



### HURRICANE SEASON

Since our entire Town is located on a barrier island, all residents will be advised to leave Town if a Hurricane Warning is issued for Broward by the National Weather Service.

### KENNETH WARDLAW

The Town noted with sadness the passing of former Mayor Kenneth Wardlaw, 87, a long-time resident who died on June 14. Wardlaw was elected to the Town Commission in 1990 and ran for Mayor in 1992. Because



of a charter change, he was the first mayor directly elected by the voters. Prior to then, the mayor was appointed by a majority of the 5-member commission.

## Get ready for another fabulous Fourth!

The **Town** has planned another fabulous **Fourth of July** celebration!

Presented by the **Town of Lauderdale-By-The-Sea** with the assistance of the **Volunteer Fire Department**, the day starts with the annual Town parade at **10AM** and concludes with a great fireworks show at **9PM** (fireworks will be shot off the beach just north of **El Prado Park**). There are **Family Fun Day** activities in El Prado from **11AM** to **3PM**, including a waterslide and fire truck demonstrations (plus hot dogs and lemonade).

**Commissioner Buz Oldaker**, chairman of the July 4th Committee for the second consecutive year, invites all residents and their families to come out and celebrate our nation's anniversary.

The **Grand Marshal** for this year's parade is longtime resident **Ron Piersante**. Ron moved to Town with his wife, **Irene**, in 1997 after retiring from a mid-western insurance company. He first visited here in 1982.

"We fell in love with the Town," he said.

Ron has been an invaluable volunteer at the **Lauderdale-By-The-Sea Chamber of Commerce** since 1998, where he performs a variety of duties, including delivering the annual Chamber guides, the Town's newsletter, walking maps and event flyers to businesses.

"We literally couldn't operate without him," Chamber **President Courtney Stafford** said. This year Ron's hard work and efforts were recognized by the Chamber when it awarded him the first **Paul Novak Service Award** for outstanding service to the Chamber and community.

Ron regularly attends **Town Commission** meetings and currently serves on the **Board of Adjustment** and **Audit Committee**.

The parade starts at the **Fire Station** on **Bougainville Drive**, heads north to **Pine Avenue**, east to **El Mar Drive**, south to **Hibiscus Avenue** and west to Bougainville before heading north and finishing at **Town Hall** (see map on Page 8).

### Expect heavy traffic delays

**Broward Sheriff's Office Capt. Thomas Palmer** strongly encourages all Town residents not to drive to the beach to watch the fireworks.

He said vehicle traffic on **North Ocean Drive** will be jammed for at least one hour after the fireworks show ends, since there will also be motorists from Fort Lauderdale and Pompano Beach traveling here towards **Commercial Boulevard**.

## Town agrees to settle 2006 height restriction lawsuits

The **Town** has agreed to settle three lawsuits stemming from litigation filed over a 2006 referendum vote that severely restricted height limits in its newly annexed area.

The settlement, which must still be approved by the court, has no impact on building height limits in the south end of Town. The settlements will eliminate the remaining claims for damages of **\$16 million** against the Town and bring an end to Town legal expenditures related to the 2006 referendum vote.

When the Town annexed the unincorporated beach north of the Town in **2000**, it agreed to let property owners keep their 15-story height limits, the limit allowed under Broward County.

In November 2006, voters approved a **Town Charter** referendum extending the 44-foot height limit in the south part of Town to the newly-annexed area. After the referendum passed, lawsuits were timely filed by four property owners claiming that the new height restrictions could cost them millions in development rights by not being allowed to build up to 15 stories.

Here are the three lawsuits that will be settled:

**The Palm Yacht & Beach Club, Inc., v. Town of Lauderdale-By-The-Sea:** Palm Club agrees to release all height damage claims in exchange for the Town's agreement to install a sanitary sewer system for its 99 residences, the last area in Town still using septic tanks.

**Delrado, Inc., v. Town of Lauderdale-By-The-Sea:** Delrado agrees to release height damage claims in exchange

**All of the agreements provide that each party will be responsible for its own legal costs and fees**

for future development rights. The El Dorado Club would give up its claim for millions of dollars in compensation and retain the right to build to the pre-annexation, 15-story height limits. There are no plans to build a 15-story structure at this time.

**Edmondson v. Town of Lauderdale-By-The-Sea: James Edmondson**, owner of the **Sea Watch Restaurant**, will give up his claim for millions of dollars in compensation and retain the right to build to 15 stories in the future. Edmondson says there are no current plans to redevelop the restaurant site.

A fourth property owner (Coastal Arms) also challenged the restrictive height limits, but in 2015 agreed to drop its claims against the Town and to waive any future legal claims.

With the prior settlement of Coastal Arms and the approval of these three settlements, the Town avoids all claims for monetary damages and interest, and prevents two litigants (Coastal Arms and Palm Club) from building up to 15 stories.

