



Fabulous Fourth of July festivities planned

Get ready for another fabulous **Fourth of July** celebration in **Town!**

Presented by the **Town of Lauderdale-By-The-Sea** with help from the **Volunteer Fire Department**, the day starts with the annual **Town parade** at **10AM** and concludes with a great fireworks show, which will be shot off the beach just north of **El Prado Park** at **9PM**.

There will be food and **Family Fun Day** activities in El Prado from **11AM to 3PM**, including a waterslide, a clown, face painting and VFD fire hose demonstrations.

Commissioner Buz Oldaker, chairman of the **July 4th Committee** for the third consecutive year, wants residents to enjoy themselves on this great national holiday.

"The Town invites everyone to come out and celebrate the Fourth of July," Oldaker said. "We have a great community parade and a fantastic fireworks show."

Shortened Parade Route

The parade starts at the **Fire Station** on **Bougainville Drive**, heads north to **Pine Avenue**, east to **El Mar Drive** and then south to **Hibiscus Avenue**, where it will end (see map).

Parade Grand Marshal

This year's parade **Grand Marshal** is **Col. Bill Johansen**, head of the Town's **Citizen Observer Patrol**.

"Bill Johansen is a great choice for Grand Marshal," Oldaker said. "He has given so much to this town as a volunteer, he deserves to be honored and recognized."

Leave Your Car At Home

Broward Sheriff's Office Capt. Thomas Palmer strongly encourages residents not to drive to the beach to watch the fireworks. He said traffic on North Ocean Drive will be jammed for at least one hour after the fireworks end.

"Expect extremely heavy traffic delays," Palmer warned. "If you don't need to drive, don't. Trust me,


BUDGET HEARINGS

Town’s new Butterflies-By-The-Sea program takes flight

The **Town** and the **Lauderdale-By-The-Sea Garden Club** are working in conjunction with **NatureScape Broward** to encourage home, condo and business owners to create beautiful butterfly gardens throughout our community.

“We’d like everyone who wants to help protect the future of butterflies and other pollinators to create a butterfly garden,” said **Allison Zack**, a garden club member who is spearheading the new **Butterflies-By-The-Sea** program along with club members **Gail Matonik** and **Chris Villata**.

The Town recently joined the **National Wildlife Federation**, which encourages cities across the country to help homeowners create small gardens and habitats for butterflies, birds and other natural wildlife.

Adverse Impact

Because of the adverse impact of development, especially in dense urban areas such as Broward, there are fewer and fewer places for native plants, trees, butterflies, birds and other natural wildlife to thrive.

The butterfly program’s goal is to create at least 150 new butterfly habitats in the community. Once a home or condo butterfly garden is completed, it can be registered online with the National Wildlife Federation; the registration fee is \$20. Once enough Town gardens are registered, Lauderdale-By-The-Sea can become a certified butterfly wildlife sanctuary.

Broward was recognized nationally as the first county in the United States to be certified as a **Community Wildlife Habitat** by the National Wildlife Federation. This recognition underscores Broward’s commitment to the environment and its efforts to protect our natural resources.

Environmental Awareness Day

The Town and Garden Club in conjunction with NatureScape Broward will host an Environmental Awareness Day on **Thursday, Nov. 15th** in **Jarvis Hall** that will feature speakers on butterfly gardens, sea oats, sea turtles, manatees and staghorn coral.

Create A Butterfly Garden



There are five basic elements to creating a NatureScape butterfly garden at your home, condominium, townhouse or business.

FOOD

Plant native species that produce flowers for pollinators and seeds & berries for birds, such as Milkweed, Lantana and Maypops.

WATER

Include a bird bath or butterfly puddling station.

COVER

Provide shelter with dense shrubs, such as Proven Winners or American Meadows.

PLACES TO RAISE YOUNG

Plant host plants for butterflies.

SUSTAINABLE PRACTICES

Don’t use chemicals that pollute our water supply. Natural gardens are much better for wildlife & you.

Take The Plunge

BugFest-By-The-Sea (July 24-29, 2018), the Town's annual dive festival centered around Florida's annual **two-day lobster mini-season**, is just around the reef.

Supported again this year by **Reef Safe Sun**, this year's event features a free concert in **Anglin's Square** on **Saturday, July 28th** to benefit **Diveheart**, a non-profit group that teaches people with disabilities how to scuba dive. Learning to dive is often a life-changing experience for people with disabilities.



"We've discovered the forgiving, weightless wonder of the water column provides the perfect gravity-free environment for those who might otherwise struggle on land," said Diveheart founder **Jim Elliot**. "Underwater, we're all equal."

The free concert Saturday will start at **6:30PM** on **El Mar Drive** between **Village Grille** and **101 Ocean**, the same venue as the popular music events held on Friday night. The headliner band is **Weedline**. Also performing will be **The Fish Circuit**, **Patrick Arnold** and **Paolo Coelho**, a singer and songwriter from New York City.

This year's **BugFest Mini-Season Kickoff Party** will be at **Plunge Beach Hotel** in its **Back Flip Bar** on the beach from **7 to 9PM** on **Tuesday, July 24**. The party includes music by the **Scuba Cowboy**.

