Town welcomes tourist-friendly B-cycle program



The Town of Lauderdale-By-The-Sea became the latest beachfront community in Broward County to join B-cycle, a tourist-friendly program that residents can also enjoy.

The Town's solar-powered B-cycle station was installed in the northeast corner of the **State Road A1A Parking Lot** in March. The station can hold up to 10 bicycles.

Using a credit card, riders pay a one-time fee of \$5 plus .50 cents for the first 30 minutes of each ride.

After the first 30 minutes, the fee is \$3 for each additional half-hour.

Bikes can be returned to any of the 27 local stations in Broward County, including those in **Fort Lauderdale, Hollywood and Pompano Beach.**

The blue bicycles come equipped with a small basket, bell, chain guard, lock and a GPS unit to track mileage. A device on the bike can also tell you how many calories you burned during your ride.

Bikesharing offers Town residents and visitors an alternative mode of public transportation that is not only good for your health, but also environmentally-friendly and very affordable.

Marketing helps Town businesses survive and compete

To better promote **Lauderdale-By-The-Sea** to tourists, the Town is working with the **Lauderdale By-The-Sea Chamber of Commerce** and the **Greater Fort Lauderdale Convention and Visitors Bureau** to promote two exciting events this summer aimed at two distinct markets: families and scuba divers.

The Town's marketing goals can be summed up in one word: put, as in put 'heads in beds' and put Lauderdale-By-The-Sea on the map!

With that in mind, Town hotels, retailers and restaurants created a new event – **Family Fun Week (June 23 – 30)**. Its purpose: Bring families here and give them a wide variety of entertainment options.

Hotels, restaurants and merchants are offering family discounts. Families staying at participating hotels receive a Family Fun Week card good for free and discounted meals, activities and merchandise.

As a co-sponsor, the Town is providing a free concert and movies in **Friedt Family Park**, a sea turtle walk, an arts and craft event and sand castle contest. Merchants are offering discounted dancing, skimboarding lessons, family gourmet cooking classes, yoga, jewelry parties and many other activities.

Family Fun Week is a joint venture between the Town, the Chamber of Commerce and individual hotels and retailers, which are contributing to our marketing costs.

Marketing for the event has included working with the CVB to target the best demographics for our print and online advertising. The CVB has provided its expertise for our media buys and ad placement.

In February, the first event promoted by the Town was **Festival By-The-Sea**, which included the Chamber's **Taste of the Beach** fund-raiser, a skimboarding competition and three other weekly events.

Tourists are vital to the Town's economy. They help keep many Town residents employed by staying in our hotels and inns, shopping in our stores and dining in our restau-

rants. Tourists not only pay state sales taxes while here, but bed taxes help the CVB promote South Florida to people around the world.

One of several members on the ad hoc marketing committee formed to promote the Town is **Chamber President Mark Silver**, the owner of **Argenti Designer Jewelers**. He said it's great to see the Chamber and the Town focusing on moving Lauderdale-By-The-Sea forward.

"We want to make the Town better," he said. "It's going to be great for all of us once we get this going."

This summer's diving event is centered around catching "bugs," the term divers use for Florida's spiny lobster. **Bug Fest By-The-Sea (July 24-28)** features contests, music, a pier clean-up, underwater photo contest, lobster bake and Iron Chef Lobster Competition with **Lenore Nolan-Ryan**.

Bug Fest will include a seminar on how to catch lobster. A **Broward Sheriff's Office** deputy who will also stress dive safety, protecting the environment and following Florida's lobster regulations. Bug Fest By-The-Sea has also scheduled a beach diving and dive refresher clinic for scuba divers.

Lauderdale-By-The-Sea moving forward

The **Town of Lauderdale-By-The-Sea** has undertaken an ambitious schedule of capital projects this year. Some are just starting while others are done or about to begin. Here is an update on six key projects:

SRA1A Beautification

The streetscape and landscape improvements on **State Road A1A** from **Pine Avenue** north to **Terra**

1 **Mar Drive** were completed in late March. The project, which began in September 2011, is expected to come in **more than \$25,000 under budget!** The initial cost estimate was \$652,000; two-thirds of the project was paid for with federal funds. In addition to trees, decorative sidewalk pavers, seat walls and wooden benches, small, decorative monuments featuring pelicans were also added.

Flamingo Avenue Drainage

The **Flamingo Avenue Drainage Project** at the south end of Town was completed in February! The total cost to design and install a new exfiltration system was

2 \$148,000, \$500 less than budgeted. This project was identified as a top priority drainage project last year, and the need for it was further demonstrated by the heavy rainfall in November which caused significant flooding and damage in the parking garage, first floor utility rooms and elevator shafts at the **Fountainhead Condominium**.

The Town negotiated a cost-sharing agreement on this project with the adjacent **Plaza East Condominium** in Fort Lauderdale, since water runoff from its property contributes significantly to the water flow to this street. Plaza East has agreed to pay 55 percent of the \$112,000 in construction costs.

Commercial Boulevard (A1A east to the pavilion)

The project that will have perhaps **3** the greatest visual impact on Town is the redesign of the public spaces in the very heart of



the Town — from the intersection at Commercial and State Road A1A east to the **Beach Pavilion**.

The design concept prepared by **Jaime Correa & Associates** was approved by the **Town Commission** in February after many meetings, discussions and revisions to accommodate input from downtown business owners, calls for making the two block stretch much more pedestrian-friendly. The project will expand views of the ocean and public gathering spaces. It calls for much wider and tree-shaded sidewalks, room for sidewalk dining, unencumbered views to the sea, and two plazas. The plans also include new signalization and crosswalks to improve pedestrian safety at A1A and Commercial.

