BEE THERE ON DEC. 1ST

The Town will hold a dedication ceremony on Sunday, Dec. 1 at 9:30AM for its urban apiary (bee condo).



The apiary, which is under construction, is located on the east side of the

municipal services building, which is adjacent to Town Hall. Micro apiaries on public land are a growing trend as cities try to help struggling bee populations. Bees pollinate flowers, crops and also make honey.

Town Commission lowers tax rate

The **Town Commission** lowered the current tax rate of **\$3.5989** per thousand dollars to **\$3.5000** of assessed property value on Sept. 26th when it adopted the Town's annual budget, a financial blueprint for the coming year.



Your Town property taxes, which fund key police, emergency medical and other vital local government services, accounts for about 20 percent of your ad valorem tax assessment.

Lauderdale-By-The-Sea's **\$3.5000** property tax rate is now the **second lowest in Broward County**, which means you pay less ad valorem taxes to the Town than you would if your property was located in most other Broward cities.

Because property values rise annually, the \$3.5000 tax rate represents a slight **1.68 percent** increase over the rollback rate, which is the rate the Town would have needed to adopt to raise the same amount of revenue as last year.

The Town sent out several notices to residents who had signed up when **Hurricane Dorian** threatened South Florida in August. You can also sign-up on the Town website for **CodeRED**, the Town's emergency notification system. The Town also posts information on **Nextdoor**, an online networking service for neighborhoods.

"We have a great mix of comedies we think people will really enjoy," Aulbach said. "The cast has been working hard and we expect full houses for all six performances."

- Affects your voice in **Congress** and in your state and local government. The results of the next Census determine how many seats Florida is allocated in Congress.

- Determines how more than \$675 billion are spent supporting vital state, county and community programs.

- Is used to redraw the boundaries of congressional

and state legislative districts.

Don't miss out on your opportunity to ensure our Town and county receives its fair share of funding.

Local governments like the Town also use the census for public safety and emergency preparedness.

The Town will soon initiate a complete count committee to facilitate as much public participation in the census as possible. Meeting dates will be published on the Town's website and all members of the public are welcome to attend! **Broward County** has also launched a massive campaign to ensure all its residents are counted. 

The church is asking people to pray for the hurricane survivors and to share the details about their efforts with friends and family. With sustained winds of 185 mph, Hurricane Dorian was the most powerful storm to strike the Bahamas and the worst natural disaster in the country's history. The death toll may exceed 1,000; 1,300 people are still missing.

Annual Parking Permit Information

The **Town's Resident Parking Permit Program** allows drivers to park in any metered or designated resident parking permit space for up to three hours.

The cost is **\$53.50** for residents 65 or older, and **\$64.20** for residents under the age of 65.

The annual parking permit is good from **Oct. 1** through **Sept. 30**. To be eligible for the parking permit, residents must live in Town or be an annual renter.

Permits are only available at **Town Hall, 4501 N. Ocean Drive**. When applying, please bring your Drivers License and a valid vehicle registration. If you rent, please also bring your apartment, home or condo rental agreement.

If you own property, the Town will verify that with the **Broward Property Appraiser's** website. If you have any questions about the parking permit program, please call **Town Hall** at **954-640-4200**.
