## Town's fire safety rating remains the same, but expected to improve

The Town's **Insurance Services Office** ranking for fire protection did not change this year following an extensive evaluation of the **Volunteer Fire Department**, which began providing fire service protection to the Town on Oct. 1st.

The Town's ranking remained a **Class 4**, which was the VFD's prior ranking before **Broward Fire Rescue** took over fire protection in 2006. Class 1 is the highest ranking a community can receive. Class 10 is ISO's lowest rating.

The Class 4 ranking is expected to improve to Class 3 in the near future, since the Class 4 ranking did not take into account the following factors:

- A fourth fire truck recently purchased by the VFD.
- A new awning for VFD fire trucks parked outside the station.
- BSO Fire Rescue data on fire hydrant testing prior to Oct. 1, 2008.

**Fire Chief Robert Perkins** said he plans to ask ISO to re-evaluate the VFD in light of the new equipment and the recently-obtained updated info.

The VFD received **69.49** points in its ISO evaluation, a Class 4 ranking (and just .51 points from a higher Class 3 ranking). Since the Town only has

## Town transition to new solid waste collection hauler scheduled for July

The **Town** is transitioning this summer to a new solid waste collector as it switches from **Waste Management** to **Choice Environmental Services** of Fort Lauderdale.

Choice Environmental trucks and personnel will begin picking up trash at **single-family homes, businesses, condos and multi-family**

**units** starting on **July 1st**.

The **pick-up days** for single-family residents, multi-family units, condominiums and businesses **remains the same**, as do the days recycling bins are picked up.

Residents will receive new 96-gallon containers from Choice Environmental in late June. The switch is scheduled to take place from **June 23rd to June 26th**. Each of the 96-gallon containers will have a serial number printed on the side.

Choice Environmental will also be replacing Waste Management dumpsters with its own at condos and businesses in Town. If you dump your trash in a dumpster, please let Choice Environmental know how many times per week you want your trash hauled away.

Choice Environmental said it has sent representatives by condos and businesses to get this information.

As of right now, there will be no change in the recycling containers single-family residents use, but that could change by the end of the year, because Broward County is in the process of switching to a single-stream recycling system.

If the Town and County can reach

## LOWER RATES

### SINGLE-FAMILY COSTS

The waste collection rate for single-family homeowners **drops** in July from **\$27.62** per month under Waste Management to **\$17.92** for Choice Environmental.

### DUPLEX COSTS

The waste collection rate for duplex residential **drops** in July from **\$39.03** per month for both units under Waste Management to **\$35.84** for both units under Choice Environmental Services.

### MULTI-FAMILY CONDO

The waste collection rate for multi-family condos **drops** in July from **\$24.48** per month for Waste Management to **\$18.37** under Choice Environmental.

an agreement, residents would be provided with a new cart for all their recyclable materials. A number of cities in **Miami-Dade** and **Palm Beach** counties have already switched to this simpler system.

Under the contract reached between the Town and Choice Environmental, single-family homeowners will see a **\$9.70 per month reduction** in their monthly bills. This will amount to a total savings of **\$116 per year**.

The lower rate is the result of the Town Commission seeking competitive bids for trash removal for the first time in several years. Five firms submitted competing bids. After reviewing and rating the bids, the Commission selected Choice Environmental Services, which received the lowest average ranking score from the Commission. □

to gain slightly more than half a point to bump it up to the next highest category, "I think we can get a Class 3 ranking," Perkins said.

A community's ISO ranking, which reflects ISO's fire risk evaluation, affects the fire insurance premiums companies charge to homeowners and businesses.

Of the 47,648 fire departments ranked nationwide by ISO in 2008, VFD's Class 4 ranking was better than 40,772 other communities.

ISO officials say it is difficult to know precisely how a change in a community's rating will affect a homeowner's insurance premiums, since some companies base their insurance premiums on banded ISO ranges, such as 1 to 3 or 4 to 7. It's quite possible for next door neighbors with different insurance companies to have different insurance premiums based on the same ISO rating. If the Town's ranking ISO

improves from a Class 4 to Class 3, insurance premiums should decline.

ISO uses well-defined criteria to review a community's firefighting capabilities. Ten percent of a community's assessment is based on how well the fire department receives fire alarms and dispatches its firefighting resources.

Fifty percent of the assessment is based on the fire-protection capabilities of the fire department. Forty percent of the assessment is based on water supply.

Perkins said the VFD was hurt by low points for training because it could only supply training records dating back to Oct. 1, when the VFD took over for BSO.

"ISO goes by year," Perkins said. "The training records we had were there, but they weren't enough. We just took over and they only went back a few months."

Perkins said the VFD continues to train personnel twice per week.

"We're doing everything we can," he said. □

# Scenic highway designation would bring grant dollars

## National Flood Insurance Program protects homeowners

Congress created the **National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP)** to provide affordable flood insurance to people in areas with the greatest risk of flooding — **Special Flood Hazard Areas (SFHAs)**. The NFIP makes federally-backed flood insurance available in cities that adopt and enforce floodplain management ordinances to reduce potential flood damage. This is important since property owners who hold a federally-backed mortgage must buy flood insurance if their property is within the SFHA.

