### How Community Feedback Can Enhance Our Cities

Public safety is the first and foremost concern of every elected official. After that, my priorities all align with fulfilling the needs of our residents, businesses, visitors, and stakeholders. While COVID-19 restrictions were difficult to adhere to at times, they also created unforeseen opportunities, like our recently completed Downtown Enhancement Project in the Town of Lauderdale-By-The-Sea. This project is the direct result of listening to our residents and business owners and taking community feedback seriously.

When COVID-19 restrictions were put in place, we still needed to support our local restaurants and businesses. Known for our small-town charm, we allowed our downtown restaurants and businesses to expand their outdoor seating with temporary sidewalk cafés. What we did not foresee was just how popular the temporarily expanded outdoor dining areas would become.

Once COVID-19 restrictions were lifted, the Town Commission received many positive comments about the expanded outdoor dining from our business community and residents. We knew we had to find a way to make these changes permanent.

We also knew community feedback was going to be essential to the future success of whatever permanent upgrades the Commission decided to implement. Over the course of a few months, we held several public outreach meetings so



business owners and residents could share their thoughts on potential changes to our downtown. In addition to hosting public meetings, we launched an online survey to gather feedback on certain design elements, shared information during our Town Commission meetings and kept our community updated through the Town's social media channels and weekly emails. Over time, word spread, and we collected a healthy amount of feedback.

We learned that expanded outdoor seating, widened sidewalks for greater walkability, new landscaping, and additional lighting were the most important elements to our stakeholders. While including these elements meant removing parking spaces, the Town Commission unanimously approved the plan because it fulfilled the needs of our community.

I'm blown away by the result. We added 5,400 additional square feet of sidewalk café area dining, new landscaping, and new lighting elements that have truly enhanced our downtown area while maintaining our small-town feel. The project cost about \$3.1 million, funded through the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) grant.

Community feedback was essential to the success of this project. Beyond the design-planning phase, Town staff


also met with business owners before breaking ground to determine the best time of year to complete the work. Once work began, weekly meetings were held with the contracting firm, business owners, and Town staff to discuss questions or concerns that arose.

We also received positive responses on our social media pages and grew a community of informed advocates who personally shared updates with their friends and neighbors. Some of the posts shared by residents on the community pages received hundreds of positive comments, likes, and shares.

My advice to other community leaders is if temporary solutions are working in your city or town, explore them further. Listen to your residents and businesses and be open to implementing permanent changes that will benefit them long term. We expanded outdoor seating during the pandemic because we needed to support our local businesses, and it ended up being a change our community embraced and didn't want to say goodbye to. Today, our residents, business owners, and visitors are all enjoying a beautifully enhanced downtown that promotes greater walkability, connectivity, and economic development for our businesses.



## HUMAN RESOURCES CORNER

2024 IRS Retirement Plan Limits Announced Employees will be able to contribute more money to their 401(k)s next year. Our Human Resources team put together some helpful information for you as you begin financial planning in 2024.

- This year, employees can contribute up to \$23,000 to their 401(k), 403(b), most 457 plans, or the Thrift Savings Plan for federal employees. That's a \$500 jump from the 2023 limits.
- The catch-up contribution limit for employees (ages 50 and older) who participate in 401(k), 403(b), most 457 plans, and the federal government's Thrift Savings Plan will remain at \$7,500, the same amount in 2023.
- Social Security benefits will rise by 3.2 percent this year.
- The annual cost-of-living adjustment (COLA) announced for 2024 is far lower than 2023's big 8.7 percent jump or the 5.9 percent boost in 2022, a reflection of moderating inflation.
- On average, Social Security retirement benefits rose by approximately \$50 per month in January 2024. The average monthly retirement benefit for workers will be \$1,907, up from \$1,848 in 2023.
- Although most beneficiaries, roughly 66 million people, saw increase in January, approximately 7.5 million Supplemental Security Income (SSI) beneficiaries received an increase in their December 2023 checks. Some people receive both Social Security and SSI benefits.
- The Social Security Administration also announced the 2024 wage cap. The maximum amount of earnings subject to the Social Security tax (taxable maximum) will increase to \$168,600. That's up about 5 percent from the \$160,200 maximum in 2023.

# YOU MIGHT NEED A PERMIT FOR THAT!

There's this project you've been thinking about- a Tiki hut would look great in your backyard by the pool, or maybe it's time to replace that old fence or update your landscaping. You find the design you like, you talk to your contractor, and you're all ready to go. But then you wonder, "Do I need a permit from the Town?"




The simple answer is, always check with our Development Services Department at Town Hall before completing work on your home.

**Don't assume your project won't need a building permit.**

For example:

- Removing, installing, or replacing landscaping elements (particularly trees) requires a Town permit to make sure the property remains in compliance with Town requirements and usually requires a review and/or tree removal license from Broward County.
- Removing and replacing a fence, or a portion of a fence, requires a permit.

Remember, we are here to help you navigate any required permitting process and avoid project delays. And you can now submit your permit application online. Simply go to the Town's website ([www.lbts-fl.gov](http://www.lbts-fl.gov)) and click on the pink Adirondack chair to access the Building Division webpage. There you will find step-by-step instructions on how to complete the electronic permit application submittal. However, you can still call Development Services at (954) 640-4215 or stop by Town Hall.