Some of the ideas contained in this revitalization project were present in **Master Plans** dating back many years. Enthusiasm for improvements to the streetscape in this area of Town was evident in last year's Master Plan update discussions, the walk-around with **David Sucher**, author of *City Comforts*, and the **University of Miami School of Architecture's** community design workshops where residents and business owners

provided valuable ideas for the streetscape in this area. One aspect of concern in the design concept is the reduction of parking spaces in the two eastern-most blocks of Commercial. The Town Commission weighed the advantages of improved public spaces and the widened sidewalks with the convenient parking issue, and directed staff to reconfigure the layout of the **A1A parking lot** to add more parking spaces and come back with options to add street parking elsewhere to offset the loss of spaces on Commercial.

The **Anglin's Square** project is expected to breathe new life into the heart of our beachfront commercial district. The anticipated cost is \$2 million; the Town has the funds for construction budgeted.

The designers are now working on a more detailed design for the project and have their marching orders to ensure the project maintains the unique characteristics of Lauderdale-By-The-Sea. The public will have additional chances to voice their opinions as the more detailed designs come back to the Commission later this Spring. The project is not expected to be constructed until after the 2013 tourist season. □

Harbor Drive Drainage

In the Town's ongoing efforts to alleviate problem flood areas throughout the community, especially after heavy rainfalls, work on the **Harbor Drive Drainage Project** is expected to begin in late **April** or early **May**.

The **Town Commission** awarded the construction contract in late March for \$330,000, which was \$22,000 less than had been originally anticipated by the Town's engineer.

The capital improvement project will improve drainage and mitigate street flooding along Harbor Drive from **Seagrape Drive** west to **West Tradewinds**. □

Bougainvilla Drive Drainage & Streetscape (Town Hall to Pine)

Flooding on **Bougainvilla Drive** just south of **Pine Avenue** has been a long-standing problem that will be addressed by this project.

4 Right now, Bougainvilla is a broad swath of asphalt with almost no landscaping.

Since the road will be torn up for drainage, the Town asked the design team to also provide plans to beautify the street. The Town set aside \$800,000 for this project in the budget. The predominance of 90 degree angle back-out parking makes beautification a challenge.

The Town held a community meeting in **Jarvis Hall** in March with property owners on Bougainvilla to present preliminary conceptual designs for landscaping. Both conceptual designs affect the parking configuration, and include a decorative intersection at Bougainvilla Drive and **Washingtonia Avenue**.

Residents supported efforts to alleviate the flooding that occurs after big rainstorms but urged the Town to retain as much parking as possible, which the Town has agreed to do. Discussions with property owners will continue. □

Shield lights during sea turtle nesting season

Sea turtle nesting season (March 1 — Oct. 31) is underway and beachfront residents and business owners are reminded to remember shield their lights.


Under the **Town's ordinance**, beachfront property and condo owners must switch off exterior lights that illuminate the beach and close draperies to shield interior lights.

Please be aware when walking along **El Mar Drive** at night that the Town has shielded or turned off street lights that can be seen from the beach, which makes the roadway much darker.

When turtle nests hatch, the hatchlings are often disoriented by artificial lights and will crawl towards the lights instead of the ocean. By

keeping your blinds drawn, you give the turtles a better chance to survive.

Loggerhead sea turtles, a threatened species, may lay four to five nests per season; each nest contains about 110 eggs. In 2011 there were **2,126** loggerhead nests deposited on our beaches here in Broward. Peak turtle nesting season is in **June and July**.



If you see a large turtle coming ashore, please observe from a distance and avoid the urge to get closer. For more info, call the **Broward County Sea Turtle Conservation Program** at **954-519-1255**.

Boulevard, were hired to design the Commercial Boulevard streetscape from the **Intracoastal** east to **Seagrape Drive**.

An open meeting attended by 20 business owners and residents was held on **March 21** in **Jarvis Hall** to review two preliminary concept designs, which includes the Town parking lots on the north and south sides of the road.

Both design concepts will slow down traffic, make the roadway more appealing and, hopefully, entice drivers and pedestrians to shop, dine and do business here. The project includes widening the sidewalks in front of the shops on the north and south part of the road.

The **Town Commission** initially reviewed these concepts on **March 27th** after a detailed **PowerPoint** presentation was made to commissioners and the public.

Beach Widening Project

The **Town Commission** held a special meeting in March on the issue of beach renourishment.

Broward County is proposing to widen the Town's beaches at the north and south end of our shoreline.



The Town's concerns about the project include the disruption to tourists and residents during construction, the cost of the project

and the negative impact it would have on the Town's **coral reefs**.

The Commission is waiting for the County to address several of its questions before making a final decision. The County has said the Town's beaches are in good shape, but that the Town's portion of the beach widening project in the south is important to **Galt Ocean Mile in Fort Lauderdale**.

Election Districts

The **Town** is considering contracting with **Florida Atlantic University** to re-draw its north and south election districts. The Town is required by charter to identify and designate northern and southern election districts in 2012. Even though members of the **Commission** are elected by all voters, Commission candidates must reside in certain districts in order to qualify.

Since the Town's population only increased by about 200 people after the **2010 U.S. Census**, the Town has asked FAU to first determine if it is even necessary to re-draw the districts at this time.

Fire Engine

The **Town** has agreed to buy a new fire truck this year for **\$325,000** to help upgrade the **Volunteer Fire Department's** firefighting capability. The truck will be delivered in about six months.

The VFD established a committee to evaluate the types of trucks available and the costs. The truck's price was determined to be competitive. Funds for the purchase came from the Town's **Fire Fund Account**.
