Town Commission adopts annual budget

The **Town Commission** lowered the **FY2016-17 tax rate** from **\$3.7379** per thousand dollars of assessed property value to **\$3.6873** on **Sept. 26th** when it adopted the Town's annual budget, a financial blueprint for the coming year.

Your Town property taxes, which fund police, emergency medical and other key government services, accounts for about **20 percent** of your overall tax bill. **Broward County** and **Broward School District** account for most of your total property taxes.

Lauderdale-By-The-Sea's \$3.6873 property tax rate -- the third lowest among all municipalities in Broward -- means you will pay less property taxes to the Town than you would if you owned a house or condo with a similar taxable value in 28 other communities.

This year a typical single-family homeowner or condo owner with a Homestead exemption will pay approximately the same amount of ad valorem property taxes to the Town as last year.

The new tax rate will raise an additional \$400,000 in revenue, all of which will be earmarked for these capital improvements:

- The El Mar Greenway Project, which will make our signature beachfront road more pedestrian and bike friendly by adding a beautiful walkway, improved sidewalks and landscaping.
- Neighborhood sidewalks and street lighting. These upgrades were requested by several Town residents when the 2016-2021 Action Plan was adopted. "Without putting aside money each year, we would not be able to fund those future projects," **Town Manager Bud Bentley** said.

The budget will also pay for increased contract costs with the **Broward Sheriff's Office** and the **Volunteer Fire Department**. There is no change in police staffing levels for BSO. The hike in BSO's budget is mainly due to increased wages, pension and health insurance.


This year's budget reflects a continued commitment to upgrade the Town's infrastructure and aesthetic appearance, including the completion of the construction of **public bathrooms** on **El Mar Drive** (see photo on page 6) just south of **Anglin's Square**.

Sewer rates

The Town's sewer rates for residents in the south part of Town will increase by **2.5 percent** effective in October to fund necessary sewer system upgrades and additional treatment costs.

Fire fees

To cover future equipment costs, the Town's residential fire fee, the second lowest in the County, will increase this year from **\$123.50** to **\$129.85**.

FAU students look ahead to the future

Florida Atlantic University architecture students met with Town residents and staff to get input about the future redevelopment of our **Town Center**, including **Town Hall**, **Jarvis Hall**, the **Public Safety** complex and other Town buildings.

Town Hall was built in the mid-1950s. Jarvis Hall was built in 1965. The Public Safety complex was built in 1967 as a hotel. The Town purchased it in 2008.

At the Sept. 1 community meeting, five groups were formed and each discussed various aspects of the project. The ideas included building a multi-use facility with an educational component, as well as new headquarters for police, fire, EMS, Development Services and other departments. The importance of visually connecting the Town Center to **Commercial Boulevard** corridor and **El Mar Drive** was also discussed.

The students will take these ideas and develop proposed preliminary redevelopment plans which will later be presented to the public at a future Town Commission meeting.

The students are still eager to hear from the residents and encourage your participation.

A look back at our connection to Petoskey, Mich.

In some respects, the Town's history is family history.

There were many families who moved into Town after World War II. They included the **Behan's**, **Murphy's**, **Hoffman's** and **Brinkley's**. All four families hailed from **Petoskey, Mich.**, a coastal community of 6,500 residents, which is close to the size of the Town's current population of 6,000 people.

Matt Hoffman owned **Maus & Hoffman** on **Las Olas Boulevard** in Fort Lauderdale. His friend, **Gerry Brinkley**, a barber at the **Lauderdale Beach Hotel**, built the **Market**

Basket, one of the first buildings on **Commercial Boulevard**.

In 1947 Brinkley built another building on the northeast corner of Commercial and **El Mar Drive** (see photo below).

The Hoffman's and Brinkley's were among the first residents to move here from Petoskey, but they weren't the last. By 1952, a number of other residents from that small city would relocate here or just visit our warm South Florida community during the winter.

The Behan family still lives in Town today.

Resident Parking Permit Program

The Town of **Lauderdale-By-The Sea** has an annual **Resident Parking Permit** program that allows drivers to park in any metered or designated resident parking permit space for up to three hours.



is **\$47.70** for residents who are 65 or older, and **\$58.30** for residents under 65. The annual parking permit is good from **Oct. 1st** through **Sept. 30th**, the Town's fiscal year.

