MEET THE MAYOR

Mayor Roseann Minnet now has regular office hours in Town Hall to meet with any Town resident about issues important to them. The Mayor will be in Town Hall from 9 AM to 11 AM on the second Tuesday of the month.

DEPARTMENT RELOCATES

The Development Services Department relocated in May to the office previously occupied by the Broward Sheriff's Office (adjacent to Town Hall), which moved into the Town's new Public Safety Complex. Development Services is no longer in the trailer.

NEW TOWN MANAGER

The Town Commission in May appointed former Fort Lauderdale City Manager Connie Hoffmann as the Town's Interim Town Manager. Hoffmann then hired Bud Bentley as Interim Assistant Town Manager.

The Commission met in late May to discuss hiring a new permanent Town Manager. The Commission plans to develop a position profile for the type of individual it wants to hire for the permanent position.

The Commission said it plans to study City and Town Manager salaries in other Florida communities of similar size before deciding on a final compensation range and benefits package it will offer.

Hop aboard the Pelican Hopper shuttle and meet the Town's Mayor

To help increase ridership and awareness about the **Pelican Hopper** — the Town's free community shuttle service — **Mayor Roseann Minnet** isn't taking a back seat to anyone.

And if you happened to be among the passengers who used the Pelican Hopper on the morning of Tuesday, May 25th, yes, that was indeed the Mayor on the Pelican Hopper sitting right across the aisle from you.

If more people don't ride the Pelican Hopper this summer, the Town is in danger of losing its annual \$59,000 grant from **Broward County Transit** to operate the shuttle.

"I would hate to see us lose this for the community," Mayor Minnet said.

The Mayor plans to again ride the shuttle on the **fourth Tuesday of the month** from **9 AM to 11 AM** in **June, July and August**. In addition to getting feedback from riders about how the service can be improved, the Mayor will also meet with residents about any Town issue concerning them.

The Pelican Hopper is a vital transportation service for Town residents, including many senior citizens, tourists and people without cars. You can

not only connect to the community shuttles in nearby Fort Lauderdale and Pompano Beach, it's also a very convenient way to get to **Holy Cross Hospital** in Fort Lauderdale.

The Town is sponsoring a promotional contest this summer (see flier on Page 7) to encourage people to tell their neighbors about the shuttle.

The Mayor's first ride on the Pelican Hopper was on May 25th. She hopped aboard the shuttle at 9 AM at Town Hall and talked with riders for two hours as the shuttle traveled to Holy Cross, **Galt Ocean Mile** and **Terra Mar Island**.

"Thank you for riding the Pelican Hopper," Mayor Minnet said to Town resident **Elena Kucheryava**, who boarded the shuttle at Publix on her way to Holy Cross Hospital.

Pelican Hopper "everywhere," including the bank and Publix.

The Pelican Hopper's oldest rider that day was **Esperia Dessi**, 101, of Fort Lauderdale, who got on the shuttle at Galt Ocean Mile.

"I depend on the bus," she said.

When asked where she takes the

Pelican Hopper, she said, "Where he goes, I go," referring to **Dennis Royes**, the Pelican Hopper's driver.

"Please keep this going," said Fort Lauderdale resident **Janet Lopez**, a regular Pelican Hopper shuttle rider who works in Lauderdale-By-The-Sea. □

KEY PELICAN HOPPER INFO

The clean and air-conditioned Pelican Hopper community shuttle bus, which makes its first stop at Publix Supermarket, takes about 45 minutes to make a complete run.

From Publix the shuttle heads south on Bougainvillea and then west on Commercial to Holy Cross Hospital in Fort Lauderdale. It then heads back to Town before heading down to Galt Ocean Mile and later up to Terra Mar Island before returning again to Publix to start another route.

The shuttle, which operates from 9 AM to 5:25 PM Monday thru Friday, travels around Town with various assigned stops, including

three locations connecting with the Fort Lauderdale Galt/North Beach Community Bus. The bus also operates Saturday from 10 AM to 7:55 PM, and Sunday from 8 AM to 6 PM.

The shuttle travels as far north as Terra Mar Drive and as far south as Northeast 32nd Street in Fort Lauderdale. At Galt Ocean Mile riders can transfer to Broward County Transit buses. You can also transfer to the Pompano Beach community shuttle at the stop on Terra Mar Island.

The shuttle is wheelchair accessible

in accordance with provisions under the **Americans with Disabilities Act**. The shuttle is also equipped with a bike rack.

