Commission trims budget; Town tax rate does not increase

- Lower Town taxes in FY2010-11 for most homeowners.

Despite a significant reduction this year in **Town** property tax revenues, the **Town Commission** did not raise the **Town's property tax rate** when it adopted the **FY 2010-11 Town budget** in late September.

The Commission unanimously adopted a tax rate of **\$3.9990 per thousand dollars of assessed property value**, which means **most Town residents will see a reduction** in their Town taxes.

The \$3.9990 tax rate is the same as last year's.

The Town was one of only a few cities in Broward that did not raise property taxes or cut any services.

LBTS hires Hoffmann as its Town Manager

The **Town Commission** in September hired former Fort Lauderdale City Manager **Connie Hoffmann** as the Town's new **Town Manager**.

The Commission approved an employment agreement with Hoffman at its Sept. 27th meeting.

All five Commissioners praised Hoffmann for the tremendous work she has done since taking over as Town Manager, especially since she had to immediately start working on the Town's FY2010-11 budget.

When she was hired as the City Manager in Fort Lauderdale in 1980, Hoffmann was the first woman and the youngest person hired to run a large U.S. city.

Prior to taking over as **Interim Town Manager** in May, Hoffmann was a senior vice president with **The Mercer Group**, a national executive search and management consulting firm.

Hoffmann was the City Manager in Fort Lauderdale for 10 years in the 1980s. □

Town studying sewer system issues

Like many small towns, **Lauderdale-By-The-Sea** does not own a sewer plant to treat the wastewater generated by residents and businesses. In fact, three different cities are involved in providing sewer service to our residents.

The **Town** owns the sewer lines in the south end of Lauderdale-By-The-Sea. It is essentially a collection system only. The **City of Pompano Beach** owns the sewer lines in the north end of Town and, for that reason, bills residents in the north directly.

The Town has a **Master Sewer Agreement** with Pompano Beach that covers the cost of transporting sewage to the plant and the cost of treating it.

The Town is addressing three main issues of concern with the sewer system.

- Sewer rates for the Town-owned system do not cover our costs.

- The sewer rate structure for customers in the south end of town is substantially different from the rate structure Pompano uses to bill sewer customers in the north end of the Town.

- The Town-owned sewer lines are more than 50 years old and no plan exists to reline or replace them when they reach the end of their useful life.

Pompano Beach bills the Town monthly under our agreement. The Town has not changed the sewer rates charged to customers of the Town's sewer system since 2004, despite the fact that Pompano has increased what they charge us multiple times since then.

As a result, sewer rates for our system do not cover our actual

expenditures. That situation will worsen as we expect Pompano to raise the rates charged to us again in January.

To address this problem, the Town is considering implementing a series of sewer rate hikes over several years. A study is underway to develop the rate increase proposals. We anticipate that the **Town Commission** will hold public hearings in **December** and **January** on adjusting the Town sewer rates for residents in the south part of Town. In addition to notices about the hearings on **Channel 78** and the Town's **Web site** (as well as in Town Hall), rate hike notices will also be mailed to residents and businesses.

Pompano recently implemented a very significant rate increase for sewer customers in the north part of our Town.

The rate structure used by Pompano is quite different from the rate structure used in the south. The Commission has indicated a desire to more closely align the two rate structures and we will start to move in that direction with the upcoming increase.

The third city involved in the sewer service equation is **Fort Lauderdale**. The Town contracts with them to handle the billing for sewer service in the south end of Town on our behalf.

The final issue – planning for the eventual relining or replacement of the oldest sewer lines – is another matter the Town will tackle this fiscal year. The Town will hire a consulting engineer in 2011 to advise us on the remaining useful life of the system, and to develop a plan, timetable and cost estimates for keeping our sewer infrastructure fully functional. □

Lauderdale-By-The-Sea was one of only a few municipalities in Broward County that did not raise their tax rate or cut any services provided to residents.

Because of declining tax revenues, the Town would have needed to raise the tax rate from \$3.9990 to \$4.3553 just to raise the same amount of tax revenue as last year.

The Commission directed **Town Manager Connie Hoffmann** and her staff to tighten the Town's financial belt so they could keep the millage rate at \$3.9990 mills.

Acting Finance Director Doug Haag said the Town was able to



make the \$3.9990 rate by making numerous budget adjustments, including:

- Reducing the general fund transfer to the **Capital Improvement Program** from \$1.6 million to \$1.1 million. The CIP has a healthy balance which can help fund needed projects for

several years.

- Eliminating the part-time Human Resources/Risk Manager position for a net savings of about \$38,000.

- Reducing Town Topics expenses, saving \$10,000.

- Contracting with a new Town auditor, saving \$15,000.

"It took a lot of tweaking and fine tuning," Haag said.

Adopting the Town's budget, an operating plan for how the Town will spend the taxes it collects from residents, is one of the most important decisions the Commission makes every year.

The adopted budget maintains **all** Town services and includes funds in the Capital Improvement Program for badly-needed drainage projects (see

the chart on this page).

Surprisingly, several residents and business owners asked the Commission at the second public hearing on the budget to increase the tax rate a bit to provide a cushion in case unexpected expenses should occur.

Mayor Roseann Minnet said she felt strongly about not increasing taxes for Town residents this year, especially since the Town will soon need to increase sewer rates (see *sewer rate story on Page 3*).

"Getting that increase on the

sewer side is going to be enough," Minnet said.

Vice Mayor Stuart Dodd and **Commissioners Birute Ann Clotney, Scot Sasser** and **Chris Vincent** were all advocates for keeping the Town's tax rate down.

While holding the line on the Town's property tax rate this year, Commissioners noted it might not be possible in **FY 2011-12**, since the Town's contract with the **Broward Sheriff's Office** is up for renewal and police expenses will likely increase. □

Town adopts new parking permit fees to recover revenue

With the start of the Town's new fiscal year on **Oct. 1**, there are some changes in fees and policy regarding **Town parking permits**.

Since designated beach permit spaces were often vacant, the beach parking permit has been eliminated. You can now use a residential parking permit to park in Town parking spaces at the beach and throughout the Town.



If you park downtown at Town meters for more than four hours a month, buying a permit will save you money!

The fee for the **Resident Permit** is \$53, which includes \$3 in the state sales tax (see chart at right for a list of all fees).

The rates were raised because the Town parking system was losing about \$70,000 in parking revenue per year and the need to charge fees to residents who use a particular service instead of covering the entire cost in the Town's budget.

A number of residents also told **Town Commissioners** they thought

the old rate was far too low for the value. The rates on **Bougainville Drive** and **Poinciana Street** downtown were also raised from .50 cents to **\$1 per hour**. Many beachgoers were parking there and taking

away spaces needed for the customers of nearby businesses. Note: If you are only parking there for a few short minutes, you can still throw a dime or a quarter into the parking meter. ☐


