TOWN COMMISSION ADOPTS FY 2023 BUDGET AND MILLAGE RATE

At the Final Budget Hearing on October 6, 2022, the Town Commission voted to adopt the final budget and millage rate for FY 2023. The budget includes funding for public safety services, capital improvement projects, and general government initiatives, as well as new cultural and recreational programs.

The final budget for the upcoming year is \$26,957,918, which is \$2.45 million less than the FY 2022 budget. The Town's millage rate will remain at 3.3923 mills for every \$1,000 of assessed property value.

What is included in this year's budget?

- Contract increases of over \$300,000 for public safety services, code compliance, and our legal counsel
- The purchase of the South Ocean parking lot
- An additional staff member in the Public Works Department to meet the community's needs
- Costs for construction, fleet maintenance, and utilities work
- Increased funding for the Community Center to enhance its offerings to residents
- Two new special events- Kids By The Sea and an outdoor movie night
- Funds to begin planning the Town's 75th Anniversary celebration
- Merit-based salary increases for employees in accordance with personnel rules

The Town Commission is proud to adopt this budget, maintain the millage rate for residents, and move forward with important new projects and initiatives in Town.



ENJOY A DAY ON THE COURTS IN LBTS

Have questions about the Town's tennis courts? We can help! Review these FAQs and then head out for a day on the courts.

Where are the Town's tennis courts located?

The tennis courts are located at Friedt Family Park on Bougainvillea Drive behind Town Hall.

Who can use the courts?

The courts are available for those who:

1. Own property in the Town
2. Lease residential property within the Town
3. Own/operate hotels and motels within the Town for use by guests

Do I need a special key?

Yes! Under Town Ordinances 2009-15 and 2020-10, the tennis courts may only be accessed through the entrance gate and with a key issued by the Town for that purpose. Proof of Town residency is required.

How much does a tennis court key cost?

The annual fee is \$120, and the fee is prorated throughout the year. Keys can be purchased at Town Hall from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday.



CODE COMPLIANCE FAQs

Our neighborhoods are just part of what makes our coastal community so charming. Whether you're renovating your house or walking your dog, make sure to abide by our Town Code to avoid a code compliance violation.

How can I avoid a code violation?

Ensuring your house complies with the Town's Code is simple. In general, your yard should be kept free of trash and debris including bulk trash, items that are typically stored indoors (like refrigerators), and building materials.

We recommend checking the outside of your house periodically to make sure your house is weather-tight, rodent-proof, and in sound condition, otherwise, you may receive a violation. Prior to renovating the interior or exterior of your house, don't forget to submit a work permit to our Building Department for approval.

What are some ways I can avoid a violation around town?

As you enjoy exploring our town, please remember to throw away any trash, clean up after your pup, and refrain from posting signs in medians, on street polls, and in the public right-of-way.



Learn the Sounds of Fire Safety™



Is there a beep or a chirp coming out of your smoke or carbon monoxide alarm? What does it all mean? Knowing the difference can save you, your home, and your family! Make sure everyone in the home understands the sounds of the smoke and carbon monoxide alarms and knows how to respond. Learn the sounds of your smoke and carbon monoxide alarms by checking the user guide or search the brand and model online.

What is your alarm telling you?

SMOKE ALARMS

- A continued set of three loud beeps—beep, beep, beep—means smoke or fire. Get out, call **9-1-1**, and stay out.
- A single “chirp” every 30 or 60 seconds means the battery is low and must be changed.
- All smoke alarms must be replaced after 10 years.
- Chirping that continues after the battery has been replaced means the alarm is at the end of its life and the unit must be replaced.

CARBON MONOXIDE (CO) ALARMS

- A continuous set of four loud beeps—beep, beep, beep, beep—means carbon monoxide is present in your home. Go outside, call **9-1-1** and stay out.
- A single chirp every 30 or 60 seconds means the battery is low and must be replaced.
- CO alarms also have “end of life” sounds that vary by manufacturer. This means it’s time to get a new CO alarm.
- Chirping that continues after the battery has been replaced means the alarm is at the end of its life and the unit must be replaced.

Make sure your smoke and CO alarms meet the needs of everyone in your home, including those with sensory or physical disabilities.

