a Town Commission meeting in January by **Allan Owens**, a South Florida GFOA official.

Owens said the award recognizes Town staff for its “professionalism, commitment” and “high degree of dedication” to excellence in financial reporting.

The GFOA’s Excellence in Financial Reporting Program encourages cities and towns to go well beyond the minimum requirements of generally-accepted accounting principles and prepare comprehensive annual financial reports that reflect transparency and full public disclosure.

Town receives high marks from auditor on its financial strength

In recent remarks to the **Town Commission**, **Rachlin LLP**, the Town’s auditor, said the **Town of Lauderdale-By-The-Sea** ranks among the top cities the Florida firm audits in terms of financial strength.

Jerry Chiocca, a partner with Rachlin, gave the Town a **9.5** ranking out of **10**.

He then later told the Commission that he would never

award any city a perfect score.

Out of the 25 or so cities Rachlin audits in South Florida, he said he would rank only three at the top.

He said Lauderdale-By-The-Sea has dealt very well with the recent downturn in the nation’s economy.

Rachlin is one of the largest independent accounting and advisory firms in the southeast. *Accounting Today* ranked it among the top 100 National Accounting Firms. □

Water conservation tips for businesses

Here are some tips for businesses and residents to help conserve water and reduce stormwater runoff:

- Avoid stormwater runoff onto all sidewalks, driveways or gutters.
- Look for indications of water need, such as wilt, change of color or dry soils.
- Do not water landscape every day. Only water when needed. If water restrictions are in effect, adapt your watering schedule accordingly.
- Avoid plant fertilizing and pruning that would stimulate excessive growth.
- Remove weeds and unhealthy plants so the plants you want benefit.
- In many cases, older, established plants require only infrequent irrigation.
- Install soil moisture overrides or timers on sprinkler systems.
- Irrigate in the early morning or evening, when evaporation is lowest.
- Investigate the advantages of installing drip irrigation systems.
- Mulch around plants to reduce evaporation and discourage weeds.
- Remove thatch and aerate turf to encourage the movement of water to the root zone.
- Do not water on windy days.
- Wash autos, buses, and trucks less often.
- Don't use water to clean sidewalks, driveways, loading docks and parking lots.
- Consider using brooms or motorized sweepers.