WHAT FLORIDIANS SHOULD KNOW ABOUT REPORTING OIL

Report evidence of oil by calling the State Warning Point at 1-877-2-SAVE-FL (1-877-272-8335), or by dialing #DEP from a cell phone.

- Impacts reported to the State Warning Point will be investigated by reconnaissance teams of trained individuals for verification. When verified, a Shoreline Cleanup and Assessment Technique (SCAT) team will be deployed.
- Oil on Florida's coastline will most likely be in the form of tar balls, oil sheen, tar patches or mats.
- The following photos* are meant to help people when calling the State Warning Point.



Tar Balls: Pliable, globules of weathered oil, ranging from mostly oil to highly emulsified with varying amount of debris and/or sediment. Tar balls may vary in size from millimeters to 20-30 centimeters across.



Tar Patches: An oil configuration or "structure" that reflects a broad range of shapes and dimensions. Numerous tar balls could combine to form a patch; oil of various colors and consistency could form a patch or single layer 10s of cm to 10s (or even 100s) of meters in diameter. Patches of oily debris, barely able to float with sediment/plants in them, might be called "tar mats."



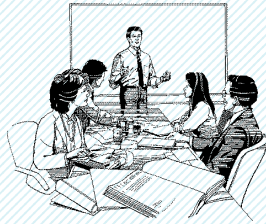
Oil Sheen: When fresh oil spreads out on the water surface, it eventually becomes sheen, a very thin layer of oil floating on the water surface. Sheens can vary greatly in color. In regards to the Deepwater Horizon incident, the thinnest sheens are nearly transparent, and the thickest are dull brown in color.

National Flood Insurance Program protects homeowners

Congress created the **National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP)** to provide affordable flood insurance to people in areas with the greatest risk of flooding — **Special Flood Hazard Areas (SFHAs)**. The NFIP makes federally-backed flood insurance available in cities that adopt and enforce floodplain management ordinances to reduce potential flood damage. This is important since property owners who hold a federally-backed mortgage must buy flood insurance if their property is within the SFHA.

The **Community Rating System (CRS)** was developed by the **Federal Insurance Administration** to provide incentives for NFIP communities that implement more stringent floodplain standards than the minimum requirements. The CRS rewards these efforts with discounts on flood insurance premiums.

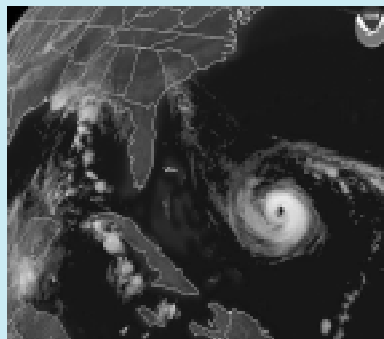
The **Town of Lauderdale-By-The-Sea** holds a **Class 8** CRS rating, which equates to a 10 percent discount on new or renewing flood insurance policies for all SFHA properties and a 5 percent discount on policies for non-SFHA properties.

In our Town, about 1,510 flood insurance policies are in effect. The Town's Class 8 rating annually generates \$30,000 in flood premium savings. Since flooding is the most common natural disaster, it is critical to get adequate protection.

You can purchase flood insurance whether you reside in high, moderate or low risk areas. There is no exclusion as to what type of ownership you represent (i.e., homeowner, renter or business owner).

If it has been determined your property lies within a flood hazard area, the important information on the following pages may be of interest to you.

Please refer to this information in the event of an impending hurricane, tropical storm or warning of projected heavy rainfall.

During extended heavy rainfall, low-lying areas in the Town may flood. This info will help you protect your property and reduce potential flooding losses.

The Town provides Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) determinations to let you know if you are in a flood hazard area and are required by federal law to carry flood insurance.

To see if your property is in the Special Flood Hazard Zone (AE or VE zones), call 954-776-3611.

FLOOD WARNING SYSTEM

The Town and **Broward County** depend on the **National Weather Service** for flood warning notification. Flood advisories are issued at least six hours prior to expected heavy rainfall that could cause drainage systems to overflow and create inland ponding of flood waters and the isolation of residential/business areas. Listen to the radio for updates.

FLOOD SAFETY

When ordered to evacuate, turn off utilities at the main switches or valves. Disconnect electrical appliances, but **DO NOT** touch any electrical equipment if you are wet or standing in water. Avoid fast flowing water or unstable banks.