BugFest divers can win \$20,000 in cash and dive gear prizes by taking part in the **Great Florida Bug Hunt** contest or buying a Diveheart raffle ticket to support the fundraiser.

The big raffle prizes this year include a 7-night stay at the **Windjammer Resort and Beach Club**, a 2-night stay at the



Lauderdale-By-The-Sea song comes to life after 62 years

Town resident **Adelle Barsky-Moore** recently became part of Town history when she sang the Town's official song, *Lauderdale-By-The-Sea*.

Adelle's father, **Allan Barsky**, replied to a request in the last issue of *Town Topics* seeking someone who could sing a tune written about the Town in the 1950s. He knew who to ask: his daughter!

Adelle sang the song at the **Community Center's Poetry-In-Motion** event in **Jarvis Hall** this past April. The song was written by well-known composer **Joe E. Howard** (see photo), who played it for the very first time at the **Lauderdale-By-The-Sea Woman's Club Christmas Party** in December 1956. Adelle accepted our request to sing the song again at **Christmas-By-The-Sea** in December!

driving that night will not get you home any sooner."

The **Pelican Hopper** shuttle will only operate until 5:25PM on July 4th.

BSO anticipates closing **Anglin's Square** to vehicular traffic from about **8PM** until the heavy pedestrian traffic subsides, between **10** and **11PM**.

The Commercial bridge will also be closed to all boats from about **8PM** to **11PM**. Motorists can expect heavy traffic all day, but especially from **9** to **11PM**.

To clear out traffic, BSO may set-up alternate routes, including directing all west-bound traffic on Commercial to Fort Lauderdale.

Johansen named Parade Grand Marshal

Citizen Observer Patrol Col. Bill Johansen won't be helping out with traffic at this year's **Fourth of July** event.



He'll actually be contributing to the traffic congestion as this year's **Fourth of July Parade Grand Marshal!**

A Town resident since 2001, Johansen has volunteered more than 5,500 hours as head of COP, the Town's Citizen Observer Patrol, a community law enforcement program run by the **Broward Sheriff's Office**. He joined the COP in 2004 and was promoted to colonel the

following year.

"We could not think of a more deserving resident to lead the parade," said **Lt. William Wesolowski**, the executive officer with BSO in Lauderdale-By-The-Sea. "Bill's leadership has made the Lauderdale-By-The-Sea COP program one of the most successful in the county, and he is counted on as a valuable asset to the district."

Johansen was also a volunteer with BSO's **Posse Unit** and county-wide parking enforcement program, where he issued an estimated \$500,000 in tickets, mainly for disabled parking and fire lane violations while also working another 5,000 volunteer hours.

He recently stepped away from those positions to devote

more time to the COP, which conducts street, bike and beach patrols for BSO along with other routine police duties.

The Town's 30-member COP program, one of the largest in Broward, contributes more than 2,000 volunteer hours to the Town every year.

Johansen, a **U.S. Marine** and **Vietnam Veteran** who has three adult sons along with his wife, **Marilyn**, plans to ride in this year's grand marshal car with his three grandchildren, ages 9, 10 and 11.

"I'm overwhelmed," he said about being selected as grand marshal. "I'm so honored. It's a sincere pleasure to work for the Town and for the deputies for whom I have so much respect!"

Construction projects will increase parking spaces

The Town will start a construction project that will add parking spaces in the N. Ocean Drive (A1A) lot just north of **Commercial Boulevard** and also along the east and west sides of **Friedt Family Park**.

Phase I of the project is the expansion and renovation of the A1A parking lot, which includes the site of the former **Majestica Apartments** building at 4410 Bougainvillea Drive. The number of spaces in the lot will increase from 101 to 132. Construction will begin this summer. In the future, the Town may also install charging stations for electric cars.

Phase II will add nine additional spaces to the **Anglin Courtyard** at Friedt Family Park just west of **Town Hall**. Construction on this phase is slated to begin in 2019. The project will reconfigure the parking spaces along **Poinciana Street** and **Bougainvillea Drive** and will include five additional parking spaces, bringing the total to 37.

Town Parking rates to increase for the first time in three years

The **Town's** parking permit fees and meter rates will increase on **Oct. 1, 2018**, the start of the Town's new fiscal year. The last parking meter increase in the Town was back in 2015.

The majority of the metered spaces will increase by \$0.25.

Don't forget to renew your annual Town parking permits.

The last day to use existing employee, resident, hardship and overnight parking permits is **Sept. 30, 2018**.

How to avoid parking citations and relax while you are here

Here are some tips for avoiding a parking citation:


- Pay for parking with the **Pay-by-Phone App**. The App will let you extend the time on your phone unless you've reached the maximum time limit.

- Vacate the parking space when your time has expired.

- Park your vehicle completely within the lines of the marked space.

- Comply with state and local laws when parking in a handicapped parking space.

- Please remember that **Neighborhood Electric Vehicle (NEV)** spaces are only designated for electric carts, motorcycles or scooters; not compact cars.