The **Community Rating System (CRS)** was developed by the **Federal Insurance Administration** to provide incentives for NFIP communities that implement more stringent floodplain standards than the minimum requirements. The CRS rewards these efforts with discounts on flood insurance premiums.


The **Town of Lauderdale-By-The-Sea** holds a **Class 8 CRS** rating, which equates to a 10 percent discount on new or renewing flood insurance policies for all SFHA properties and a 5 percent discount on policies for non-SFHA properties.

In our Town, about 1,800 flood insurance policies are in effect. The Town's Class 8 rating annually generates \$40,000 in flood premium savings. Since flooding is the most common natural disaster, it is critical to get maximum protection.

You can purchase flood insurance whether you reside in high, moderate or low risk areas. There is no exclusion as to what type of ownership you represent (i.e., homeowner, renter or business owner).

If it has been determined your property lies within a flood hazard area, the important information on the following pages may be of interest to you.

Please refer to this information in the event of an impending hurricane, tropical storm or warning of projected heavy rainfall.

During extended heavy rainfall, low-lying areas in the Town may flood. This info will help you protect your property and reduce potential flooding losses.

**FLOODING** (continued from Page 1)

The Town provides Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) determinations to let you know if you are in a flood hazard area and are required by federal law to carry flood insurance.

To see if your property is in the Special Flood Hazard Zone (AE or VE zones), call 954-776-3611.

**FLOOD WARNING SYSTEM**

The Town and **Broward County** depend on the **National Weather Service** for flood warning notification. Flood advisories are issued at least six hours prior to expected heavy rainfall that could cause drainage systems to overflow and create inland ponding of flood waters and the isolation of residential/business areas. Listen to the radio for updates.

**FLOOD SAFETY**

When ordered to evacuate, turn off utilities at the main switches or valves. Disconnect electrical appliances, but **DO NOT** touch any electrical equipment if you are wet or standing in water. Avoid fast flowing water or unstable banks.

**FLOOD INSURANCE**

Most mortgage lenders require flood insurance based on the elevation of the property. In the event your mortgage does not have this provision — or if you own your property free and clear — you can purchase this insurance at any time. Remember:

There is a 30-day waiting period before the policy becomes effective. Homeowner's insurance and/or windstorm insurance does not cover flood damage.

Because the Town is an NFIP community, flood insurance is available to protect all homes, condominiums, apartments and nonresidential buildings, including commercial structures.

You are eligible for flood insur-

ance, regardless of whether your property has never flooded or has flooded several times in the past. All properties secured by a federally-backed mortgage (FHA, VA, FNMA, etc.) must carry flood insurance.

**PERMIT REQUIREMENTS**

All buildings under construction require permits, which should be obtained prior to the start of construction. Contact **Planning and Zoning Services** before you build, alter, regrade or place fill on your property. Planning Services is at 4509 Ocean Drive (the trailer just north of Jarvis Hall). If you see

building or filling without a Town permit posted, please call Planning & Zoning at 954-776-3611.

**IMPROVEMENT REQUIREMENTS**

The Town and the National Flood Insurance Program require that if the cost of reconstruction, rehabilitation, additions — or other improvements to a building equals or exceeds 50 percent of the building's market value — the building must meet the same construction requirements as a new building. This includes the lowest floor elevations. Substantially damaged buildings must also be brought up to the same standards.

**DRAINAGE MAINTENANCE**

Proper drainage helps reduce the risk of flooding. It is illegal for any

direct or indirect entry of any solid, liquid or gaseous matter to enter the drainage system and waterways.

The Town inspects the drainage system and removes blockages that are found or reported. If you live near areas where waters flow, you can help in this process by keeping the catch basins clear of debris.

Reports of any violations should be made to the Town's **Municipal Services Department** at 954-776-5119.

**FLOOD HAZARD**

All of the property east of the Coastal Construction Line and on or

near the **Intracoastal Waterway** — or on or near connecting canals — are in the Special Flood Hazard Area. Your property may be high enough so that you do not experience flooding. However, this may change. **Hurricane Andrew** (1992) — South Florida's most devastating storm — was not as wet compared to **Hurricane Irene** (1999) and the "No Name" storm of October 2000, both of

which caused unprecedented residential property damage.

**ELEVATION CERTIFICATES**

Elevation Certificates for new construction and substantially improved properties are kept at **Planning & Zoning** and are available by calling 954-776-3611.

**SITE VISITS**

A Municipal Services representative will visit to review flooding problems and explain ways to alleviate and prevent flood damage.

Also, if you experience any flooding, drainage, sewer backup problems — or witness illegal dumping in canals or storm drains — please call the Town at 954-776-0576. □

# Make plans to protect your pets in a hurricane

During a flood or hurricane, evacuation centers in Broward County will not accept pets. That's why it's so important to make plans in advance to keep your pets in an animal kennel or with friends.

## Plan ahead

Talk to a friend or family member who lives in an area that is not expected to be affected by the hurricane. Ask if their home would be open to you and your pet should a storm threaten South Florida.

