**Town's tax rate among lowest in Broward**

The **Town of Lauderdale-By-The-Sea** has the **third lowest property tax rate** among Broward's 31 municipalities, and the **second lowest Fire Assessment fee**.

Lauderdale-By-The-Sea's \$3.6873 tax rate is also lower than our closest municipal neighbors. The **Village of Sea Ranch Lakes'** tax rate is \$7.5000, which ranked No. 25. **Pompano Beach** is ranked No. 10 with a rate of \$5.3252. **Fort Lauderdale** ranked No. 6 with a \$4.2803 tax rate.

The Town's residential Fire Assessment Fee of \$129.85 is the second lowest in Broward County. **Lighthouse Point** is the only community with a lower fire fee.

One of the Town's key strategic goals, which we are surpassing, is to keep our millage rate and Fire Assessment Fee in the lowest quartile of all the cities in Broward County.

Unlike a number of other cities, the Town has no debt.

**Town urges everyone not to release balloons**

The **Town of Lauderdale-By-The-Sea** urges everyone not to release balloons or throw away plastic that could end up in the ocean, where the debris can harm or kill sea turtles, other marine animals and birds.



More than 100 million marine animals are killed worldwide each year due to plastic debris, according to the **Sea Turtle Conservancy**. Sea turtles sometimes mistake balloons and plastic bags for jellyfish, a staple in their normal diet.

There is an estimated 100 million tons of plastic floating in oceans around the world. Eighty percent of the plastic debris comes from land, washing out to sea from our beaches, roads, parking lots

and nearby highways. Plastic bags, bottles, balloons, packaging materials and food wrappers all contribute to the problem.

The **Town** recently modified its **Special Event Permit Application** to discourage people from releasing helium or air balloons. **Florida state law** also prohibits the release of 10 or more helium balloons.

The **Town of Lauderdale-By-The-Sea** has undergone many changes since it was first incorporated in 1927 (after reverting to the county, the Town reincorporated in 1947).

One of the biggest changes was the construction of the **Commercial Boulevard Bridge** in 1965.

Many residents were opposed to the state project, fearing it would bring more traffic. They were right.

In an article in the 1966 Town Directory about the hiring of new **Police Chief John Hovey**, the Town's 2,300 full-time residents welcomed the chief to his new position. The next sentence states: "It will be interesting to see if anything can be done to alleviate a presently impossible traffic problem, with the opening of the traffic from Commercial Boulevard Bridge into the narrow roads of the Town."

## El Mar Greenway Project moves into design phase

The **Florida Department of Transportation's Greenway Project** to transform **El Mar Drive** into a more pedestrian-and bike-friendly roadway is moving into the design phase.

The state has already approved funds to design the project and is now seeking bidders.

Before those design plans are approved, however, public hearings will be held where Town residents can voice their opinions about the design proposals.

The **Town Commission** wants residents to tell it what they think about FDOT's designs, which will be based on comments people made at public hearings back in 2014.

The dates for the hearings will be publicized in **Town Topics**, the Town website, **Comcast Channel 78** and **U-Verse Channel 99**.

Based on public hearings held in 2014, there was a consensus that the El Mar Greenway should be a walkway, preferably meandering, with benches, trees, and lighting located in the existing median (except in the downtown area where the median is not wide enough to accommodate it because of the parking spaces on either side).

The FDOT said drainage will be part of the project.

### TRANSPORTATION WORKSHOP

The Town Commission will hold a workshop on townwide transportation issues at 6PM on Tuesday, May 2. This is not about the El Mar Drive project per se, although residents are free to ask any questions about any transportation issues.

Residents also warmed to the idea of reducing traffic to one broad lane in each direction at just the north and south ends of El Mar Drive to create more attractive public spaces at the main entrances to the Town's signature seaside street. At the upcoming workshops to review FDOT's designs, residents can discuss paving, landscaping, street lighting, street furniture and lane widths, etc.

After a final design is selected and an estimate of the construction cost is better known, the **Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO)** will need to approve construction funds.

The Town will also contribute funds for the project. The MPO is a county transportation planning agency that makes key decisions about the expenditure of federal and state funds to support a regional transportation system to enhance the environmental and economic well-being of the entire community.

## SEE OATS BY THE SEASHORE