Some tips:

- ✓ Install a bedside alert device that responds to the sound of the smoke and CO alarms. Use of a low frequency alarm can also wake a sleeping person with mild to severe hearing loss.
- ✓ Sleep with your mobility device, glasses, and phone close to your bed.
- ✓ Keep pathways like hallways lit with night lights and free from clutter to make sure everyone can get out safely.

Get out and stay out! Call 9-1-1 from outside.



Hear a Chirp, Make a Change!

A chirping alarm needs attention. Replace the batteries or the entire unit if it's over 10 years old. If you don't remember how old the unit is, replace it!

REGISTRATION FOR RESIDENTIAL PARKING PERMITS

The Town's Resident Parking Permit Program allows drivers to park in any metered or designated resident parking permit space for up to three hours.

How much does a permit cost?

The cost is \$64.20 for residents under 65, and \$53.50 for residents over the age of 65.

How long is the parking permit valid?

The annual parking permit is valid from October 1, 2022, to September 30, 2023.

Who is eligible to apply for a permit?

Residents who live in Town or are annual renters.

What forms do I need to apply for a permit?

You will need copies of your driver's license and a valid vehicle registration. If you are a renter, you also need to bring your annual apartment, home, or condo rental agreement. If you own the property, the Town will verify your residence online at the Broward County Property Appraiser's website.

HOW TO APPLY:

There are three ways to submit your Resident Parking Permit application. First, make copies of your driver's license and vehicle registration (renters will also need to show proof of a rental agreement). Next, fill out the application on the Town's website or by completing the form on the next page. To submit your application:

1. E-mail a completed form and documents to kareng@lbts-fl.gov.
2. Bring the form and documents to Town Hall between 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday
3. Mail the documents listed above to Town Hall, 4501 N. Ocean Drive, Lauderdale-By-The-Sea, FL 33308. Don't forget to include your signature on the application form. Please note "Attention Karen Gates" on the envelope, and include your phone number in case we need to contact you.

Permits will be mailed to you. Arrangements can also be made for pick-up at Town Hall. You can either pay by check or credit card.

BULK TRASH DO'S AND DON'TS

How well do you know what items can be included in bulk trash pick-up? Know the do's and don'ts of bulk trash pick-up service before taking your items to the curb.


Good to go for bulk pick-up:

Cabinets, furniture, refrigerators, ranges, water heaters, and yard waste less than 6 feet in length.

Not included in bulk pick-up:

Electronic devices, automobile parts, biological waste, used oil, boat parts and trailers, construction debris, hazardous waste, tires, wet paint, and panes of glass.

Please place bulk trash items on the swale, away from the storm catch basins. Put out bulk trash items after 6 p.m. the day before pick-up and before 7 a.m. the day of pick-up.



IT'S TIME TO RENEW YOUR BUSINESS TAX RECEIPT

Lauderdale-By-The-Sea businesses- if you haven't done so already, it's time to renew your Business Tax Receipt (BTR). Please note that your 2021-2022 BTR expired on September 30, 2022.

The Town offers three different methods for submitting payment. You can pay online, through the mail, or by dropping off your payment in our drop box. For your convenience, the drop box is located in the lobby of the Building Department.



BUSINESS TAX RECEIPT QUESTIONS

If you are a new business here in LBTS, welcome to our Town. In order to be a legally permitted business, you must first obtain a business tax receipt! Below you will find some common questions with answers concerning business tax receipts.

Q. How do I start the process for obtaining a business tax receipt?

A. Your very first step is to obtain zoning eligibility. This is done through emailing our zoning team at zoning@lbts-fl.gov, with the address and the intended use for the property. Once this has been established, our team will provide you with the correct application and instructions on how to submit the application.

Q. If I want to rent my property on Airbnb or VRBO, do I need a business tax receipt?

A. Absolutely! All rentals, even long-term rentals, require a business tax receipt license. Some properties are eligible for short-term licenses and others are eligible for vacation-rental licenses. Email our zoning team at zoning@lbts-fl.gov with the address to determine your eligibility before you list your property on any short-term rental or vacation rental site. If approved, you will need to obtain the appropriate certificate and completed inspections before you can begin short-term rentals or vacation rentals.

Q. Does the Town have an organization that connects LBTS businesses?
