Bright beach lights can harm sea turtle hatchlings

With the March 1 start of Florida's annual sea turtle season behind us — but with the peak summer nesting months (June and July) still to come — beachfront condo and business owners are asked to do their part to help protect **threatened loggerhead sea turtles**.

Lights shining directly onto the beach from parking lots, buildings and even individual condo units can cause serious orientation problems when the tiny sea turtle hatchlings emerge at night from their sandy nests.

To help raise awareness, the Town was the host for a Florida sea turtle lighting seminar in mid-February, which was attended by about a dozen residents, business owners, Town staff members and **Mayor Roseann Minnet**.

State and Broward sea turtle experts said lighting measures can be implemented to not only help sea turtles, but also provide enough light to keep beach areas from becoming unsafe for people.

Each turtle nest takes about 50 days to hatch. When this happens, about 100 hatchlings scurry toward the ocean.

If bright artificial lights shine onto the beach, however, the sea turtle hatchlings often become disoriented and will crawl in the wrong direction.

Even the hatchlings that reach the ocean face long odds to survive. It is estimated that only one in 1,000 to 10,000 hatchlings ever reach adulthood.

Broward County, which operates a sea turtle conservation program through Nova Southeastern University, has several helpful recommendations.

If you observe an adult sea turtle or hatchling, please adhere

HOW YOU CAN HELP

- Keep lights in your condo from shining onto the beach by closing your drapes or blinds.

- Other beachfront lights in parking lots or on buildings must be shielded or turned off at night from sunset to sunrise (from March 1 to Oct. 31).

- As much as possible, refrain from walking on the beach at night from April through August. No matter how quiet, humans will often, and unknowingly, frighten nesting sea turtles back into the sea.

- If you happen to come across a **sea turtle hatching** crawling towards the road or a parking lot,

you can take the following steps:

- Call the **Broward Sea Turtle Hotline at 954-328-0580**.

- If you do not remember the hotline number, pick up the hatchling and take it to the water's edge. Make sure the beach is dark. Let the turtle crawl from the beach to the ocean.

- If there are numerous hatchlings, put them in a dry bucket before taking them to the water's edge on a darkened area of the beach. It is important to let them crawl along the sand before they reach the water.

to the following rules and guidelines:

- It is normal for sea turtles to crawl on the beach at night. Do not report normal crawling or nesting activity to the **Sea Turtle Hotline at 954-328-0580**. Please only call if the turtle is in danger.

- Stay away from crawling or

nesting sea turtles. Nesting is a critical stage in the sea turtle's life cycle. Please leave them undisturbed.

- Please report all stranded (dead, injured or apparently healthy) turtles to the hotline. Report all sea turtles that have not moved for 30 minutes or longer. □

Filling out the Census will help the Town

Now that most people in **Lauderdale-By-The-Sea** have received their **2010 Census Form** in the mail, it is time to fill it out and send it back.

According to a survey by the **Pew Research Center**, 10 percent of U.S. residents said they weren't sure if they would take part in the census. The main reason? Respondents said they saw little to gain personally from answering the questionnaire.

The information obtained from the census forms is vital to the **Town** because government uses the data to determine where to allocate hundreds of billions of tax dollars.

A recent **Brookings Institution** study found that an accurate census count can increase the flow of federal money to states and localities for more than 200 government programs, including health care for the poor, local highways, public safety, transportation and schools.

It is especially significant this year because the **Obama Administration's** economic stimulus program will pump even more money into states and communities based on Census results, boosting the total to be distributed from **\$400 billion** to more than **\$500 billion**. It will be important that Lauderdale-By-The-Sea gets its fair share.

The loss in funding for government services for just one uncounted person in **Broward County** was estimated at **\$1,300** by the **2000 Census Monitoring Board**. Nearly **20,000** Broward County residents were uncounted in 2000, resulting in an estimated loss in funding of **\$26 million**.

Here's are five reasons why everyone should participate:

1. It's safe. By law, the Census Bureau cannot share respondents' answers with anyone, including the IRS, FBI, CIA, INS or any other government agency. All Census Bureau employees are sworn for life to protect the confidentiality of the data. The penalty for unlawful disclosure is a fine of up to \$250,000 and/or five years in prison.

2. It's easy. The mail-in census form has only 10 questions and should take 10 minutes to answer. Those who don't return the form will be visited by a census taker. Avoid the hassle and fill out the form.

3. It helps you and your community. The information the census collects helps determine how more than \$500 billion dollars of annual federal funding will be spent on hospitals, job training centers, schools, bridges and roads.

4. It saves tax money. For every 1 percent increase in mail response, the government — and ultimately the taxpayers — save \$80 to \$90 million. Ultimately, that could amount to \$1.5 billion.

5. It helps your voice be heard. Census data are also used to determine representation in the federal and state legislatures. Under-counting leads to under-representation.

Now is the time to fill out your form and send it back. Please remember: **We can't move forward until you mail it back.**
