Town collecting aid for Haiti earthquake victims

The Town of Lauderdale-By-The-Sea is collecting aid for the victims of Haiti's earthquake. The following items can be dropped off at Town Hall, 4501 Ocean Drive:

- Canned food items that can be opened with a pull-tab.
- Water.
- Diapers.
- Canned milk or Parmalat.

Clothing is no longer being accepted; please DO NOT drop off clothes. Haiti was devastated by a series of earthquakes on Jan. 12. Many employees who work in the Town's hotels and restaurants have relatives and friends in Haiti.

There has been an outpouring of help and aid from the U.S. and nations around the world, but the Town would also like to do its part to help our nearby Caribbean neighbors.

State Road A1A in Town officially designated Florida Scenic Highway

State Road A1A in Broward County, including the two-mile stretch of roadway in the **Town of Lauderdale-By-The-Sea**, is now a **Florida Scenic Highway**.

Broward County Mayor Ken Keechl, whose district includes the Town, said the official designation of the state road is evidence that residents want to see A1A “preserved for future generations.”

The criteria to qualify included that the corridor “tell a story” about the region and that the road

exhibit significant, exceptional and distinctive features.

Designated state scenic highways are identified on local, state and federal maps. Tourists are often drawn to roads with official scenic designations.

A scenic highway designation yields several community benefits, including the establishment of a vision for the corridor that will help maintain South Florida’s “quality of life.”



The **Florida Scenic Highways Program** was developed to preserve and enhance Florida’s historical, archaeological, recreational, natural and scenic resources.

Scenic Highway signs will go up on State Road A1A in Town and on Commercial Boulevard in 2010.

Town resident **Diane Boutin** and **Assistant Town Manager John Olinzock** served on the county committee that worked on the highway designation.

State Road A1A in Town is also scheduled for a landscaping upgrade in the near future. The Town has received a **\$58,300 grant** from the **Florida Department of Transportation** for the project’s conceptual design.

Assuming state funding for the project is available and allocated, the state has budgeted **\$647,000** for the project. The Town will also be asked to contribute funds. □

Town donates trailer to Coast Guard Flotilla 34

The **Town** will donate a triple-wide trailer worth an estimated \$40,000 to **U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary Flotilla 34** in Pompano Beach, a non-profit community group which strives to promote boating safety in Broward County.

The trailer is located on State Road A1A just north of **Jarvis Hall** (between Jarvis and the Town’s new **Public Safety Complex**).

The **Town Commission** agreed in January to donate the trailer after it was unable to find a buyer because of the severe downturn in the economy and construction industry.

The trailer was purchased by the Town several years ago to house the **Development Services Department** (zoning and code) and **Broward County Building Department**, which provides Town

building department services.

The dozen employees working there will move to the building that now houses the



Broward Sheriff’s Office after it re-locates to the nearby **Public Safety Complex**.

The Town Commission unanimously supported donating the trailer to the flotilla, which needs a new trailer to replace the aging one it now occupies at the 14th Street boat ramp facility in Pompano Beach.

Flotilla 34 officials told the Town they would pay the cost of moving the trailer to Pompano Beach. □

Town recognized again for budget presentation and financial reporting

The **Town of Lauderdale-By-The-Sea** was again recognized by the **Government Finance Officers Association** for excellence in financial reporting and its annual budget presentation.

This marks the 13th consecutive year the Town has received these rds from GFOA, a professional association representing more than 17,000 state and municipal finance officers in the **U.S. and Canada**.

Less than approximately 10 percent of GFOA's 1,328 members in Florida received the distinguished budget award.

The Town received a **Certificate of Achievement**

For Excellence in Financial Reporting for its **Comprehensive Annual Financial Report** for the fiscal year that ended on Sept. 30, 2008.

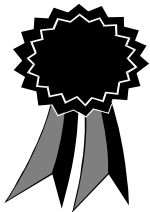
It also received a **Distinguished Budget Presentation** for the 2008-09 fiscal year.

Less than approximately 20 percent of GFOA's members in Florida received the award for their annual comprehensive financial reports.

More cities, towns, counties and other government entities apply for the CAFR recognition because it is beneficial as it relates to bonds.

GFOA's Excellence in Financial Reporting Program encourages cities and towns to go beyond the minimum requirements of generally-accepted accounting principles and prepare comprehensive financial reports that reflect transparency and full disclosure.

The program encourages cities to prepare comprehensive annual financial reports of the highest quality. □

- Any Town resident may submit questions, which will be screened for duplication and clarity only (two or more questions on the same issue may be combined).
- No personal questions will be allowed.
- Written questions from the audience that night will be accepted and screened for duplication and clarity only.
- No candidate will be given prior knowledge of specific questions. The purpose of the questions is to address Town issues. □

Town's marine park grant not approved by the state

The Town's **\$20,000 grant request** to create an underwater marine park south of **Anglin's Pier** was not funded by the state. The Town is expected to apply again next year. Florida



received 16 applications for coastal projects, but it expects to only fund three: the St. John Water Management District, the Coastal Wildlife

Education Program and the Caribbean Conservation Corporation.

The Town applied for the grant from the **Department of Environmental Protection** in November. □

Broward County will offer "Wellness Class" for residents at Senior Center

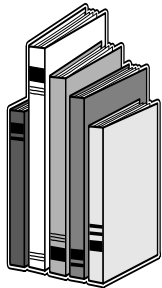
