Town Commission adopts annual budget

The **Town Commission** maintained the current tax rate of **\$3.5989** per thousand dollars of assessed property value on **Sept. 26th** when it adopted the Town's annual budget, a financial blueprint for the coming year.

Your Town property taxes, which fund police, emergency medical and other key government services, accounts for about 20 percent of your ad valorem tax assessment. The lion's share of your tax bill goes to **Broward County** and the **Broward School District**.



Lauderdale-By-The-Sea's \$3.5989 property tax rate is the **third lowest among all cities in Broward**, which means you pay less property taxes to the Town than you would if you owned property with a similar taxable value in 28 other cities in Broward.

By maintaining the \$3.5989 tax rate, the Town will raise an additional \$323,000 in revenue, which all goes to the Town's **Capital Improvement Fund**.

The Town calculated the impact of maintaining the same tax rate on property owners. The median tax increase for single-family homeowners with a **Homestead** exemption will be **\$27 for the year**, or **\$2.25** per month. The median tax increase for condo owners with a Homestead exemption will be **\$23 per year**, or **\$1.91** per month.

The Town's residential fire fee, which is the lowest in Broward, will remain at **\$129.85**.

Upcoming workshop on curtailing iguanas

The **Town** will host a **Florida Fish and Wildlife** workshop at **6PM** on **Thursday, Nov. 29th** on how to help remove iguanas from your property. The workshop is in **Jarvis Hall, 4505 N. Ocean Drive** (next to **Town Hall**).



Town residents are encouraged to arrive early as seating is limited.

Biologists will discuss iguana regulations, effective deterrent techniques and trapping.

Residents who attend will be able to interact with fish and game officials through demonstrations and hands-on training.

Household Hazardous Waste and Electronics Drop-Off Dates

The **Town of Lauderdale-By-The-Sea** has partnered with several nearby cities to offer residents free access to dispose of household hazardous waste and electronics.

The participating cities are Pompano Beach, Tamarac, Coral Springs, Coconut Creek, Coral Springs, Fort Lauderdale, Lauderdale Lakes, North Lauderdale and Tamarac.

The Drop-Off events are held on the first Saturday of the month at alternating locations from **9AM to 2PM**.

Town residents must show proof of residency, such as a Drivers License, state-issued identification card, vehicle registration or utility bill.

Solid Waste Collection rates for residential cart service increased Oct. 1st

The **Town of Lauderdale-By-The-Sea's** rates for the collection of all municipal solid waste increased by 2 percent on **Oct. 1**.



■ The new rate for cart collection service at single-family homes and duplexes increased **31 cents** from **\$15.69** to **\$16**.

■ The new rate for multi-family dwellings increased by **32 cents** from **\$16.02** to **\$16.34**.

Dumpster rates

The 2 percent increase also applies to dumpster and compactor collection rates in Town.

Even with this small rate increase, the Town's residential collection rates are still among the lowest in **Broward**.

Town Code regulates neighborhood vacation home rentals

One sure way to tell it is season in South Florida is by the number of people vacationing here in **Lauderdale-By-The-Sea**. And while we are happy to host their vacation, having this transient use encroach into our neighborhoods isn't always easy for long-



term residents. Recognizing this, the **Town Commission** adopted transient rental regulations to support a peaceful co-existence between our visitors and our residents.

In 2009, the Town Commission established rules for the use of transient homes (single-family houses and townhomes), otherwise known as Vacation Rentals. This

new classification was established to protect the quality and character of our residential districts.

The popularity of transient rentals has continued to grow, and soon became common at 2, 3, and 4 unit properties as well.

Responding to this, the Commission added additional regulations on these multi-family properties in 2017.

The Town classifies these multi-family transient rentals as **Short Term Rentals** to differentiate them from single-family homes and townhomes, which are classified as **Vacation Rentals**.

These regulations are found in **Section 30-327** of our **Town Code**, which can be accessed on our Town website at www.lbts-fl.gov.

Before a single-family home or townhome is offered as a

How To Contact Code

The **Town's Code Inspectors** are responsible for ensuring that all properties in the Town, including transient rentals, follow our regulations.

Since there are only two inspectors for the entire Town, that is no small task. If you live near a transient rental property with tenants who are not being good neighbors, please contact the Code Office as soon as possible. Here's how:

■ Call Code at **954-640-4210** from **7AM to 3PM Monday through Saturday**. You can also send an e-mail to code@lbts-fl.gov.

■ After hours (**3PM to 7AM**) or at any time on Sundays, contact the **Broward Sheriff's Office** non-emergency dispatch office at **954-764-4357**.

