Proposed beach renourishment would impact residents and reefs

Broward County plans to widen two long stretches of beach between **Port Everglades** and the **Hillsboro Inlet** that will impact **Lauderdale-By-The-Sea** residents, tourists in Town and our near-shore coral reefs.

The **Town Commission** plans to hold a workshop on the project for residents to express their views on this issue. No workshop date has been set, but it is expected to be scheduled in February.

The project start date is uncertain, since the County must first obtain state and federal permits. South Florida environmental groups are also expected to challenge the project in court, citing the detrimental impact beach widening efforts have had on Florida's near-shore reefs in the past.

The state and federal permit review process will take several months to complete. The earliest construction could even start is **November 2013**.

Beaches provide vital storm protection, but the reefs, which harbor corals protected under federal law, are also an important part of our economy.

The first beach segment proposed to be widened stretches from south of the **Bonnet House** in Fort Lauderdale north to the **Oriana** condominium complex, just south of **Anglin's Pier**. The second segment stretches from just south of the **Pompano Pier** south to the **Aquazul Condo** here in Town.

The Town's beaches are not the project's main focus. Our shore would be used for the tapers at the north end of the first segment and the south end of the second segment.

Town Commission meeting on Commercial streetscape design scheduled for Jan. 17th

The **Town Commission** will hold a special meeting to consider a proposed streetscape design for **Commercial Boulevard** from the pavilion west to Bougainvillea Drive. The meeting is **Tuesday, Jan. 17** at **7PM** in **Jarvis Hall**. The Town wants to hear from residents and business owners. A presentation will be made by **Jamie Correa and Associates**, a Miami firm hired by the Town to create a streetscape design to beautify and enhance Commercial Boulevard by making it more pedestrian-friendly.

The plans will be posted on the Town's Web site. The Town held a well-attended informational meeting in December in an empty storefront building downtown, where Correa presented some preliminary design concepts.

Proposed new FEMA flood maps will impact more than 300 property owners

More than 300 **Lauderdale-By-The-Sea** property owners would be required to obtain flood insurance under newly-proposed flood zone maps used to determine federal flood insurance requirements.

Under the proposed maps, 343 property owners in Town would need to buy flood insurance for the first time. Thirty-seven property owners would also see their federal flood insurance requirement dropped.

The new maps were produced by the **Federal Emergency Management Agency** and **Broward County**.

A 90-day appeal period for the new maps started in December, when local governments and property owners or lessees could begin to challenge FEMA on whether the new flood elevations were scientifically or technically correct.



After the appeal period expires in February, FEMA will resolve any appeals and then issue a Letter of Final Determination. Broward County and the municipal

governments will have six months to adopt the revised maps.

Upon adoption, the maps will become effective and be used for flood insurance purchase and rating purposes. Developers and builders will be required to use the finished floor elevations for new construction and substantial improvements to existing construction.

Flooding is the most common and most expensive type of natural disaster in the U.S. Most homeowner policies do not cover flooding, but you can purchase flood insurance to protect against the financial devastation flooding can cause.

Congress mandates that federally regulated or insured mortgage lenders require flood insurance on properties in high-risk flood zones. Some lenders also require flood insurance for properties located outside of high-risk flood areas.

Even if property flood insurance is not required, it is still an important consideration, because anyone can be financially vulnerable to floods. □

Two Jarvis sign-up dates for residents seeking Homestead exemptions

Scuba diver breaks record for world's longest dive off Lauderdale-By-The-Sea

Florida diver **Allen Sherrod** set a new world's record on Dec. 3 off **Lauderdale-By-The-Sea** for the longest scuba dive in saltwater: 48 hours and 13 minutes. Sherrod started his dive in front of the **Windjammer Resort** at 10:12AM on Thursday, Dec. 1. He surfaced at 10:25 AM on Saturday, breaking the old world record by under 5 minutes.

A crowd of supporters and dive safety team members applauded

when Sherrod emerged from the surf. After being helped by the Volunteer Fire Department Beach Patrol, American Medical Response paramedics checked his key vital signs.

"I was glad I was able to break the record in Lauderdale-By-The-Sea, the Shore Dive Capital of South Florida," he said.

Sherrod's dive attracted publicity for the Town and its new artificial **Biorock** reef, where he broke the world record.



Town grants will help improve neighborhoods

The **Town's Neighborhood Improvement Grant Program** can help you and your neighbors spruce up and improve your neighborhood.

Under the program you can add signs, street furniture, pillars, public art, lighting, shade structures at bus stops, enhanced landscaping, non-secular holiday lighting displays and road surface treatments.

Cameras, gates, guardhouses or other security-related equipment or structures will be considered by the Town on a case-by-case basis.