## Be responsible

Do not leave your pet at home during a hurricane. A secure room and a few day's worth of food and

water do not necessarily mean safety for your pet. Many people returned home after **Hurricane Andrew** to find their pets missing.

Keep a current picture of your pet to help identify it.

## After the storm

Be careful about allowing your pets outdoors after the storm has passed. Familiar scents and landmarks will be altered and your pet may become confused or lost. Downed power lines also present real dangers to animals.

Take precautions to ensure your pet does not consume food or water that has become contaminated. □

## SECURE YOUR BOAT

If you own a boat, it is your responsibility to secure it. As a boat owner, you should make plans in advance to move your boat or arrange for its storage. Check with local marinas for suitable alternatives. If possible, store the boat inside a garage or warehouse. If you must leave your boat outside, attach the trailer tongue to some-

thing firm in the ground, let the air out of the tires and ensure the boat is secured to the trailer.



If possible, fill the bilge with water, which adds extra weight. If you must keep your boat in the canal, be sure to double the dock lines, leaving sufficient space for the tidal range. Also put out extra anchors. Don't forget to remove all marine electronics or other unsecured equipment. Remove self-furling sails and Bimini tops.

Boats on davits should be secured with extra tie lines and in such a manner as to keep the boat from swinging during the storm's high winds. □

## BROWARD COUNTY SHELTERS

When you are ordered to evacuate, try to move to the house of a friend or family member not affected by the impending storm and high waters.

Go over evacuation plans with all household members. Plan to leave early to avoid any traffic delays. If you will need assistance to evacuate, you must pre-register with a **Broward County Special Needs Shelter** at **954-537-2888**. TDD-Teletype device for the deaf: **954-537-2882**.

Discuss these plans with your neighbors. If you have to evacuate, inform each other of places where you will be staying and leave contact phone numbers and addresses. Know the locations of local **American Red Cross Regional Hurricane Shelters**.



## Flood protection tips to help protect your home

Before you evacuate your home after a **Hurricane Warning** is issued, here are several property protection measures you can take:

- Keep materials (sandbags, plywood, plastic sheeting and lumber) on to protect your house from flood waters to make quick repairs after a severe storm.
- Secure your home before leaving. Bring outdoor belongings such as garbage cans, garden equipment and furniture inside the house or tie them down securely. Move essential items and furniture to the upper floors and lock doors and windows.
- Board up windows or protect them with storm shutters.
- Stack sandbags away from the house walls to prevent flood waters from reaching your home.
- For info on retrofitting or flood-proofing your structure to reduce the impact of flooding, call **Municipal Services** at **954-776-5119**.

The following outlines measures to minimize damage to a structure:

- If your lot is large enough, you should consider regrading it or building a small floodwall. You can also place watertight closures over the doorways. However, these approaches only protect if flooding is not too deep. You can also consider elevating your home.
- Flood-proofing, installing floodgates and making walls waterproof are among the common ways to structurally protect commercial property. Most times, residential structures are elevated higher than the anticipated floodwaters. For additional assistance on how to protect your property from flooding, contact Municipal Services at 954-776-5119. But there are some things you can do.

Don't throw or dump anything into storm sewers or canals. Even grass clippings and branches can accumulate and plug canals and drains. A plugged canal or storm drain cannot carry water when it rains. Clogged storm drains will cause water to back up into the street. Every piece of trash contributes to flooding.

If your property is next to a canal, help keep the banks clear of brush and debris. The Town's canal maintenance program removes major blockages such as downed trees.

Did you know that floods are the most common natural disaster?

Here are a few safety tips to consider, if you ever experience flooding.

— Do not walk through flowing water or drive through a flooded area. Drowning is the number one cause of flood related deaths. Currents can be deceptive. Six

inches of moving water can knock you off your feet. If you walk in standing water, use a pole or stick to make sure the ground is still there. Also, do not disregard road barriers; the road or bridge may be washed out.

Stay away from power lines and electrical wires. Electrocutation is the No. 2 flood killer. Electrical currents can travel through water. To report downed power lines, call **911**. The **Broward Sheriff's Office** will report downed power lines to **Florida Power & Light**.

Have your electricity turned off by FPL. Some appliances, such as TV sets, hold electrical charges even after they are unplugged. Avoid using appliances or motors which are wet unless they have been taken apart, cleaned and dried.

Be ready for the unexpected. Place important documents inside plastic bags or other waterproof containers. Review your insurance policies to ensure they provide adequate coverage. Know what type of coverage you have. Homeowner's insurance and/or windstorm insurance does not cover flood damage. Any policy change usually takes 30 days before going into effect.

Look out for animals and snakes. Small animals flooded out of their homes may seek shelter in your's. Use a pole or stick to poke and turn things over to scare away small critters.

Look before you step. After a flood, the ground and floors are covered with debris, including broken bottles and nails. Floors and stairs covered with mud can be very slippery.

Be alert for gas leaks. If you use natural gas, use a flashlight to inspect for damage. Don't smoke or use candles, lanterns or open flames unless you know the gas is turned off and the area is ventilated. **☠**