■ Call **911** immediately for crimes in progress.

■ Take photos with the date and time of the incident if you are willing to testify before the Town's **Special Magistrate** (code enforcement judge).

Vacation Rental, a Vacation Rental certificate is required.

To obtain one, the property owner must agree to follow these rules:

- Register the vacation rental property with the Town;
- Rent, and offer to rent, the property for no less than a 7-day minimum stay;
- The maximum number of persons allowed is property-specific, based on the number of bedrooms and square footage. However, no more than 10 is allowed;
- Assign a vacation rental agent who is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week to handle any problems arising from the vacation rental use; and
- Submit to annual inspections for compliance with zoning, building, housing, density, life/safety and fire code regulations.

The regulations on Short Term rentals (2, 3, and 4 unit homes) are similar. Short Term rental regulations were adopted in 2017 after the **State of Florida** preempted cities from setting a minimum stay. Because of this, the Town is not allowed to regulate the length of stay at 2, 3 and 4 unit homes.

Annual Town parking permits available for residents

The **Town's Resident Parking Permit Program** allows drivers to park in any metered or designated resident parking permit space for up to three hours.



The cost is **\$53** for residents 65 or older, and **\$63.60** for residents under the age of 65.

The annual parking permit is good from **Oct. 1st** through **Sept. 30th**. To be eligible for the parking permit, residents must live in Town or be an annual renter.

Permits are only available at **Town Hall, 4501 N. Ocean Drive**. When applying for a permit, please bring your Drivers License and a valid vehicle registration. If you rent, please also bring your apartment, home or condo rental agreement.

If you own property, the Town will verify that by checking the **Broward Property Appraiser's** website.

If you have any questions about the parking permit program, please call **Town Hall** at **954-640-4200**.

Veterans Day event is Nov. 11th in El Prado Park

The event, which is free and open to the public, is at **10AM** at **El Prado Park, 4500 El Mar Drive**. The small park is on the ocean directly east of **Town Hall, 4501**

N. Ocean Drive. The ceremony will move inside to **Jarvis Hall** if it rains.

The Town's fourth annual Veterans Day ceremony will include the **Broward Sheriff's Office Honor Guard** and the **Volunteer Fire Department's Color Guard**.

The keynote speaker is **Bob Kuntz** (see photo at left), the past commander of the **Gold Coast Chapter of Disabled American Veterans** in Pompano



Beach. He is a retired **U.S. Navy** pilot and currently

serves as his chapter's chaplain and service officer.

The DAV is dedicated to helping disabled veterans lead "high-quality lives with respect and dignity" by ensuring that they and their families can access the full range of benefits

available to them through the **Department of Veterans Affairs** and other key government agencies.

As part of the day's events, a ceremonial wreath will be tossed into the ocean. There will also be refreshments.

PUBLIC SAFETY

Town crime rate declines

Crime in **Lauderdale-By-The-Sea** decreased by **4.3 percent** in 2017, according to the FBI's annual **Uniform Crime Reporting** program.

Among all cities in Broward County, the Town had the 13th largest decline in crime. Overall, 18 other nearby jurisdictions reported crime increases from 2016 to 2017.

According to the **Broward Sheriff's Office**, which provides police service to the Town, our crime rate compares favorably with other Broward cities. We had the sixth lowest crime rate in the county, behind Weston, Parkland, Hillsboro Beach, Cooper City, Miramar and Margate. The Town also had the third lowest number of total crimes behind Sea Ranch Lakes and Hillsboro Beach.

Compared to similar towns in Florida, our crime rate was lower than Atlantic Beach, Neptune Beach, Cocoa Beach, Fernandina Beach and St. Petersburg Beach.

Our crime statistics are based on our annual population of 6,175 residents. Even though our seasonal population almost doubles, that is not reflected in the crime rate.

EMS & VDF Response Times

The **Town of Lauderdale-By-The-Sea's** fire and emergency medical response times are much better than the accepted national standards.

American Medical Response's average response time per EMS call is **3.5 minutes**. According to the **National EMS Information System**, the national average is 9.3 minutes. The Town's contract with AMR calls for paramedic units to respond to 90 percent of our calls within 6 minutes.

Fire Department

The **Lauderdale-By-The-Sea Volunteer Fire Department's** average response time for the past year was **4.5 minutes**.

Response time is measured from the time the call is dispatched to arrival on the scene.

The **National Fire Protection Association** says the national standard for volunteer fire departments is 9 minutes. Since response time is so significant to saving lives and minimizing fire damage, Town residents should be pleased with the response time of both the VFD and AMR.