FLOOD INSURANCE

Most mortgage lenders require flood insurance based on the elevation of the property. In the event your mortgage does not have this provision — or if you own your property free and clear — you can purchase this insurance at any time. Remember:

There is a 30-day waiting period before the policy becomes effective. Homeowner's insurance and/or windstorm insurance does not cover flood damage.

Because the Town is an NFIP community, flood insurance is available to protect all homes, condominiums, apartments and nonresidential buildings, including commercial structures.

You are eligible for flood insur-

ance, regardless of whether your property has never flooded or has flooded several times in the past. All properties secured by a federally-backed mortgage (FHA, VA, FNMA, etc.) must carry flood insurance.

IMPROVEMENT REQUIREMENTS

The Town and the National Flood Insurance Program require that if the cost of reconstruction, rehabilitation, additions — or other improvements to a building equals or exceeds 50 percent of the building's market value — the building must meet the same construction requirements as a new building. This includes the

lowest floor elevations. Substantially damaged buildings must also be brought up to the same standards.

PERMIT REQUIREMENTS

All buildings under construction require permits, which should be obtained prior to the start of construction. Contact **Planning and Zoning Services** before you build, alter, regrade or place fill on your property. Planning Services is at 4501 Ocean Drive (the building adjacent to Town Hall). If you see building or filling without a Town permit posted, please call Planning & Zoning at 954-776-3611.

DRAINAGE MAINTENANCE

Proper drainage helps reduce the risk of flooding. It is illegal for any

direct or indirect entry of any solid, liquid or gaseous matter to enter the drainage system and waterways.

The Town inspects the drainage system and removes blockages that are found or reported. If you live near areas where waters flow, you can help in this process by keeping the catch basins clear of debris.

Reports of any violations should be made to the Town's **Municipal Services Department** at 954-776-5119.

FLOOD HAZARD

All of the property east of the Coastal Construction Line on or near the **Intracoastal Waterway** — or on or near connecting canals — are in the Special Flood Hazard Area. Your property may be high enough so that you do not experience flooding. However, this may change. **Hurricane Andrew** (1992) — South Florida's most devastating storm — was not as wet compared to **Hurricane Irene** (1999) and the "No Name" storm of October 2000, both of

which caused unprecedented residential property damage.

ELEVATION CERTIFICATES

Elevation Certificates for new construction and substantially improved properties are kept at **Planning & Zoning** and are available by calling 954-776-3611.

SITE VISITS

A Municipal Services representative will visit to review flooding problems and explain ways to alleviate and prevent flood damage.

Also, if you experience any flooding, drainage, sewer backup problems — or witness illegal dumping in canals or storm drains — please call the Town at 954-776-0576. □

Make plans to protect your pets in a hurricane

During a flood or hurricane, evacuation centers in Broward County will not accept pets. That's why it's so important to make plans in advance to keep your pets in an animal kennel or with friends.

Plan ahead

Talk to a friend or family member who lives in an area that is not expected to be affected by the hurricane. Ask if their home would be open to you and your pet should a storm threaten South Florida.

Be responsible

Do not leave your pet at home during a hurricane. A secure room and a few day's worth of food and

water do not necessarily mean safety for your pet. Many people returned home after **Hurricane Andrew** to find their pets missing.

Keep a current picture of your pet to help identify it.

After the storm

Be careful about allowing your pets outdoors after the storm has passed. Familiar scents and landmarks will be altered and your pet may become confused or lost. Downed power lines also present real dangers to animals.

Take precautions to ensure your pet does not consume food or water that has become contaminated. □

PET-FRIENDLY SHELTER

There is a pet-friendly hurricane shelter in Broward County. However, you must first register your pet ahead of time with the **Humane Society of Broward County**.

SECURE YOUR BOAT

If you own a boat, it is your responsibility to secure it. As a boat owner, you should make plans in advance to move your boat or arrange for its storage. Check with local marinas for suitable alternatives. If possible, store the boat inside a garage or warehouse. If you must leave your boat outside, attach the trailer tongue to some-

thing firm in the ground, let the air out of the tires and ensure the boat is secured to the trailer.



If possible, fill the bilge with water, which adds extra weight. If you must keep your boat in the canal, be sure to double the dock lines, leaving sufficient space for the tidal range. Also put out extra anchors. Don't forget to remove all marine electronics or other unsecured equipment. Remove self-furling sails and Bimini tops.

