EXPANDED OUTDOOR DINING AND WALKWAYS ARE COMING TO DOWNTOWN LBTS

We're excited to bring improvements, like expanded outdoor seating and walkways, lighting, and landscaping to our downtown area as part of the Downtown Enhancement Project. Work is expected to be completed in November 2023, right in time to celebrate Christmas By The Sea on December 6, 2023.

We've put together some answers to your most frequently asked questions about the project.

1. What is the project going to accomplish?

We're improving the walkability and outdoor dining options in our downtown area. When completed, the downtown area will have permanently expanded outdoor restaurant seating, wider sidewalks, new signage, lighting, and landscaping.





PUBLIC ACCESS


TOWN COMMISSION ADOPTS FISCAL YEAR (FY) 2024 BUDGET AND MILLAGE RATE

At the Final Budget Hearing on September 26, 2023, the Town Commission voted to adopt the final budget and millage rate for FY 2024. The budget includes funding for public safety services, capital improvement projects, and planning for the Town's 75th Anniversary celebration. The final budget for FY 2024 is \$ 28,593,754 and the millage rate is set at 3.9235 mills for every \$1,000 of assessed property value. The Town is fiscally conservative and carries no debt. At 3.9235, the Town's millage rate is 38% lower than Broward County's municipal average. With the 4th lowest millage rate in Broward County, the Town Commission proudly adopted the annual budget that will facilitate several new projects and important initiatives here in Town such as:

- 75th Anniversary events
- Regular special events and the return of Friday Night Music once a month, January-May
- Completion of the canal dredging capital improvement project
- Replacing and raising the Bel-Air seawall
- Completion of the Downtown Enhancement Project
- Renovation of the Friedt Family Park children's playground
- Funding for traffic calming studies and projects

King Tides are exceptionally high tides that occur during a new or full moon. During King Tides, we may see localized flooding.

VETERANS DAY: HONORING THOSE WHO HAVE SERVED OUR COUNTRY

Please join us for our annual Veterans Day celebration to honor our local and neighboring veterans who bravely served our country.

Did you know that the major hostilities of World War I formally ended in the 11th hour on the 11th day of the 11th month in 1918? On the first anniversary, November 11, 1919, President Woodrow Wilson addressed the nation and recognized the heroism of those who bravely served. Then, in 1938 under President Calvin Coolidge,

November 11 became a legal holiday. It wasn't until 1945, when Raymond Weeks, a World War II veteran, successfully expanded Armistice Day to recognize all veterans who so valiantly served. With several influential people supporting this transition, President Dwight D. Eisenhower ultimately signed the bill into law in May of that year, declaring Armistice Day to be a day in honor of all veterans. About a month later, on June 1, 1954, the word "Veterans" replaced "Armistice" as the holiday's official title.

EXPANDED OUTDOOR DINING AND WALKWAYS ARE COMING TO DOWNTOWN LBTS

2. Why did the Town decide to complete these updates?

To accommodate outdoor dining during COVID-19, the Town allowed restaurants to use the downtown parking spots for additional outdoor dining. Temporary barricades were put in place to designate this area for dining instead of parking. After COVID-19 restrictions were lifted, the businesses asked the Town Commission to consider making the temporary change permanent. Several public input meetings with residents and business owners were held, and a final design for the new downtown area was approved.

At the same time, the Town is moving forward with the placement of removable bollards in the downtown area. These bollards will be placed in lieu of the water barricades typically used during events, and can be removed quickly if needed, to allow access for emergency vehicles. The work will be completed at the same time as the Downtown Enhancement Project to reduce costs and the amount of time Commercial Boulevard would need to be closed.

3. What work has been completed?

The infrastructure work including irrigation, drainage, curb installation, electrical upgrades, and foundation work has been completed. New pavers have also been installed. The final stage of the project will include adding new signage and landscaping.

4. How much more outdoor dining space will there be once the project is complete?

Over 5,400 additional square feet will be available for sidewalk café area dining.

5. Will the project be completed on time?

Yes! The project is on track to be completed in November 2023.

6. Why is the project happening now?

The Town chose to wait until after the 4th of July so that the downtown area was in good condition during this busy, family friendly downtown event.

7. Are businesses open while work is going on?

Yes! All our businesses are open for the duration of the project, so please shop and dine locally.

8. How is the project being funded?

The Town is funding this project through the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) grant.

9. Who chose the pavers?

The consultant selected pavers that were ultimately approved by the commission with the overall design. The community was invited to select the color of the lighting and the architectural wall.

10. How often will the new pavers be cleaned?

Once the work is finished, the Town has contracted to clean the pavers in the downtown area twice a week in the off-season, and three times a week in season.

11. What landscaping is being added?

As part of this project, the Town is enlarging the landscaped areas downtown to add green space and further delineate pedestrian walkways from outdoor restaurant seating. The enhanced vegetation will provide a more intimate area for diners.

Additionally, the Town replaced eight palm trees in the Dunes Plaza with coconut palms, whose roots are better suited for the small area. We have several colorful Adirondack chairs and umbrellas in the plaza that provide shade for those strolling by or heading to the beach, shops, and restaurants.

12. How will this project affect parking?

The parallel parking spaces on Commercial Boulevard east of A1A will be converted to the expanded outdoor dining and pedestrian walkway areas. The Town is also reconfiguring some of the spaces on El Mar Drive to provide ADA compliant parking spaces.

However, one of the best parts of our town is the walkability. Once you get here, there's no car needed. The Town operates several public parking lots, and a free Circuit shuttle service to take you anywhere you want to go in Town or Galt Ocean Mile.

RESIDENT PARKING PERMITS AVAILABLE

Annual parking permits are available for all residents who live in Town or who are annual renters. Permits cost \$64.20 for residents under 65 years old and \$53.50 for residents ages 65 years old and older. Permits are valid from October 1, 2023, through September 30, 2024.

HOW TO APPLY:

There are three ways to submit your Resident Parking Permit application. First, make copies of your driver's license and vehicle registration (renters will also need to show proof of a rental agreement). Next, fill out the application on the Town's website or by completing the form on the next page.

To submit your application:

1. E-mail a completed form and documents to kareng@lbts-fl.gov.
2. Bring the form and documents to Town Hall between 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday or mail the documents listed above to Town Hall, 4501 N. Ocean Drive, Lauderdale-By-The-Sea, FL 33308.

Don't forget to include your signature on the application form. Please note "Attention Karen Gates" on the envelope and include your phone number in case we need to contact you.