The eligible neighborhoods are:

- **Bel-Air and Terra Mar.**
- **Lauderdale Surf & Yacht Estates** (Codrington Drive, Imperial Lane and Thomas Way).
- **North Silver Shores** (Commercial Boulevard to Pine Avenue, including North Seagrape Drive).
- **North Bougainville Drive and North Poinciana Street.**
- **South Seagrape** (South Seagrape Drive, Garden Court, Lake Court, Marine Court, Shore Court).
- **South Silver Shores** (Tradewinds Drive south of Commercial Boulevard, Miramar Avenue, Capri Avenue).
- **South Bougainville Drive and South Poinciana Street.**
- **Tropic Drive, Hibiscus Avenue and Allenwood Drive.**

How it works

Applications can be submitted to the Town annually between **Oct. 1st** and **Jan. 31st**. The application form is on the Town's Web site under **Documents**. The project must have substantial neighborhood support.

Staff will verify the budget costs and identify any issues that might complicate the project or increase its cost. Projects will be ranked and submitted to the **Town Commission** for funding consideration.

The Town will fund up to \$30,000 for individual neighborhood projects. Any hard costs (including design and permitting) the Town incurs will be charged against the \$30,000. Town staff time will not be charged. Neighborhoods are responsible for

costs over \$30,000.

Phasing of a single project over multiple years to receive multiple grants is not allowed. Smaller stand-alone projects envisioned as part of a larger project may be submitted, but funding for one project does not guarantee funding for the remaining improvements.

Maintenance / Insurance

The neighborhood may be responsible for the maintenance of upgrades the Town does not normally maintain, such as security-related improvements and liability insurance. If maintenance or insurance is required, a neighborhood association must execute an agreement prior to construction.

Project Guidelines

1. Only those goods and services approved by the Town will be paid for with Town funds.

- 2. Projects must be completed within one year and comply with all Town codes and requirements.
- 3. For projects greater than \$30,000, prior to the project being designed, the association must have its funds on deposit and provide written confirmation those funds will be available for project expenses. □

Sand placed on the beach is gradually tapered (*see map below*) so there is not a stark demarcation line in the width of the shoreline.

The last beach widening project in the Town occurred 28 years ago. While there has been some erosion on our 2.4 miles of beach, between April 2009 and April 2011 our beaches actually gained 57,900 cubic yards of sand as a result of much more efficient dredging operations at the Hillsboro Inlet.

“The erosion rate in this area has really slowed,” said **Eric Myers**, an administrator with the County’s **Environmental Protection and Growth Management Department** who addressed the Commission on the project in December. “Some areas have been accreting sand since 2001.”

To widen the beaches, the County will truck about 750,000 cubic yards of sand in from Central Florida. Since the trucks used can only haul 20 cubic yards of sand per load, it would take 37,500 truck-loads of sand over three winter seasons (Nov. 1 – Feb. 29) to complete the work in the two project areas. The work cannot be done

during sea turtle nesting season. In Hollywood, where a similar beach project is underway, Myers said about 150 trucks per day are delivering sand to that site.

The number of trucks the County would need to send through Lauderdale-By-The-Sea isn’t known at this time. The County is still deciding what roadway access points it would need for the entire project. “It takes a lot of trucks to haul enough sand to build a beach,” Myers said.


The project is expected to cost an estimated \$38 million. It isn’t

known how much the Town would be required to contribute at this time.

In addition to the truck traffic during tourist season, Myers acknowledged the project could negatively impact the Town’s reefs, since harmful sediment can settle on the reefs and sometimes smother them.

Unlike 40 years ago, Myers said, people today “are very sensitive to the (environmental) impacts.”

Myers said the County’s studies show that the economic value of the reefs is similar to that of the beach. □

PROJECT PARAMETERS: The proposed beach widening project by Broward County would add sand to the north and south ends of the Town’s beach. Sand trucked in from Central Florida would be placed on the shore from Pompano Beach south down to the Aquazul Condominium here in Town (R-043 on map). Sand would also be placed on the beach starting in Fort Lauderdale near the Bonnet House all the way north to the Oriana Condo (R-051 on map). The beach widening project’s tapers are marked in red. Lauderdale-By-The-Sea’s northern and southern municipal boundaries are highlighted in yellow.

LBTS now seeking applicants to serve on three Town boards

The BOA, which meets as needed, conducts quasi-judicial hearings on applications for variances from the Town's land development regulations in accordance with procedures in the Town's ordinances.

The P&Z Board meets once a month and advises the **Town Commission** on planning matters.

The Charter Review Board, which will be tasked with recommending updates and revisions to the Town's Charter, will be disbanded after its work is completed. The board's recommendations will be given to the Commission. If approved, the recommendations will later be placed before the voters.

Yes. Your credit card number is encrypted when you sign up and is never entered, displayed, or spoken during a transaction.