Boats on davits should be secured with extra tie lines and in such a manner as to keep the boat from swinging during the storm's high winds. □

BROWARD COUNTY SHELTERS

When you are ordered to evacuate, try to move to the house of a friend or family member not affected by the impending storm and high waters.

Go over evacuation plans with all household members. Plan to leave early to avoid any traffic delays. If you will need assistance to evacuate, you must pre-register with a **Broward County Special Needs Shelter** at **954-537-2888**. TDD-Teletype device for the deaf: **954-537-2882**.

Discuss these plans with your neighbors. Inform them of places where you will be staying and leave contact numbers and addresses. Know the locations of local **American Red Cross Regional Hurricane Shelters**. There are 14 Broward schools designated as official shelters:

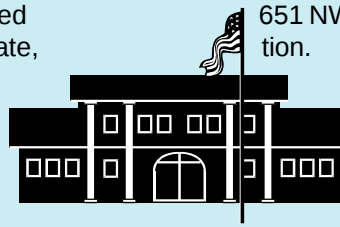

Flood protection tips to help protect your home

Before you evacuate your home after a **Hurricane Warning** is issued, here are several property protection measures you can take:

- Keep materials (sandbags, plywood, plastic sheeting and lumber) on hand to protect your house from flood waters to make quick repairs after a severe storm.
- Secure your home before leaving. Bring outdoor belongings such as garbage cans, garden equipment and furniture inside the house or tie them down securely. Move essential items and furniture to the upper floors and lock doors and windows.
- Board up windows or protect them with storm shutters.
- Stack sandbags away from the house walls to prevent flood waters from reaching your home.
- For info on retrofitting or flood-proofing your structure to reduce the impact of flooding, call **Municipal Services** at **954-776-5119**.

The following outlines measures to minimize damage to a structure:

- If your lot is large enough, you should consider regrading it or building a small floodwall. You can also place watertight closures over the doorways. However, these approaches only protect if flooding is not too deep. You can also consider elevating your home.
- Flood-proofing, installing floodgates and making walls waterproof are among the common ways to structurally protect commercial property. Most times, residential structures are elevated higher than the anticipated floodwaters. For additional assistance on how to protect your property from flooding, contact Municipal Services at 954-776-5119. Additional information on how to perform residential retrofitting or commercial flood proofing is also available at the **Broward County Main Library**, 100 S. Andrews Ave., Fort Lauderdale.

Here are some things you can do to help:

— Don't throw or dump anything into storm sewers or canals. Even grass clippings and branches can accumulate and plug canals and drains. A plugged canal or storm drain cannot carry water when it rains. Clogged storm drains will cause water to back up into the street. Every piece of trash contributes to flooding.

— If your property is next to a canal, help keep the banks clear of brush and debris. The Town's canal maintenance program removes major blockages such as downed trees.

Did you know that floods are the most common natural disaster?

Here are a few safety tips to consider, if you ever experience flooding.

— Do not walk through flowing water or drive through a flooded area. Drowning is the number one cause of flood-related deaths. Currents can be deceptive. Six

inches of moving water can knock you off your feet. If you walk in standing water, use a pole or stick to make sure the ground is still there. Also, do not disregard road barriers; the road or bridge may be washed out.

Stay away from power lines and electrical wires. Electrocutation is the No. 2 flood killer. Electrical currents can travel through water. To report downed power lines, call **911**. The **Broward Sheriff's Office** will report downed power lines to **Florida Power & Light**.

Have your electricity turned off by FPL. Some appliances, such as TV sets, hold electrical charges even after they are unplugged. Avoid using appliances or motors which are wet unless they have been taken apart, cleaned and dried.

Be ready for the unexpected. Place important documents inside plastic bags or other waterproof containers. Review your insurance policies to ensure they provide adequate coverage. Know what type of coverage you have. Homeowner's insurance and/or windstorm insurance does not cover flood damage. Any policy change usually takes 30 days before going into effect.

Look out for animals and snakes. Small animals flooded out of their homes may seek shelter in your's. Use a pole or stick to poke and turn things over to scare away small critters.

Look before you step. After a flood, the ground and floors are covered with debris, including broken bottles and nails. Floors and stairs covered with mud can be very slippery.

Be alert for gas leaks. If you use natural gas, use a flashlight to inspect for damage. Don't smoke or use candles, lanterns or open flames unless you know the gas is turned off and the area is ventilated.
