Town expects Bel Air sewer project to start in September

The Town's newest **Capital Improvement Project** — installing sanitary sewers in **Bel Air** — is expected to begin in early **September**. The \$5.3 million project will take eight months to complete.

The **Town Commission** this year awarded the contract to **Man-Con Inc.**, a Fort Lauderdale firm that submitted the lowest responsible bid to the Town. Man-Con installed sewers for the Town on **Terra Mar Island**.

The **North Beach Neighborhood Improvements** project contract calls for the installation of sanitary sewers, landscaping and re-paving Bel Air's streets.

At the same time that sewers are being installed, the **City of Pompano Beach** will be replacing water lines in Bel Air. Pompano Beach provides water and sewer service to the north part of Town.

Town wins national budget award for ninth consecutive year

For the ninth consecutive year, the **Town of Lauderdale-By-The-Sea** has received the **Distinguished Budget Presentation Award** from the **Government Finance Officers Association**, a professional association representing nearly 17,000 state and municipal finance officers in the United States and Canada.

The GFOA's Distinguished Budget Presentation Award Program encourages governments to prepare budget documents of the highest quality to meet the needs of decision-makers and citizens. The Distinguished Budget Presentation Awards Program, established in 1984, is the only national awards program in governmental budgeting.

The Town's ninth award was presented to **Town Manager Esther Colon** at the July 10th **Town Commission** meeting for her work in preparing the 2006-07 budget. Colon was the Town's **Finance Director** prior to recently taking over as Town Manager.

"The award represents a significant achievement," said **Stephen Gauthier**, a GFOA spokesman. "It reflects the commitment of the governing body and staff to meeting the highest principles of governmental budgeting."

"These guidelines are designed to assess how well a city's budget serves as a policy document, a financial plan, an operations guideline and a communications device. Budget documents must be rated proficient in all four categories to receive the award." □

New parking lot has 69 spaces

The **Town's** new parking lot has 69 spaces, which includes three handicapped spots. The Town built it after purchasing a single-family home and adjacent motel, which demolished to make room for the new facility.

With **Anglin's Pier**, the beach, a coral reef just offshore and the downtown area a popular spot for tourists, beach-goers, scuba divers and residents, the lack of adequate parking spaces

is an issue the Town has faced for years. The new lot, located between **State Road A1A** and **Bougainvillea Drive** about a block north of **Commercial Boulevard**, will provide much-needed additional parking.

With the addition of the 69 new spaces, the Town now has 680 spaces.

The lot will open as soon as final structural, electrical and irrigation inspections are approved by Broward County. □

Construction is anticipated to start on or around **Sept. 10th**. Once the project is finished, Bel Air homeowners will be given six months to abandon their septic tanks and hook into the new sewer system.

Property owners can choose to either have their septic tank pumped out and removed — or pumped out, bottom-crushed and filled with clean sand.

Septic tanks pose an environmental hazard, especially in Lauderdale-By-The-Sea, a barrier island. By removing septic tanks, the Town helps eliminate the discharge of effluent from the disposal systems, which will reduce and remove contaminants in both the groundwater and environmentally-sensitive **Biscayne Aquifer**.

It will cost Bel Air homeowners between \$2,000 and \$4,000 to abandon their septic tanks and hook into the new sewer system.

The Town is preparing a flier with more details about the upcoming construction project. It will be mailed to Bel Air residents in August. □

Town addressing ongoing improvement projects

The following is a summary of ongoing projects and activities:

Buoy Maintenance

Swimming buoy maintenance (buoys and hardware inspected and/or reattached) has started with the contractor, American Underwater.

Beach Access

All necessary permits were issued. Purchase Order and Notice to Proceed has been issued to contractor. Contractor is to submit schedule of project duration.

Beach Pavilion

The Town Commission chose the design of the pavilion on June 26th.

Bus Stops/ Shelters

Broward County has awarded a contract to Design-Build Engineers and Contractors for improvements to local bus stops. The department has requested information on the concurrency funds available for purchasing bus shelters after the stops are improved. In the event funds are not available or not accepted, the department will propose a budget of \$102,000 for 12 bus shelter installations.

Flagpole on Commercial

The Florida Department of Transportation requires a General Use Permit application with engineering approval, sealed plans showing location, footing details, lighting requirements and an access plan. The Town Planner is

reviewing the process in an attempt to combine it with the Entry Ways project to avoid additional costs.

Town Entry Ways Vision Project

The bidding documents are in production and were scheduled to be completed by July 20.

FPL Light Issues

Florida Power & Light is continuing to work with the Town on resolving lighting issues. The FDOT

The project is 80 percent completed. Residents may hook up to the new system.

Dog Waste Dispensers

Terra Mar Lift Station Control Panel Relocation

The City of Pompano Beach denied the request to relocate any and all equipment for the lift station as it would affect the efficiency and the operation of the system.

Temporary Park – El Prado

An irrigation system and sod were installed and the park is open for use.

Temporary Resident Parking — El Prado

An area has been designated and signs installed in the area across from Jarvis Hall adjacent to State Road A1A.

Replanting of Palms – North Shops on Commercial Boulevard

New MacArthur Palms were planted along the sidewalk adjacent to storefronts.

Parking Meter Hoods

The Town has purchased meter hoods for use when meter fees are waived.

Town Hall Dumpster Enclosure

The Town installed an enclosure around the dumpsters as required by zoning code. Staff rejected the proposal of a three year lease for two solar power compactors to be located near the pier.

Tennis Court Resurfacing

The Municipal courts across from Town Hall were professionally resurfaced.
