Christmas-By-The-Sea attracted a record crowd of 5,000 people in December, the largest ever to attend the Town's biggest holiday event of the year.

More than 30 Town businesses, non-profits and civic organizations participated in the **Yuletide Market** this year. Other businesses in **Anglin's Square** were busy with customers for most of the evening.



Fun children's activities and games kept kids and grandkids alike engaged creating ornaments, decorating cookies and writing letters to **Santa Claus**. **Mr. and Mrs. Claus** arrived as always with help from the **Volunteer Fire Department**. This year's dancers and singers were from the **University Center for the Performing Arts** school in Davie. Our main sponsor this year was **State Contracting and Engineering** in Hollywood, which built the Town's new bathroom facility just south of Anglin's Square (see story on page 3). Anglin's Square was again beautifully decorated with the Town **Christmas Tree**, ornamental holiday lights and red poinciana plants.




"We both have found such healing peace and love by the sea, we want to give back to this beautiful community through yoga and meditation," they said.

Ruttger's By The Sea

The Town's newest hotel, Plunge Beach Hotel, was once home to one of the Town's earliest hotels, Ruttger's By The Sea. Located between A1A and El Mar Drive at Pine Avenue, the site has been home to a number of hotels, including the Clarion and Florida's Beach Hotel. Ruttger's was built in 1946-47, shortly before the Town was re-incorporated in November 1947. After undergoing extensive renovations, Plunge Beach Hotel is expected to open its doors to the public within the next few weeks.

New Town bathrooms now open to the public

The **Town Commission** marked the opening of the Town's first downtown public bathrooms in December with an official ribbon-cutting ceremony.

The event was held on Wednesday, Dec. 7th, right before the start of **Christmas-By-The-Sea**.

Commissioner Chris Vincent, who urged the Commission to build the facility, was given the honor of cutting the red ribbon.

The new bathrooms are located in the new **El Mar Plaza**, just south of **Anglin's Square** across from **Mulligan's Restaurant** on the west side of **El Mar Drive**.

The site includes six bathrooms and six new parking spaces. The restrooms are open from dawn to dusk.

Business owners downtown have wanted the Town to build bathrooms for beachgoers and tourists. For years now, a number of downtown restaurants and businesses allowed the public to use their bathroom facilities, even though they weren't customers.

Despite being open only a short time, the bathrooms are being heavily used.

The new facility was designed to reflect the Town's mid-century modern architecture.

The new facility is landscaped and will be kept clean and maintained by the Town Community Standards staff.

Landscape Requirements

We appreciate it when residents landscape their properties, but we want to remind you that permits from **Broward County** and the **Town** may be required.


In fact, failing to obtain a required landscape permit from Broward County may result in thousands of dollars in fines.

To avoid any unnecessary problems, the Town urges you to do the following **before** you landscape your property:

- Call **Broward County's Environmental Licensing and Building Permitting Division** before you proceed with your project at **954-519-1282**. They will review your plans for compliance with the County's regulations.

- Contact **Juliana Cardona** from the Town at **954-640-4221**. She will review your proposed landscape plan to make sure it meets the requirements of the Town's code (number of trees on site, distance planted from other trees/buildings, power lines, etc.)

- Please also remember that **Florida Power & Light** provides helpful guidelines to help you pick the right trees that can be planted near electric power lines. You can find more information at www.fpl.com/RightTree.

Run down hotel site will be landscaped and painted

The **Town** staff often gets complaints and requests for information about the run-down hotel property at **4116 El Mar Drive** at the southern end of the street (formerly site of the Holiday Inn) and owned by the **Florida Development Group (FDG)**.

The Town has code violations dating back to 2012 on this property with fines totaling more than \$2 million dollars and these fines increase by \$700 each day.

After the property owner received pressure from the **Town Commission** to upgrade the condition of the site, FDG has agreed to spend **\$90,000** over the next two months to:

1. Start maintaining the property by:

- Removing dead landscaping, add new mulch and make other landscape improvements.
- Resealing and restripe the parking lot.
- Replacing broken parking stops and painting existing ones.
- Removing abandoned signs and replace some signs.
- Making small structural improvements to the building, including replacing railings or missing grills, etc.
- Applying one coat of exterior paint to the building.

2. Hire an engineer to complete structural analysis of the buildings on the hotel site. The results will determine whether some of the buildings can be renovated or must be torn down.

3. Give the Commission regular updates as to the progress of the site. The property owners' project manager will give the first update to the Commission at its meeting on Feb. 28th.

Why plastic bags can't be recycled

Plastic bags are truly handy. They are lightweight and stretchy, perfect for holding stuff. But because they are lightweight, they blow around becoming litter on our streets and our waterways.

Because they are stretchy, we seem to think they are good for holding our recycling items, but that is not true. Neither plastic bags, nor plastic film-like wrap of any kind, can be recycled in your curbside recycling. **Here's why:**

Your recycling that gets collected from in front of your house is taken to a Materials Recovery Facility and bags slow down the process or can jam the equipment. They are ripped open by an automated bag ripper and manually disposed of immediately.

To recycle right: clean plastic grocery bags should be recycled at the grocery stores, which have collection bins by the entrances or exits. Ask customer service where these containers are if you don't see them.

Try reusing your plastic bags a few times. Leave a few in your car for the next run to the store. Stash one in your purse or backpack for that quick stop at the convenience store. Use it for your kitty litter or after walking your dog. The best way to reduce the number of plastic bags you may be using is to say, "No thank you," and carry your own reusable totes or canvas bags with you.

No plastic film or other unacceptable material such as plastic grocery bags and plastic expanded foam (veggie or meat trays) should be placed in your recycling cart.

When you purchase beverages by the case, be sure to separate the plastic film (throw it away) from the cardboard (recycle it). **Remember: No Plastic Bags, Wrappers or Styrofoam.**

The Town's **Community Center** has two great upcoming events as part of its **Evening at Jarvis Hall Lecture Series**.