All of the agreements provide that each party will be responsible for its own legal costs and fees.

# Neighborhood improvement grants available

In an ongoing effort to improve Lauderdale-By-The-Sea's residential areas, the Town wants to help make your neighborhood a nicer place to live.

Under the Town's **Neighborhood Improvement Grant Program**, a neighborhood can receive up to \$30,000 for entryway signs (see photo), street furniture, pillars, art, lighting, bus stop shade structures, enhanced landscaping, non-secular holiday lighting displays and road surface treatments.

Cameras, gates, guardhouses or other security-related equipment or structures may also be considered by the Town on a case-by-case basis.

The application deadline is **Sept. 30, 2017**. The Town grant policy and application form is on the Town's Web site ([www.lbts-fl.gov](http://www.lbts-fl.gov)) under **Documents**. The proposed project **must have** substantial neighborhood support before it will be considered.

## How it works

After applications are submitted, staff will verify the budget costs and identify any issues that might complicate the project or increase its cost. Projects will be ranked and submitted to the Town Commission for funding consideration.

The Town will fund up to \$30,000 for individual neighborhood projects.

Any hard costs the Town incurs (including design and permitting) will be charged against the \$30,000. Staff time will not be charged. Neighborhoods are responsible for costs that exceed \$30,000.



**Proposed projects must receive substantial support from the neighborhood before they are considered for funding**

## Eligible Town Neighborhoods

Several Lauderdale-By-The-Sea neighborhoods are eligible for grants under the Neighborhood Improvement Grant Program, including the following:

- ◆ Bel-Air and Terra Mar Island.
- ◆ Lauderdale Surf & Yacht Estates (Codrington Drive, Imperial Lane and Thomas Way).
- ◆ North Silver Shores (Commercial Boulevard to Pine Avenue, including North Seagrape Drive).
- ◆ North Bougainvillea Drive and North Poinciana Street.
- ◆ South Seagrape (South Seagrape Drive, Garden Court, Lake Court, Marine Court, Shore Court).
- ◆ South Silver Shores (Tradewinds Drive south of Commercial Boulevard, Miramar Avenue, Capri Avenue).
- ◆ South Bougainvillea Drive & South Poinciana Street.
- ◆ Tropic Drive, Hibiscus Avenue and Allenwood Drive.

Phasing of a single project over multiple years to receive multiple grants is not allowed. Smaller stand-alone projects envisioned as part of a larger project may be submitted, but funding for one project does not guarantee money for the remaining improvements in the future.

The neighborhood may be responsible for the maintenance of upgrades the Town does not normally provide, such as any security-related improvements or its association liability insurance. If maintenance or insurance is required, the grant must be submitted by an association or other legal entity, which must also execute an agreement prior to construction.

## Project Guidelines

1. Only those goods and services approved by the Town will be paid for with Town funds.
  2. Projects must be completed within one year and comply with all Town codes and requirements.
  3. For projects greater than \$30,000, prior to the project being designed, the association must have its matching funds on deposit and provide written confirmation funds are available.

## Balancing short-term rentals and neighborhoods

**Lauderdale-By-The-Sea** loves our residents and our visitors!

Our goal is for everyone – from the folks who are here year round to those who come to enjoy our **Town** for a week – to enjoy all of what Lauderdale-By-The-Sea has to offer, including their neighborhood.

To make sure we succeed in obtaining the balance between residents and vacationers, the **Town Commission** passed an ordinance establishing regulations and a certification process of short term rentals in 2, 3, and 4-unit buildings. (We already have regulations regarding the short term rental of single-family and townhome units).

### What's a short term rental?

If you are in a 2, 3, or 4 unit building, you rent to guests more than three times a year for a month or less, and you advertise that you regularly rent to guests (but you're not a timeshare), then you have a short term rental.



### How does this effect me?

If you're an owner of a short term rental, it means you will need to apply for certification, which includes a property inspection, designating a rental agent, and providing information to your tenants on rules for the use of your property to ensure that the property is used properly and that your guests are good neighbors.

If you are a neighbor of a short term rental property, it means the **Town of Lauderdale-By-The-Sea** is helping make sure that everyone is able to enjoy their property and their neighborhood and that out-of-town visitors are aware that not everyone in their neighborhood may be on vacation.


### ALL ARE WELCOME TO ATTEND OPEN MIC IN JARVIS HALL JULY 12

"Expect very heavy traffic delays," Palmer said. "If you don't need to drive, please don't. Trust me, driving that night will not get you home any quicker."

The **Pelican Hopper** community shuttle will only operate until **5:25PM** that day.

BSO anticipates closing **Anglin's Square** to incoming vehicle traffic from about **8PM** until the heavy pedestrian traffic subsides, between **10 and 11PM**.

The Commercial bridge will also be closed to all boat traffic from about **8PM** to **11PM**. Motorists can expect heavy traffic all day, but especially between **9** and
