**Fourth of July Town celebration!**

The Town of Lauderdale-By-The-Sea has another great Fourth of July celebration planned this year for residents and visitors, including a traditional parade, a waterslide in **El Prado Park** and a 25-minute fireworks show.

The Fourth of July **Parade Grand Marshal** is actress **Bailee Madison**, 15, a Town resident. Bailee has appeared in *Bridge to Terabithia*, *Wizards of Waverly Place*, *Don't Be Afraid of the Dark* and *Parental Guidance* with **Billy Crystal**. Her numerous other credits include *Just Go With It* and *Once Upon a Time*.

The parade starts at **10AM** on **Bougainvillea Drive** behind **Town Hall**, goes north to **Pine Avenue**, east to **El Mar Drive**, south to **Palm Avenue** and then west to Bougainvillea Drive before returning north to Town Hall.

To ensure the safety of parade participants, there will be periodic road closures after 10AM along the route, which will cause some morning delays.

**Commissioner Elliot Sokolow**, the **Fourth of July Committee Chairman**, said there will be a waterslide and refreshment tents in El Prado Park from **11:30AM to 4PM**. The fireworks will be launched off the beach near El Prado Park at **9PM**.

If you want to grab something to eat or drink, Commissioner Sokolow encourages everyone to patronize our vendors and the many fine restaurants, pubs and ice cream shops downtown.

**Please walk, don't drive**



Broward Sheriff's Office **Lt. Thomas Palmer** said vehicle traffic on **State Road A1A** will be jammed for at least one hour after the fireworks show ends, since there will also be motorists from Fort Lauderdale and Pompano Beach traveling on A1A towards **Commercial Boulevard**.

"Expect heavy traffic delays," he warned. "If you don't need to drive, please don't. Trust me, driving will not get you home quicker."

The free **Pelican Hopper** community shuttle will operate just within Town that day until **midnight**.

BSO anticipates closing **Anglin's Square** to incoming vehicle traffic from about **8PM** until the heavy pedestrian traffic subsides, between **10 and 11PM**. Motorists can expect heavy traffic all day, but especially from **8 to 11PM**.

BSO may set-up alternate traffic routes, possibly including directing traffic westbound on Commercial over the **Intracoastal Waterway** and out of Town.

## Fire and EMS response times exceed national standards

The **Town of Lauderdale-By-The-Sea's** fire and emergency medical response times are significantly better than the accepted national standards.



**American Medical Response's** average response time per EMS call is **3:31** minutes. According to the National EMS Information System, the national average is 9.3 minutes. The Town's contract with AMR calls for them to respond to 90 percent of calls within 6 minutes. They handily beat that performance standard. The **Lauderdale-By-The-Sea Volunteer Fire Department's** average response time over the past

12 months (April 2014 to March 2015) is **3.99** minutes. Response time is measured from the time the call is dispatched to arrival on the scene.



The **National Fire Protection Association** says a professional fire department should arrive at the scene within four minutes. For volunteer fire departments, the national standard is nine minutes. SO not only does the VFD easily beat the standard for volunteer departments, they actually meet the standards set for a paid,

professional fire department.

Since response time is so significant to saving lives and minimizing fire damage, LBTS residents should be pleased with the response time of both the VFD and AMR.

## LBTS 2014 crime rate numbers

**National Uniform Crime Rate** statistics

collected annually by the **FBI** show that, while **Lauderdale-By-The-Sea** has maintained the **10th lowest crime rate** of all cities in Broward County, the crime rate did increase in 2014 by 16.6 percent.

The percentage sounds high, but reflects only 21 more crimes than in 2013, less than two additional crimes per month. (Crime in Town in 2013 dropped by 21.7 percent, following crime rate decreases in 2010, 2011 and 2012).

The crime rate statistics are based on population. Lauderdale-By-The-Sea has one of the highest seasonal increases in population of any city in Broward (almost a 100 percent increase in the winter population), but that is not taken into account in calculating the crime rate.

**Broward Sheriff's Office Capt. Fred Wood** said the 2014 increase was attributed to two main issues: two hotels in Town that were booking questionable clientele, and a spike in the number of thefts from beach-goers.

“The vast majority of our thefts are crimes of opportunity where the victim leaves property unattended or unsecured,” Wood said. “After the beach thefts increased, BSO instituted an educational campaign to remind visitors to take basic, common sense precautions to prevent these crimes of opportunity.”

Wood said he believes a contributing factor to the beach thefts was an extended period where BSO discontinued its beach patrols due to problems with their all-terrain vehicles. After the beach vehicles were replaced in September and patrols resumed, there was a corresponding decrease in beach thefts. The **Citizen Observer Patrol's** bicycle and beach patrols have also increased police visibility on and near the beach.

