Town Commission approves East Commercial design project

The **Town Commission** approved the schematic design for the **East Commercial Streetscape Project**, which will transform the commercial district east of **State Road A1A** into an inviting, pedestrian-friendly public space with wider sidewalks, attractive plazas, shade trees and a clear vista to the **Atlantic Ocean**.

Construction is expected to begin after the 2013 tourist season.

The streetscape project includes many ideas promulgated in the Town's 2004 **Master Plan**, which recommended a pedestrian-only plaza on **Commercial Boulevard** east of A1A. The plan adopted by the Town is a compromise that addressed parking access needs raised by **Anglin's Pier** and **Aruba Beach Café**.

During public comments on the project at the Commission's June 19 special meeting, some downtown business owners reiterated their concerns that relocating parking spaces from those two blocks to the Town's A1A parking lot would impact local businesses.

Several residents urged the Commission to move the project forward, saying other neighboring cities were in the process of rejuvenating their beachfronts and the Town's businesses would suffer if the project was not done.

Resident **Patrick Murphy** compared the Town to an aging American eagle, which, to survive another 30 years, must undergo a painful process of change that involves tearing out its old beak, growing a new one, and developing new talons and feathers as it undergoes a life-saving rebirth to extend its life.

"I ask you tonight, on your all important vote, to seek and see this opportunity as an eagle views its life," Murphy said. "Vote yes for the future of Lauderdale-By-The-Sea."

East of El Mar Drive

The streetscape project eliminates parking on Commercial Boulevard east of El Mar Drive, but still allows vehicle traffic to accommodate customers needing access to the pier and Aruba's.

A colorful blue and white plaza will be built immediately to the west of the beach pavilion, expanding that beachside place that become an increasingly popular venue since it was built in April 2009.

A second and slightly raised plaza, located just east of El Mar Drive, will have seating benches, mosaic tiles and a terrazzo stage made of crushed shell aggregate.

The **Anglin Memorial** and the memorial bricks will be preserved and moved to another location within the project area.

PROJECT UPDATES

Here is an update on **Town** projects:

Bougainville Drive

The **Town** will include landscaping on the public right-of-way when it adds drainage to Bougainville Drive. Some residents supported new trees while others did not.

Flooding on **Bougainville Drive** north of Commercial has been a long-standing problem that will be addressed by this project.

The Town held a community meeting in **Jarvis Hall** in March with property owners on Bougainville to present preliminary conceptual designs for the project. Residents said they did not want to lose any parking spots.

West Commercial

The proposed streetscape design for **West Commercial**

Boulevard between Seagrape Drive and the **Intracoastal Waterway** is expected to come back before the **Town Commission** in July.

The capital improvement project will widen sidewalks in front of the businesses, slow down traffic along Commercial; it will also add trees and other landscaping to make the street more attractive for pedestrians and shoppers.

Harbor Drive

The **Harbor Drive Drainage Project** is basically completed. The Town must wait 30 days, however, before thermoplastic striping can then be applied to the street.

The project has improved drainage and mitigated street flooding on Harbor Drive.

West of El Mar

In the second block of Commercial, the median will be removed to allow for wider sidewalks and more café dining. Large shade trees will also be added. The parking scheme will change from angled to parallel. The eastbound access from A1A

will be reduced to one lane. The westbound lane will maintain its current two lanes.

Drainage will be upgraded and power lines from a large concrete pole will be buried underground.

The intersection at Commercial and A1A will be upgraded with improved crosswalks and traffic signaling. □

Beach nourishment project could possibly start in November 2013

Broward County plans to widen the beach from the **Pompano Beach** pier to about **Sunrise Boulevard**. Under the project proposed, the Town beaches would receive additional sand from our north border south to the Ocean Colony condo, and from just south of **Anglin's Pier** to the Town's southern boundary.

The beach restoration occurring in **Lauderdale-by-the-Sea** would be tapered and the Town would be expected to contribute financially to the cost of the project.

The County asked the Town to participate in the project. After multiple discussions and several presentations by County staff, the **Town Commission** supported the Town's participation in Broward's beach nourishment project with the following conditions:

- The Town's costs will not exceed \$356,000, the cost based on the proportionate volume of sand placed on our beach compared to the sand volume placed on the other beaches.

- The Town will reimburse the County for its \$356,000 cost over a period of three years.

- The Town must approve any staging sites in the Town.

- Broward County must repair any damage done to our roads and portals in connection with the project during the construction.

Unlike past nourishment projects, where sand was dredged from offshore and pumped onto the beach, the County is considering trucking in sand from Central Florida. The County has indicated it would likely want to use the **Palm Avenue Portal** at the south end of **El Mar Drive** as an access point to dump and spread sand from south of Anglin's Pier and along the northern section of the

Galt Ocean Mile.

Eric Myers, the Natural Resources Administrator with **Broward County Environmental Protection and Growth Management Department**, said the County is submitting permit applications to the **U.S. Army Corps of Engineers** and the **Florida Department of Environmental Protection**.

He said the earliest construction could begin is late in 2013. However, if there is any unexpected delay in the permitting or county contracting process — or if environmentalists challenge the project in court claiming it will harm nearby coral reefs — construction could be delayed.