To be eligible for the parking permit, residents must own property in Town or rent annually from a Town property owner.

Permits can only be obtained at **Town Hall, 4501 N. Ocean Drive.**

When applying for a permit, you must bring your **Driver's License** and annual apartment or condo rental agreement.

If you own property, the Town will verify that by checking the **Broward Property Appraiser's Web site.**



Penny surtax will impact Lauderdale-By-The-Sea

All Broward County voters on **Nov. 8th** will get the opportunity to vote on a proposal to increase the local sales tax by one penny, from six cents to seven.

If approved, the penny sales surtax is expected to raise approximately **\$15 billion** over the next 30 years to help pay for County-wide transportation improvements and local infrastructure projects.



Under the proposal, **Lauderdale-By-The-Sea** would receive approximately **\$532,000** per year, or **\$16 million** over 30 years.

These funds could be used to pay for future capital

projects including, but not limited to, the following:

- Neighborhood sidewalks & swale improvements (\$2 million);
- Drainage projects (\$7 million);
- Residential street lighting and road resurfacing (\$2 million);
- El Mar Drive improvements (\$2 million);
- New police & fire rescue vehicles and equipment (\$12 million);
- A new Town Hall/Civic Center/Public Safety Complex (\$15 million);

Penny Sales Tax FAQs

How much will this sales tax increase cost me?

For every \$1 spent on a taxable item, you will pay 1 cent more in sales tax. For example, if you go to a restaurant and spend \$25, you will spend an additional 25 cents in sales tax. Groceries and medications are, of course, exempt from sales tax.

Who will pay this tax?

Anybody who purchases taxable items or services within Broward County will pay this surtax, including residents, tourists, visitors and businesses.

When would these taxes go into effect?

If adopted by the voters on **Nov. 8th**, these taxes would take effect on **Jan. 1, 2017**.

- New artificial reef projects & underwater park (\$560,000).

The sales surtax issue will be divided into two questions on the November ballot; a half-penny increase for County transportation improvements and a half-penny increase for local infrastructure projects.

Both ballot questions must be approved by the voters in order for the penny surtax increase to take effect.

The additional penny sales surtax is only applied to the **first \$5,000 of the sales amount** on the sale, use, lease, rental, or license to use any item of tangible personal property.

Town crime rate dropped 7.6 percent in 2015

The Town's annual crime rate dropped 7.6 percent in 2015, the fourth largest decline for all cities and towns in Broward County.

Broward Sheriff's Office Capt. Fred Wood said our crime rate compares favorably with other Broward cities, even though the crime rate is based on our permanent residential population of 6,000 residents.

Because of the huge influx of snowbirds and tourists during the winter months, the Town has one of the highest seasonal increases in population of any city in Broward (almost 100 percent), which is not reflected in the crime rate statistics compiled by the Florida Department of Law Enforcement.

"We have the third lowest crime rate of all cities in Broward County, utilizing our year round population of 6,000 residents, just behind Sea Ranch Lakes and Hillsboro Beach," he said.


FIRE & EMS RESPONSE TIMES

The Town's fire and emergency medical response times are far better than the national average.

American Medical Response's average response time per EMS call for the past year was 3 minutes and 41 seconds. The national average is more than 9 minutes.

The Volunteer Fire Department's average response time for the past year was 3 minutes and 24 seconds. For volunteer fire departments, the accepted maximum response time is 9 minutes.

Capt. Thomas Palmer, a Broward Sheriff's Office veteran with more than two decades of law enforcement experience, replaced retiring **Capt. Fred Wood** on Oct. 1 as the district chief in **Lauderdale-By-The-Sea**.

Palmer has been the district's executive officer for the past three years under Wood, serving as the acting chief whenever Wood was out of town or on vacation.

Town Manager Bud Bentley selected Palmer to replace Wood after interviewing Palmer and two other BSO officers who applied.

Lt. William Wesolowski, who was assigned to BSO's Department of Internal Affairs and Public Corruption, will replace Palmer as executive officer.

As second in command under Wood, Palmer's duties included the budget, overall operational command of the district, personnel issues, purchasing, special events and working with Town staff. With 13 years of progressive law enforcement management experience, Palmer holds bachelors and masters degrees in Criminal Justice from **Florida Atlantic University**.