With regard to crime generated at the hotels or involving their guests in the nearby vicinity, BSO determined that one of the hotels housed 38 people with significant criminal pasts or who were on court-ordered sanctions. After the **Town Manager** and Capt. Wood met with hotel management to voice their displeasure with the situation, the hotel hired an off duty BSO Officer on Friday and Saturday nights and raised their room rates, which quickly stopped the criminal activity.

When discussions and warnings with the other hotel had no impact, the Town brought **Nuisance Abatement** proceedings against it. The Town's Special Magistrate accepted most of BSO's recommendations for corrective actions and imposed significant fines on the property owner. As a result, crime at that hotel and in the nearby area has dropped significantly.

- Don't needlessly display guest room keys in public or carelessly leave them on restaurant tables, at the swimming pool, or other places where they can be easily stolen.

## Everyone's help needed to maintain swale landscaping

The **Town of Lauderdale-By-The-Sea** is working hard to keep the community beautiful and we need your help!

The Town has included landscaping in many of our drainage and street improvement projects over the past several years. We have also worked with neighborhoods to remove pavement and replace it with sod, landscaping and street trees.

These landscape areas are a great improvement to the community, but they have to be maintained.

### We need your help!

Here is where we need to work together: If you live adjacent to the right of way landscaping, we need you to take care of the landscaping once it is established.



The Town will water it for the first 90 or so days to make sure it survives, but then the **Town Code** requires the adjacent property owner to take over maintenance.

## Track the Pelican Hopper with Sun Trolley App

Residents and tourists who use the **Lauderdale-By-The-Sea Pelican Hopper** community shuttle can now use their smart phone or home computer to track the shuttle's location.

The Town entered into an agreement with Fort Lauderdale's **Sun Trolley** to use its award-winning Tracker App to provide shuttle passengers with real-time information about its location so they can determine how long it will be before it gets to their stop.

The Tracker App can be downloaded free from the App or Google Play stores or by visiting [www.suntrolley.com/sun-trolley-tracker](http://www.suntrolley.com/sun-trolley-tracker). It is available for Apple and Android smart

phones, tablets, laptops and other devices, as well as desktop computers.

**Robyn Chiarelli, Executive Director** of the **Downtown Fort Lauderdale TMA**, which manages the Sun Trolley, said the expansion of the app to include the Pelican Hopper will improve connections for Sun Trolley customers who also use the Hopper.

"The Pelican Hopper and Sun Trolley's Galt Link intersect at the Galt Ocean Mile Reading Center and the Fort Lauderdale Beach Community Center and the two routes share a similar customer base," Chiarelli said. "We've received customer requests for better connections between the two routes, and adding the Pelican Hopper to the Tracker App is a good first step in improving that connection."



# Community Center offers variety of great programs

**Armilio Bien-Amie**, the director of the Town's **Community Center** for 15 years, often sees the value of his efforts in the faces of the people who participate.

"People seem to be happier as they leave here," he said.

The center offers Town residents numerous programs (see box below), including computers, foreign language, interior decorating classes, and an acting workshop. Low impact exercise programs (Yoga and Tai Chi) are also offered.

Funded by the Town and a small grant from Broward County, the center is located in **Jarvis Hall**, 4505 N. Ocean Drive.

"This is a place where you can come to have some fun, learn new skills, and make friends," Armilio said. "We have lots of activities."



**Lisa Johnson**, a Town resident and volunteer at the center, said Armilio is "a wonderful teacher" who is eager to share his technology expertise. "I've met so many different people at the center," she said. "I've made a lot of friends."

Classes are free to Town residents and snowbirds

who reside in the Town part of the year, and folks age 60 or older. Retired doctors, lawyers, engineers and teachers who participate in the programs often volunteer to teach a class or seminar.

The center in March performed several short plays attended by more than 200 people over three nights. Participants **Maria Elena Salazar** and **Muriel 'Micki' Gordon** both performed (see insert picture above). The next production is scheduled for October.

Armilio encouraged residents to consider what the center offers.

"Take a look and see if we have something for you," he said. "If we don't, please suggest something. We want to meet the needs of the Town residents and your opinion will help us do exactly that."





There are more than a dozen events during BugFest, including a workshop on how to catch lobster by retired Deerfield Beach firefighter **Jim**



## Summer should include recycling

The **South Florida** summer holidays traditionally involve lots of picnics, barbecues and outdoor dinner parties.

They also create more opportunities to recycle. Plan ahead for these gatherings and think of ways you can recycle during and after the event.



Here are some party recycling tips: Plastic recycling has gone well beyond bottles, cans and milk jugs. Any plastic plate or cup marked 1-7 can be recycled (Lightly rinse before placing in the bin). Yes, Red Cups are recyclable. You can also recycle clean deli containers, lids, and clamshells. Beverage cans and bottles should be recycled.

For your event, clearly label a recycling bin for your guests' easy use. Some beaches and camping areas don't have recycling bins, so bring a bag so you can take the items that can be recycled home.

Styrofoam plates and cups are not recyclable so don't buy these landfill-bound items.