Because of turtle nesting protection issues, Myers reported that the work can only be done outside of turtle nesting season, which means it can only be done from **Nov. 1 to Feb. 28**.

The issue will come back to the **Commission** for a formal vote on an **interlocal agreement** with the County regarding the terms of the Town's participation.

Town grants awarded to Bel Air, Tropic Drive, Hibiscus & Allenwood for area improvements

The **Town Commission** recently approved two **\$30,000 Neighborhood Improvement Grants** for two community projects.

One grant for the current fiscal year will go to the **Bel Air Civic Association** for building gated entrances to the neighborhood at **Coral Reef Drive** and **Bel Air Drive**. The two gates would be similar to the one recently constructed at the entranceway to **Terra Mar Island**.

Residents said the gates would discourage unwanted traffic in the neighborhood, help reduce crime and slow down speeding vehicles.

The project was submitted to the **Town** by the Bel Air Civic Association, which represents 89 of the 222 households in the neighborhood. The association has said it would also pay for maintaining the gates, insurance costs and any project expenses that exceed the \$30,000 grant limit.

Residents who live in the **Hibiscus Avenue, Allenwood Drive** and **Tropic Drive** neighborhood will receive a grant next fiscal year to undertake a neighborhood beautification project that would add a variety of palm trees, including **Sylvester, Manila, Pindo** and **Foxtail** palms, along the three Town roadways. **Silk Floss** trees and colorful **Royal Poincianas** would also be planted.

The residents were receptive to the Town's suggestion that a swale restoration project be done in conjunction with the landscaping project.

The swale restoration work should help reduce flooding which occurs in the neighborhood after heavy rains. The Town will pay for the swale restoration. □

Sewer rate hearing scheduled for Aug. 21st

A public hearing on proposed changes in sewer rates for customers in the **south part of the Town** will be held in **Jarvis Hall** on **Tuesday, Aug. 21** at **7PM**. **Only residents and businesses who are located on Pine Avenue and south of there will be affected by the changes.** The public is invited to attend the hearing and speak.

The proposed changes are the result of an analysis of the current rate structure after feedback was received from residents about the cost increases experienced by hotels and multi-family buildings after the Town adopted the rate structure in 2011.

In 2011, the Town adopted the same rates that **Pompano Beach** was charging residents in the north part of Town. Pompano's rate methodology was a big change from our prior methodology and had a harsher impact on some categories of customers than on others. Multi-family units and hotels saw large billing increases while single-family homes and restaurants saw moderate increases.

As a result, the Town hired **Burton & Associates**, a company that specializes in analyzing and devising utility rates, to develop a rate structure that fairly apportions the costs of our sewer system to the various categories of customers.

Burton looked at the relative proportion of water use by the three categories of users — single family, multi-family, and commercial customers. (Why water use when we are talking about sewer rates? Because we have no measure of the exact amount of sewage a building or home produces, but we do know how much water they use. There is a relationship between amount of water used and the amount of sewage produced.)

Burton developed a rate

structure that allocated the cost of the Town's sewer operation and capital costs to the three categories of users (single-family homes, multi-family homes, and commercial properties) in similar proportion to the amount of water they used.

They also built into the rate structure a new monthly cost to cover the billing and collection costs (**\$1.31 per month per account**) and lowered the fixed monthly cost for each single-family home and each multi-family unit. Under the proposed rate structure, a bigger portion of the bill will be based on the volume charge — that is the amount you pay based on every 1,000 gallons of water you use — than in the current and prior rates paid by Lauderdale-by-the-Sea customers. The volume charge for single-family and multi-family homes will continue to stop once they use 10,000 gallons each month, as it is assumed water consumption over 10,000 gallons is going into your landscaping or pool.

Some people have asked why isn't the entire bill based on the volume of water I use? Burton's response was that there are certain fixed costs that the Town has, whether each customer produces wastewater or not. If the rate was strictly based on water usage volume, the snowbirds — and Lauderdale-By-The-Sea has a lot of them — would not be paying their

fair share of the costs.

Commercial users will have a different rate structure because Burton found that the usage varied so dramatically from one commercial customer to another that it wasn't possible to create a one size fits all fixed rate for this category of customers. So commercial customers will pay the same \$1.31 monthly fee for billing and collections as residential customers, and another monthly fixed fee based on the size of their water meter.

The Town selected a rate structure from the several options Burton proposed that would reduce the Town's total sewer revenues 10 percent for the next several years. This was possible because a recent engineering study of the sewer infrastructure, completed and presented to the Commission in January, revealed it is in much better shape than expected for a system of its age and the Town has sufficient funds to make the repairs needed over the next several years.

The proposed new rates (**see chart on Page 9**) call for establishing a customer service/administrative charge of \$1.31 per bill for all customers. The usage charge for all customers would be **\$5.13**. The base charge for multi-family would be **\$4.23**. The base facility charge for single-family and commercial customers would be **\$10.26**.


Commercial properties would be billed based on the size of the meter. A restaurant with a 2-inch meter would be considered to have eight units, so it would be charged 8 x \$10.26 monthly as its fixed charge.

The result will be that some customers' bills will go up; some will go down. You will need to look at your past bills for several months to determine the impact it will have on your family or business. □


